- 1 AN ACT Relating to the information services board; amending RCW
- 2 43.105.032 and 42.17.2401; and reenacting and amending RCW 43.105.041.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.105.032 and 1996 c 137 s 10 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 There is hereby created the Washington state information services
- 7 board. The board shall be composed of ((thirteen)) fifteen members.
- 8 Eight members shall be appointed by the governor, one of whom shall be
- 9 a representative of higher education, one of whom shall be a
- 10 representative of an agency under a state-wide elected official other
- 11 than the governor, and ((two)) at least four of whom shall be
- 12 representatives of the private sector. One member shall represent the
- 13 judicial branch and be appointed by the chief justice of the supreme
- 14 court. One member shall be the superintendent of public instruction or
- 15 shall be appointed by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 16 ((One)) <u>Two</u> members, one from each caucus, shall represent the house of
- 17 representatives and shall be selected by the speaker of the house of
- 18 representatives; ((one)) two members, one from each caucus, shall
- 19 represent the senate and shall be appointed by the president of the

- ((The representatives of the house of representatives and 1
- senate shall not be from the same political party.)) One member shall 2
- be the director who shall be a voting member of the board. 3
- 4 members shall constitute the membership of the board with full voting
- 5 Members of the board shall serve at the pleasure of the
- appointing authority. The board shall select a chairperson from among 6
- its members. 7
- 8 Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner that the original
- 9 appointments were made.
- 10 A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum
- for the transaction of business. 11
- Members of the board shall be compensated for service on the board 12
- 13 in accordance with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel
- expenses as provided in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060. 14
- 15 Sec. 2. RCW 43.105.041 and 1996 c 171 s 8 and 1996 c 137 s 12 are
- each reenacted and amended to read as follows: 16
- 17 (1) The board shall have the following powers and duties related to
- 18 information services:
- 19 (a) To develop standards governing the acquisition and disposition
- equipment, proprietary software and purchased services, 20
- confidentiality of computerized data; 21
- 22 (b) To purchase, lease, rent, or otherwise acquire, dispose of, and
- 23 maintain equipment, proprietary software, and purchased services, or to
- 24 delegate to other agencies and institutions of state government, under
- 25 appropriate standards, the authority to purchase, lease, rent, or
- otherwise acquire, dispose of, and maintain equipment, proprietary 26
- software, and purchased services: PROVIDED, That, agencies and 27
- institutions of state government are expressly prohibited from
- 28
- 29 acquiring or disposing of equipment, proprietary software, and
- purchased services without such delegation of authority. 30 The
- acquisition and disposition of equipment, proprietary software, and 31
- purchased services is exempt from RCW 43.19.1919 and, as provided in 32
- RCW 43.19.1901, from the provisions of RCW 43.19.190 through 43.19.200. 33
- 34 This subsection (1)(b) does not apply to the legislative branch;
- (c) To develop state-wide or interagency technical policies, 35
- 36 standards, and procedures;
- 37 (d) To review and approve standards and common specifications for
- new or expanded telecommunications networks proposed by agencies, 38

- 1 public postsecondary education institutions, educational service
- 2 districts, or state-wide or regional providers of K-12 information
- 3 technology services, and to assure the cost-effective development and
- 4 incremental implementation of a state-wide video telecommunications
- 5 system to serve: Public schools; educational service districts;
- 6 vocational-technical institutes; community colleges; colleges and
- 7 universities; state and local government; and the general public
- 8 through public affairs programming;
- 9 (e) To provide direction concerning strategic planning goals and
- 10 objectives for the state. The board shall seek input from the
- 11 legislature and the judiciary;
- 12 (f) To develop and implement a process for the resolution of
- 13 appeals by:
- 14 (i) Vendors concerning the conduct of an acquisition process by an
- 15 agency or the department; or
- 16 (ii) A customer agency concerning the provision of services by the
- 17 department or by other state agency providers;
- 18 (g) To establish policies for the periodic review by the department
- 19 of agency performance which may include but are not limited to analysis
- 20 of:
- 21 (i) Planning, management, control, and use of information services;
- 22 (ii) Training and education; and
- 23 (iii) Project management;
- 24 (h) To set its meeting schedules and convene at scheduled times, or
- 25 meet at the request of a majority of its members, the chair, or the
- 26 director; and
- 27 (i) To review and approve that portion of the department's budget
- 28 requests that provides for support to the board.
- 29 (2) State-wide technical standards to promote and facilitate
- 30 electronic information sharing and access are an essential component of
- 31 acceptable and reliable public access service and complement content-
- 32 related standards designed to meet those goals. The board shall:
- 33 (a) Establish technical standards to facilitate electronic access
- 34 to government information and interoperability of information systems.
- 35 Local governments are strongly encouraged to follow the standards
- 36 established by the board; and
- 37 (b) Require agencies to consider electronic public access needs
- 38 when planning new information systems or major upgrades of systems.

- In developing these standards, the board is encouraged to include the state library, state archives, and appropriate representatives of state and local government.
- (3) At least twice a year the chair shall report to the fiscal committees of the house of representatives and senate on the status of information technology projects and initiatives in state government.

 At the discretion of the individual chairs, such reports may be oral presentations.
