- 1 AN ACT Relating to marine tourism with British Columbia, Canada;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 47.60 RCW; creating a new section; and
- 3 declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that:
- 6 (a) Tourism is an important component of the state's economy and
- 7 spending by out-of-state visitors and Washington residents traveling
- 8 within the state totaled over seven and one-half billion dollars in
- 9 1994;
- 10 (b) In 1994, spending by travelers provided employment for over
- 11 ninety-six thousand people and that travel-generated payroll was one
- 12 billion fifty-one million dollars;
- 13 (c) In 1994, state tax revenue generated by travel spending totaled
- 14 four hundred eleven million dollars and local governments collected one
- 15 hundred four million nine hundred thousand dollars in travel-generated
- 16 taxes;
- 17 (d) In 1994, approximately twelve and one-half million
- 18 international travelers visited Washington state and Canadian visitors

- 1 accounted for approximately twelve million of the total visitors to
- 2 Washington state;
- 3 (e) In 1995, approximately twenty-two and nine-tenths percent of
- 4 all Canadian visitors, both overnight and same day, to the United
- 5 States came to Washington state; and
- 6 (f) In 1994, spending by Canadian visitors added four hundred four
- 7 million eight hundred thousand dollars to the Washington state economy.
- 8 (2) The legislature declares that tourism is a vital component of
- 9 the state's economy and that the Puget Sound ferry system is vital to
- 10 the state's tourism efforts.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 47.60 RCW
- 12 to read as follows:
- In addition to the requirements of RCW 47.60.330(1), before a
- 14 substantial curtailment in the level of service provided to ferry users
- 15 between the state and British Columbia, Canada, the department of
- 16 transportation shall consider the impact of the loss of tourism on the
- 17 state and the local community.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 19 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 20 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 21 immediately.
