## ENGROSSED SECOND SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2046

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1997 Regular Session

By House Committee on Appropriations (originally sponsored by Representatives Cooke, Kessler and Boldt)

Read first time 03/10/97.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to foster care; amending RCW 74.13.031 and
- 2 74.13.280; adding new sections to chapter 74.13 RCW; adding a new
- 3 section to chapter 43.20A RCW; creating a new section; providing an
- 4 effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 74.13.031 and 1995 c 191 s 1 are each amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 The department shall have the duty to provide child welfare 9 services as defined in RCW 74.13.020, and shall:
- 10 (1) Develop, administer, supervise, and monitor a coordinated and
- 11 comprehensive plan that establishes, aids, and strengthens services for
- 12 the protection and care of homeless, runaway, dependent, or neglected
- 13 children.
- 14 (2) ((Develop a recruiting plan for recruiting)) Recruit an
- 15 adequate number of prospective adoptive and foster homes, both regular
- 16 and specialized, i.e. homes for children of ethnic minority, including
- 17 Indian homes for Indian children, sibling groups, handicapped and
- 18 emotionally disturbed, teens, pregnant and parenting teens, and
- 19 annually ((submit the plan for review)) report the department's success

- in meeting the need for adoptive and foster home placements to the appropriate committees of the house of representatives and senate ((committees on social and health services)). The ((plan)) report shall include a section entitled "Foster Home Turn-Over, Causes and Recommendations."
- (3) Investigate complaints of neglect, abuse, or abandonment of 6 7 children, and on the basis of the findings of such investigation, offer 8 child welfare services in relation to the problem to such parents, 9 legal custodians, or persons serving in loco parentis, and/or bring the 10 situation to the attention of an appropriate court, or another community agency: PROVIDED, That an investigation is not required of 11 12 nonaccidental injuries which are clearly not the result of a lack of 13 care or supervision by the child's parents, legal custodians, or persons serving in loco parentis. If the investigation reveals that a 14 15 crime may have been committed, the department shall notify the appropriate law enforcement agency. 16
- 17 (4) Offer, on a voluntary basis, family reconciliation services to 18 families who are in conflict.
- 19 (5) Monitor out-of-home placements, on a timely and routine basis, 20 to assure the safety, well-being, and quality of care being provided is within the scope of the intent of the legislature as defined in RCW 21 74.13.010 and 74.15.010, and annually submit a report ((delineating the 22 results)) measuring the extent to which the department achieved the 23 24 specified goals to the appropriate committees of the house of 25 representatives and senate ((committees on social and health 26 services)).
  - (6) Have authority to accept custody of children from parents and to accept custody of children from juvenile courts, where authorized to do so under law, to provide child welfare services including placement for adoption, and to provide for the physical care of such children and make payment of maintenance costs if needed. Except where required by Public Law 95-608 (25 U.S.C. Sec. 1915), no private adoption agency which receives children for adoption from the department shall discriminate on the basis of race, creed, or color when considering applications in their placement for adoption.
- 36 (7) Have authority to provide temporary shelter to children who 37 have run away from home and who are admitted to crisis residential 38 centers.

1 (8) Have authority to purchase care for children; and shall follow 2 in general the policy of using properly approved private agency 3 services for the actual care and supervision of such children insofar 4 as they are available, paying for care of such children as are accepted 5 by the department as eligible for support at reasonable rates 6 established by the department.

- (9) Establish a children's services advisory committee which shall assist the secretary in the development of a partnership plan for utilizing resources of the public and private sectors, and advise on all matters pertaining to child welfare, licensing of child care agencies, adoption, and services related thereto. At least one member shall represent the adoption community.
- 13 (10) Have authority to provide continued foster care or group care 14 for individuals from eighteen through twenty years of age to enable 15 them to complete their high school or vocational school program.
- (11) Have authority within funds appropriated for foster care services to purchase care for Indian children who are in the custody of a federally recognized Indian tribe or tribally licensed child-placing agency pursuant to parental consent, tribal court order, or state juvenile court order; and the purchase of such care shall be subject to the same eligibility standards and rates of support applicable to other children for whom the department purchases care.
- Notwithstanding any other provision of RCW 13.32A.170 through 13.32A.200 and 74.13.032 through 74.13.036, or of this section all services to be provided by the department of social and health services under subsections (4), (6), and (7) of this section, subject to the limitations of these subsections, may be provided by any program offering such services funded pursuant to Titles II and III of the federal juvenile justice and delinquency prevention act of 1974.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW to read as follows:
- The department shall provide a foster parent liaison position in each department region. The department shall contract with a private nonprofit organization to provide the foster parent liaison function. The foster parent liaison shall enhance the working relationship between department case workers and foster parents. The foster parent liaison shall provide expedited assistance for the unique needs and requirements posed by special needs foster children in out-of-home

- 1 care. The foster parent liaison shall reduce the turnover of foster
- 2 parents by twenty percent from the historical turnover rate in each
- 3 region.
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 The department shall increase the number of adoptive and foster
- 7 families available to accept children through an intensive recruitment
- 8 and retention program. The department shall contract with a private
- 9 agency to coordinate foster care and adoptive home recruitment
- 10 activities for both the department and private agencies.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 43.20A RCW
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 The secretary or the secretary's designee may purchase services
- 14 from nonprofit agencies for the sole purpose of conducting home studies
- 15 for legally free children who have been awaiting adoption finalization
- 16 in foster or group care.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (1) After the effective date of chapter . . ., Laws of . . . (this
- 20 act), the department shall provide to every foster parent who receives
- 21 a foster child a passport that contains a complete report containing
- 22 all known and available information concerning the mental, physical,
- 23 legal, health, and educational status of the child. The passport shall
- 24 be provided to the foster parent at the initial physical placement of
- 25 the child. The department shall update the passport during the
- 26 regularly scheduled court reviews required under chapter 13.34 RCW.
- 27 (2) If, on July 1, 1998, the department has failed to completely
- 28 implement this section, a reduction in force of six full-time
- 29 equivalent administrative positions shall be applied to the children's
- 30 administration. The positions affected by this reduction in force
- 31 shall not include any positions involving the direct provision of
- 32 services to children and families, licensing, or monitoring of children
- 33 in care. The funds generated from this reduction in force shall be
- 34 used to contract for the development and operation of the passport
- 35 program required by this section.

- 1 (3) The secretary of the department of social and health services 2 shall certify to the ways and means committee of the senate and the 3 appropriations committee of the house of representatives whether the 4 children's administration has complied with the provisions of this 5 section.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW 7 to read as follows:
- The department shall provide child care for all foster parents who are required to attend meetings, training, and any other out-of-home activities related to their official duties as a foster parent. If the department is unable or unwilling to provide such child care the department shall conduct the activities covered by this section in the foster parent's home or other location acceptable to the foster parent.
- 14 **Sec. 7.** RCW 74.13.280 and 1995 c 311 s 21 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- (1) Except as provided in RCW 70.24.105, whenever a child is placed 16 17 in out-of-home care by the department or a child-placing agency, the 18 department or agency ((may)) shall share information about the child and the child's family with the care provider and ((may)) shall consult 19 20 with the care provider regarding the child's case plan. If the child 21 is dependent pursuant to a proceeding under chapter 13.34 RCW, the 22 department or agency shall keep the care provider informed regarding 23 the dates and location of dependency review and permanency planning 24 hearings pertaining to the child.
- (2) Any person who receives information about a child or a child's family pursuant to this section shall keep the information confidential and shall not further disclose or disseminate the information except as authorized by law.
- 29 (3) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the 30 authority of the department or child-placing agencies to disclose 31 client information or to maintain client confidentiality as provided by 32 law.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by section and bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 1997, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 3 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 4 July 1, 1997.
