SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2100

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1997 Regular Session

By House Committee on Natural Resources (originally sponsored by Representatives Buck and Hatfield)

Read first time 03/05/97.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the regional fisheries enhancement program;
- 2 amending RCW 75.50.080 and 75.50.100; adding a new section to chapter
- 3 75.50 RCW; creating new sections; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) Currently, many of the salmon stocks on the Washington coast
- 7 and in Puget Sound are severely depressed and may soon be listed under
- 8 the federal endangered species act.
- 9 (2) Immediate action is needed to reverse the severe decline of the
- 10 resource and ensure its very survival.
- 11 (3) The cooperation and participation of private landowners in
- 12 efforts to restore and enhance anadromous fish populations is crucial
- 13 to their success.
- 14 (4) The existing property rights of private landowners should not
- 15 be adversely impacted at a later date, by the successful implementation
- 16 of salmon restoration and enhancement projects on their property.
- 17 (5) Regional fisheries enhancement groups have been exceptionally
- 18 successful in their efforts to work with private landowners to restore
- 19 and enhance salmon habitat on private lands.

- 1 (6) Regional fisheries enhancement groups have provided the most 2 cost-effective approach to affecting the recovery of anadromous 3 fisheries in Washington state, with work undertaken by regional 4 fisheries enhancement groups returning on average nine dollars in 5 matching funds for every one dollar in expenditures from the regional 6 enhancement account.
- 7 (7) As each of the groups mature and expand, funding becomes a 8 significant limitation to maximizing their fisheries enhancement and 9 habitat restoration efforts.
- 10 (8) Therefore, an ample stable funding source is essential to the 11 success of the regional enhancement groups and their efforts to work 12 cooperatively with private landowners to restore salmon resources.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 75.50 RCW to read as follows:
- The regional fisheries enhancement salmonid recovery account is created in the state treasury. All moneys from federal sources and moneys from state sources specified by statute must be deposited into the account. Moneys in the account may be spent only after appropriation. Expenditures from the account may be used only for the sole purpose of fisheries enhancement and habitat restoration by regional fisheries enhancement groups.
- 22 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The regional fisheries enhancement group 23 advisory board shall conduct a study of federal, state, and local 24 permitting requirements for fisheries enhancement and habitat restoration projects. The study shall identify redundant, conflicting, 25 or duplicative permitting requirements and rules, and shall make 26 27 recommendations for streamlining and improving the permitting process. 28 The results of the study shall be reported to the senate natural 29 resources and parks committee and the house of representatives natural resources committee by November 1, 1997. 30
- 31 **Sec. 4.** RCW 75.50.080 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 47 are each amended to 32 read as follows:
- Regional fisheries enhancement groups, consistent with the longterm regional policy statements developed under RCW 75.50.020, shall seek to:
- 36 (1) Enhance the salmon <u>and steelhead</u> resources of the state;

- 1 (2) Maximize volunteer efforts and private donations to improve the salmon and steelhead resources for all citizens;
- 3 (3) Assist the department in achieving the goal to double the 4 state-wide salmon and steelhead catch by the year 2000 ((under chapter 5 214, Laws of 1988)); and
- 6 (4) Develop projects designed to supplement the fishery enhancement 7 capability of the department.
- 8 **Sec. 5.** RCW 75.50.100 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 2 s 39 (Referendum Bill 9 No. 45) are each amended to read as follows:
- 10 <u>(1)</u> The ((dedicated)) regional fisheries enhancement group account 11 is created in the custody of the state treasurer. Only the commission 12 or the commission's designee may authorize expenditures from the 13 account. The account is subject to allotment procedures under chapter 14 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is required for expenditures.
- 15 <u>(2)(a)</u> A surcharge of one dollar shall be collected on each 16 recreational personal use food fish license sold in the state.
- 17 <u>(b) A surcharge of one dollar shall be collected on each steelhead</u>
 18 license sold in the state.
- (c) A surcharge of one hundred dollars shall be collected on each commercial salmon fishery license, each salmon delivery license, and each salmon charter license sold in the state.
- 22 (d) A surcharge of twenty-five dollars shall be collected on each 23 fishing guide license and each anadromous game fish buyers license sold 24 in the state.
- Revenues from (a) and (c) of this subsection shall be deposited into the regional fisheries enhancement group account. Revenues from (b) and (d) of this subsection shall be deposited into the regional fisheries enhancement salmonid recovery account created in section 2 of this act.
- 30 (3) The department shall study methods for collecting and making available, an annual list, including names and addresses, of all 31 persons who obtain recreational and commercial salmon fishing licenses. 32 33 This list may be used to assist formation of the regional fisheries 34 enhancement groups and allow the broadest participation of license holders in enhancement efforts. The results of the study shall be 35 36 reported to the house of representatives fisheries and wildlife 37 committee and the senate environment and natural resources committee by 38 October 1, 1990. All receipts shall be placed in the regional

- fisheries enhancement group account and shall be used exclusively for regional fisheries enhancement group projects for the purposes of RCW 75.50.110. Funds from the regional fisheries enhancement group account shall not serve as replacement funding for department operated salmon projects that exist on January 1, 1991.
- 6 (4) All revenue from the department's sale of salmon carcasses and
 7 eggs that return to group facilities shall be deposited in the regional
 8 fisheries enhancement group account for use by the regional fisheries
 9 enhancement group that produced the surplus. The commission shall
 10 adopt rules to implement this section pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
