## HOUSE BILL 2291

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the use of lodging tax revenues in distressed
- 2 areas; and amending RCW 67.28.210.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 67.28.210 and 1996 c 159 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 All taxes levied and collected under RCW 67.28.180, 67.28.240, and
- 7 67.28.260 shall be credited to a special fund in the treasury of the
- 8 county or city imposing such tax. Such taxes shall be levied only for
- 9 the purpose of paying all or any part of the cost of acquisition,
- 10 construction, or operating of stadium facilities, convention center
- 11 facilities, performing arts center facilities, and/or visual arts
- 12 center facilities or to pay or secure the payment of all or any portion
- 13 of general obligation bonds or revenue bonds issued for such purpose or
- 14 purposes under this chapter, or to pay for advertising, publicizing, or
- 15 otherwise distributing information for the purpose of attracting
- 16 visitors and encouraging tourist expansion when a county or city has
- 17 imposed such tax for such purpose, or as one of the purposes hereunder,
- 18 and until withdrawn for use, the moneys accumulated in such fund or
- 19 funds may be invested in interest bearing securities by the county or

city treasurer in any manner authorized by law. In addition such taxes 1 2 may be used to develop strategies to expand tourism: PROVIDED, That any county, and any city within a county, bordering upon Grays Harbor 3 4 may use the proceeds of such taxes for construction and maintenance of 5 a movable tall ships tourist attraction in cooperation with a tall ships restoration society, except to the extent that such proceeds are 6 7 used for payment of principal and interest on debt incurred prior to 8 June 11, 1986: PROVIDED FURTHER, That any city or county may use the 9 proceeds of such taxes for the refurbishing and operation of a steam 10 railway or historic maritime vessels used primarily for passenger transportation for tourism promotion purposes: PROVIDED FURTHER, That 11 any city bordering on the Pacific Ocean or on Baker Bay with a 12 13 population of not less than eight hundred and the county in which such a city is located, a city bordering on the Skagit river with a 14 15 population of not less than twenty thousand, or any city within a 16 county made up entirely of islands may use the proceeds of such taxes 17 for funding special events or festivals, or for the acquisition, construction, or operation of publicly owned tourist promotional 18 19 infrastructures, structures, or buildings including but not limited to an ocean beach boardwalk, public docks, and viewing towers: PROVIDED 20 FURTHER, That any county which imposes a tax under RCW 67.28.182 or any 21 22 city with a population less than fifty thousand in such county may use the proceeds of the tax levied and collected under RCW 67.28.180 to 23 24 provide public restroom facilities available to and intended for use by 25 visitors: PROVIDED FURTHER, That any county made up entirely of 26 islands, and any city or town that has a population less than five thousand, may use the proceeds of the tax levied and collected under 27 RCW 67.28.180 to provide public restroom facilities available to and 28 29 intended for use by visitors: PROVIDED FURTHER, That any city or 30 county may use the proceeds of such taxes for funding a civic festival, if the following conditions are met: The festival is a community-wide 31 event held not more than once annually; the festival is approved by the 32 city, town, or county in which it is held; the festival is sponsored by 33 34 an exempt organization defined in section 501(c)(3), (4), or (6) of the 35 federal internal revenue code; the festival provides family-oriented events suiting a broad segment of the community; and the proceeds of 36 37 such taxes are used solely for advertising and promotional materials intended to attract overnight visitors: PROVIDED FURTHER, That any 38 39 city may use the proceeds of such taxes for street banners to attract

- 1 and welcome tourists: PROVIDED FURTHER, That any county that is or
- 2 contains an eligible area, as defined in RCW 82.60.010, or any city
- 3 within such county, may use the proceeds of such taxes for public
- 4 restrooms, parking facilities, or other tourism-related facilities, or
- 5 for law enforcement activities related to tourism.
