- 1 AN ACT Relating to accountability and collaboration in higher
- 2 education and K-12 education; amending RCW 28B.10.016 and 28B.15.910;
- 3 adding new sections to chapter 28B.10 RCW; adding a new section to
- 4 chapter 28A.300 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 28B.15 RCW.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.10.016 and 1992 c 231 s 1 are each amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 For the purposes of this title:
- 9 (1) "State universities" means the University of Washington and
- 10 Washington State University.
- 11 (2) "Regional universities" means Western Washington University at
- 12 Bellingham, Central Washington University at Ellensburg, and Eastern
- 13 Washington University at Cheney.
- 14 (3) "State college" means The Evergreen State College in Thurston
- 15 county.
- 16 (4) "Institutions of higher education" or "postsecondary
- 17 institutions" means the state universities, the regional universities,
- 18 The Evergreen State College, the community colleges, and the technical
- 19 colleges.

- 1 (5) "Governing board" means the board of regents or the board of
- 2 trustees of the institutions of higher education.
- 3 (6) "Baccalaureate institutions" means the state universities,
- 4 regional universities, and the state college.
- $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION.}}$ Sec. 2. The definitions in this section apply
- 6 throughout sections 3, 4, 5, and 6 of this act unless the context
- 7 clearly requires otherwise.
- 8 (1) "State-supported" means an activity that is supported in whole
- 9 or in part by money from the state general fund or student operating
- 10 fees.
- 11 (2) "Precollege class or laboratory" means high school level
- 12 classes or instruction intended to prepare postsecondary students for
- 13 college level work. The classes or laboratories may offer high school
- 14 level instruction in mathematics, grammar, reading, spelling, writing,
- 15 and English. English as a second language shall not be included.
- 16 (3) "Institutions of higher education" means the baccalaureate
- 17 institutions, the community colleges, and the technical colleges.
- 18 (4) "Recent high school graduate" means a person who graduated from
- 19 a Washington high school sometime during the three years immediately
- 20 before the student enrolled in a state-supported precollege class or
- 21 laboratory at an institution of higher education.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. By June 30th of each odd-numbered year, each
- 23 baccalaureate institution, and for the community and technical colleges
- 24 as a system, the state board for community and technical colleges,
- 25 shall establish and report to the superintendent of public instruction
- 26 an average per student instructional cost for state-supported
- 27 precollege classes and laboratories offered by the institution or
- 28 system.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) Beginning with the fall 2000 academic
- 30 term, a charge shall be assessed to each Washington school district
- 31 that, within the preceding three years, graduated a student enrolled in
- 32 any state-supported precollege class or laboratory offered at an
- 33 institution of higher education.
- 34 (2) At the beginning of each school year, the superintendent of
- 35 public instruction shall subtract from the allotment of each school
- 36 district, and provide to institutions of higher education, an amount

- 1 equal to the average per-student instructional cost of each state-
- 2 supported precollege class attended during the preceding fiscal year by
- 3 each recent high school graduate who received a high school diploma
- 4 from that school district. Funding shall first be reduced from

- 6 school district.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
- 8 RCW to read as follows:
- 9 The superintendent of public instruction shall reimburse
- 10 institutions of higher education that, pursuant to section 4 of this
- 11 act, provide instruction in precollege material.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, the governing boards
- 15 of each of the colleges and universities shall waive tuition fees for
- 16 precollege classes taken by recent high school graduates.
- 17 **Sec. 7.** RCW 28B.15.910 and 1997 c 433 s 5 are each amended to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 (1) Except for revenue waived under programs listed in subsection
- 20 (3) of this section, and unless otherwise expressly provided in the
- 21 omnibus state appropriations act, the total amount of operating fees
- 22 revenue waived, exempted, or reduced by a state university, a regional
- 23 university, The Evergreen State College, or the community colleges as
- 24 a whole, shall not exceed the percentage of total gross authorized
- 25 operating fees revenue set forth below. As used in this section,
- 26 "gross authorized operating fees revenue" means the estimated gross
- 27 operating fees revenue as estimated under RCW 82.33.020 or as revised
- 28 by the office of financial management, before granting any waivers.
- 29 This limitation applies to all tuition waiver programs established
- 30 before or after July 1, 1992.

- 32 (b) Washington State University 20 percent
- 33 (c) Eastern Washington University 11 percent
