- (a) Review methods and best practices in this and other states for 1 2 facilitating parent participation in education. The review should focus on methods that have been used successfully to increase academic 3 4 achievement, improve student conduct and attendance, and reduce student 5 drop-out rates in preschool and kindergarten through grade twelve. The review will also include methods and best practices for helping parents 6 understand the postsecondary opportunities available to their children, 7 8 including recommendations to help families and students become better 9 prepared to take advantage of those opportunities;
- 10 (b) Consult widely with parent groups and parents of children of 11 different abilities and different backgrounds, including children from 12 rural and urban areas;
- (c) Review and recommend best practices for assuring effective communication between school directors, school personnel, and parents and propose a system for communicating with parents about issues such as education reform, assessment results, and improved conduct and attendance;
- (d) Research and recommend successful models for training school personnel in ways to communicate with parents and to use parent skills effectively to improve student learning; and
- (e) Recommend best practices policies to ensure participation regardless of ability to pay, by parent volunteers and all students in extracurricular school events, including field trips, held during the regular school day.
- (3) The office of superintendent of public instruction shall submit a final report with its findings and recommendations to the governor and the house of representatives and senate education and higher education committees by December 1, 1998. The office shall also disseminate the results of the study to school directors, school districts, parent groups, and other interested parties.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 1998, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.
