- 1 AN ACT Relating to selling or giving drug or tobacco paraphernalia
- 2 to minors; amending RCW 26.28.080; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 26.28.080 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 437 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) Every person who sells or gives, or permits to be sold or given
- 7 to any person under the age of eighteen years any cigar, cigarette,
- 8 cigarette paper or wrapper, or tobacco in any form is guilty of a gross
- 9 misdemeanor.
- 10 (2) Every person who sells or gives, or permits to be sold or given
- 11 to any person under the age of eighteen years any drug or tobacco
- 12 paraphernalia in any form commits a class I civil infraction under
- 13 chapter 7.80 RCW. For purposes of this subsection, "drug or tobacco
- 14 paraphernalia means all equipment, products, and materials of any kind
- 15 which are used, or intended for use, or designed for use in smoking,
- 16 inhaling, or ingesting tobacco in any form, or which are used, intended
- 17 for use, or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating,
- 18 growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing,
- 19 processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging,

- 1 storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or
- 2 otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance. Drug
- 3 or tobacco paraphernalia includes, but is not limited to objects used,
- 4 <u>intended for use</u>, or <u>designed for use in ingesting</u>, <u>inhaling</u>, or
- 5 otherwise introducing tobacco, marihuana, cocaine, hashish, or hashish
- 6 oil into the human body, such as:
- 7 (a) Metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic, or ceramic pipes
- 8 with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads, or punctured
- 9 metal bowls;
- 10 <u>(b) Water pipes;</u>
- 11 (c) Carburetion tubes and devices;
- 12 (d) Smoking and carburetion masks;
- 13 (e) Roach clips: Meaning objects used to hold burning material,
- 14 such as a marihuana cigarette, that has become too small or too short
- 15 to be held in the hand;
- 16 <u>(f) Miniature cocaine spoons and cocaine vials;</u>
- 17 (q) Chamber pipes;
- (h) Carburetor pipes;
- 19 (i) Electric pipes;
- 20 <u>(j) Air-driven pipes;</u>
- 21 (k) Chillums;
- 22 <u>(1) Bongs; and</u>
- 23 (m) Ice pipes or chillers.
- 24 (3) It shall be no defense to a prosecution for a violation of this
- 25 section that the person acted, or was believed by the defendant to act,
- 26 as agent or representative of another.
