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## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2819

- 1 AN ACT Relating to vehicle use on department of fish and wildlife
- 2 lands; amending RCW 77.32.380; prescribing penalties; and providing an
- 3 effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.32.380 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 77 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) Persons ((sixteen years of age or older)) who enter upon or use
- 8 clearly identified department ((lands and)) improved access facilities
- 9 with a motor vehicle are required to ((possess a conservation license
- 10 or a hunting, fishing, trapping, or free license on their person while
- 11 using the facilities)) display a current annual fish and wildlife lands
- 12 vehicle use permit on the motor vehicle while within or while using an
- 13 improved access facility. An "improved access facility" is a clearly
- 14 <u>identified area specifically created for motor vehicle parking, and</u>
- 15 includes any boat launch or boat ramp associated with the parking area,
- 16 but does not include the department parking facilities at the Gorge
- 17 Concert Center near George, Washington. The vehicle use permit is
- 18 <u>issued in the form of a decal. One decal shall be issued at no charge</u>
- 19 with each annual saltwater, freshwater, combination, small game

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- 1 hunting, big game hunting, and trapping license issued by the
- 2 <u>department</u>. The <u>annual</u> fee for ((this license)) <u>a fish and wildlife</u>
- 3 <u>lands vehicle use permit, if purchased separately</u>, is ten dollars
- 4 ((annually)). Revenue derived from the sale of fish and wildlife lands
- 5 <u>vehicle</u> use permits shall be used solely for the stewardship and
- 6 maintenance of department improved access facilities.
- 7 ((The spouse, all children under eighteen years of age, and guests
- 8 under eighteen years of age of the holder of a valid conservation
- 9 license may use department lands and access facilities when accompanied
- 10 by the license holder.))
- 11 Youth groups may use department ((lands and game)) improved access
- 12 facilities without possessing a ((conservation license)) vehicle use
- 13 permit when accompanied by a ((license)) vehicle use permit holder.
- 14 ((The conservation license is nontransferable and must be validated
- 15 by the signature of the holder. Upon request of a wildlife agent or ex
- 16 officio wildlife agent a person using clearly identified department
- 17 lands shall exhibit the required license.))
- 18 (2) The decal must be affixed in a permanent manner to the motor
- 19 <u>vehicle before entering upon or using the motor vehicle on a department</u>
- 20 improved access facility, and must be displayed on the rear window of
- 21 the motor vehicle, or, if the motor vehicle does not have a rear
- 22 window, on the rear of the motor vehicle.
- 23 (3) Failure to display the fish and wildlife lands vehicle use
- 24 permit as required by this section is an infraction under chapter 7.84
- 25 RCW, and department employees are authorized to issue a notice of
- 26 <u>infraction to the registered owner of any motor vehicle entering upon</u>
- 27 or using a department improved access facility without such a decal.
- 28 The penalty for failure to display or improper display of the decal is
- 29 sixty-six dollars.
- 30 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act takes effect January 1, 1999.

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
