- 1 AN ACT Relating to the use of glycols; creating new sections; and
- 2 declaring an emergency.

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 The legislature finds it is essential to NEW SECTION. Sec. 1.
- protect and enhance the quality of Washington's water resources. legislature finds that the state must ensure adequate protection of the 6
- environment, including aquifers and surface water sources that supply
- public drinking water and help sustain aquatic life and habitat. 8
- 9 protection of wetlands, lakes, rivers, creeks, and the Puget Sound that
- 10 provide critical fish and wildlife habitat, and enhance our quality of
- life, must remain a high priority. 11
- Sources of human-caused pollution must be identified and addressed 12
- 13 to reduce or eliminate water quality degradation. One such source of
- 14 human-caused pollution is the use of ethylene and propylene glycols as
- 15 aircraft de-icers at major airports. The legislature finds that
- airports within the state must implement all known and reasonable 16
- 17 techniques to eliminate the discharge of glycols to surrounding surface
- 18 and ground waters.

- Sec. 2. (1) A committee to develop a Washington NEW SECTION. 1 state airport glycol use plan is created. The committee shall consist 2 of up to two senate members from each of the two largest caucuses of 3 4 the senate, selected by the president of the senate and up to two 5 representatives from each of the two largest caucuses of the house of representatives, selected the speaker of 6 by the house of 7 representatives. Staff support for the committee shall be provided by 8 the office of program research in the house of representatives and by 9 senate committee services.
- The committee shall submit a plan with statutory recommendations, if any, to the legislature by January 1, 1999.
- 12 (2) The committee may create advisory groups to assist it in 13 evaluating these issues and shall consult with the following:
- 14 (a) Citizens interested in water quality and protecting and 15 enhancing fish and wildlife habitat;
- 16 (b) The director or the director's designee from the departments of fish and wildlife, health, ecology, natural resources, and agriculture;
- 18 (c) County governments, port districts, water-sewer districts, 19 local health departments, and cities; and
 - (d) Scientific and academic specialists.

- 21 (3) The glycol use plan shall include a review of all airports 22 serving an annual daily average of more than one thousand scheduled 23 commercial passenger flights. The plan shall include, but not be 24 limited to, the following elements:
- 25 (a) An overview of the science of glycols, its usage as an aircraft 26 de-icer and its potential to contaminate the waters of the state. This 27 scientific overview should identify and critically evaluate the various 28 methods and techniques available for application of glycols on 29 aircraft;
- 30 (b) An assessment of, and recommendations addressing, the problems 31 associated with the capture and on-site treatment of glycols;
- 32 (c) Recommendations on sources of federal, state, and local funding 33 for developing management programs and projects to protect state waters 34 from glycols; and
- 35 (d) A plan or program to provide public information and education 36 concerning the effectiveness of glycols as a de-icer and the methods 37 available to prevent glycols from polluting surface and ground waters.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
