- 1 AN ACT Relating to financing needs for senior housing; creating new
- 2 sections; providing an expiration date; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the availability 5 of safe and affordable housing is vital to low-income senior citizens 6 and persons with disabilities. The legislature further finds that the 7 availability of low-cost financing is necessary for the development or preservation of housing for seniors and persons with disabilities. The 8 9 legislature further finds that many existing housing developments for 10 seniors and persons with disabilities are in need of renovation. 11 legislature further finds that there is a need to explore alternative financing techniques to cover the cost of development or renovation of 12 13 housing for seniors and persons with disabilities. It is the intent of 14 the legislature to create the task force on financing housing for 15 seniors and persons with disabilities to explore alternative financing techniques for the development and renovation of housing developments 16 17 in Washington for low-income seniors and persons with disabilities.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) There is created the task force on financing senior housing and housing for persons with disabilities to consist of sixteen members. The task force consists of the following members:
- 5 (a) The director of the department of community, trade, and 6 economic development or the director's designee, who serves as an ex 7 officio member and as chair;
- 8 (b) The executive director of the Washington state investment board 9 or the director's designee, who serves as an ex officio member;
- 10 (c) The executive director of the Washington state housing finance 11 commission or the director's designee, who serves as an ex officio 12 member;
- 13 (d) The secretary of the department of social and health services 14 or the secretary's designee, who serves as an ex officio member;
 - (e) Four representatives from organizations involved in the management of senior housing developments, one of which must be from an organization involved in the ownership of senior housing developments;
- (f) Three representatives from financial institutions involved in financing senior housing developments, one of which must be from an investment and banking firm involved in financing federally insured senior housing developments;
- 22 (g) One representative from a mobile home owners association that 23 represents seniors;
 - (h) One representative from a mobile home park owners association;
- 25 (i) Two representatives from state-wide organizations that 26 represent persons with disabilities; and
- 27 (j) One representative from a public housing authority.
- 28 (2) The director of the department of community, trade, and 29 economic development shall appoint all nonex officio members to the 30 task force on financing senior housing and housing for persons with 31 disabilities. The vice-chair of the task force is selected by majority 32 vote of the task force members. The members of the task force on 33 financing senior housing and housing for persons with disabilities 34 serve without compensation.
- 35 (3) The department of community, trade, and economic development, 36 the Washington state investment board, and the Washington state housing 37 finance commission shall supply such information and assistance as is 38 necessary for the task force on financing senior housing and housing

- 1 for persons with disabilities to carry out its duties under section 3 2 of this act.
- 3 (4) The department of community, trade, and economic development, 4 the Washington state investment board, and the Washington state housing 5 finance commission shall provide administrative and clerical assistance 6 to the task force on financing senior housing and housing for persons

with disabilities.

- 8 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The task force on financing senior housing 9 and housing for persons with disabilities shall by December 15, 1998, prepare and submit to the house of representatives committee on trade 10 and economic development and the senate committee on financial 11 12 institutions, insurance and housing a progress report on the findings and recommendations required under chapter 383, Laws of 1997. The task 13 force may also make additional recommendations on financial and 14 regulatory techniques designed to assist in the construction of new 15 facilities or renovation of existing housing facilities for seniors and 16 persons with disabilities. 17
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act expires February 1, 1999.
