## HOUSE BILL 3107

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1998 Regular Session

- AN ACT Relating to bid requirements for school district property;
- 2 and amending RCW 28A.335.190.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.335.190 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 10 s 3 are each 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) When, in the opinion of the board of directors of any school district, the cost of any furniture, supplies, equipment, building, 8 improvements, or repairs, or other work or purchases, except books, will equal or exceed the sum of fifty thousand dollars, complete plans 9 10 and specifications for such work or purchases shall be prepared and notice by publication given in at least one newspaper of general 11 circulation within the district, once each week for two consecutive 12 13 of the intention to receive bids therefor and 14 specifications and other information may be examined at the office of 15 the board or any other officially designated location: PROVIDED, That the board without giving such notice may make improvements or repairs 16 17 to the property of the district through the shop and repair department of such district when the total of such improvements or repair does not 18 19 exceed the sum of (a) fifteen thousand dollars, for districts with

fifteen thousand five hundred or more full-time equivalent students; or 1 (b) for districts with fewer than fifteen thousand five hundred full-2 time equivalent students, fifteen thousand dollars if more than one 3 4 craft or trade is involved with the school district improvement or repair, or ten thousand dollars if a single craft or trade is involved 5 with the school district improvement or repair. The cost of any public 6 7 work, improvement or repair for the purposes of this section shall be 8 the aggregate of all amounts to be paid for labor, material, and 9 equipment on one continuous or interrelated project where work is to be 10 performed simultaneously or in close sequence. The bids shall be in writing and shall be opened and read in public on the date and in the 11 12 place named in the notice and after being opened shall be filed for 13 public inspection.

- (2) Every purchase of furniture, equipment or supplies, except books, the cost of which is estimated to be in excess of fifteen thousand dollars, shall be on a competitive basis. The board of directors shall establish a procedure for securing telephone and/or written quotations for such purchases. Whenever the estimated cost is from fifteen thousand dollars up to fifty thousand dollars, the procedure shall require quotations from at least three different sources to be obtained in writing or by telephone, and recorded for public perusal. Whenever the estimated cost is in excess of fifty thousand dollars, the public bidding process provided in subsection (1) of this section shall be followed.
- 25 (3) Every building, improvement, repair or other public works 26 project, the cost of which is estimated to be in excess of (a) fifteen 27 thousand dollars, for districts with fifteen thousand five hundred or more full-time equivalent students; or (b) for districts with fewer 28 29 than fifteen thousand five hundred full-time equivalent students, 30 fifteen thousand dollars if more than one craft or trade is involved with the school district improvement or repair, or ten thousand dollars 31 if a single craft or trade is involved with the school district 32 improvement or repair, shall be on a competitive bid process. All such 33 34 projects estimated to be less than fifty thousand dollars may be awarded to a contractor on the small works roster. The small works 35 roster shall be comprised of all responsible contractors who have 36 37 requested to be on the list. The board of directors shall establish a procedure for securing telephone and/or written quotations from the 38 39 contractors on the small works roster to assure establishment of a

competitive price and for awarding contracts to the lowest responsible 1 2 bidder. Such procedure shall require that a good faith effort be made to request quotations from all contractors on the small works roster 3 4 who have indicated the capability of performing the kind of public 5 works being contracted. Immediately after an award is made, the bid quotations obtained shall be recorded, open to public inspection, and 6 7 available by telephone inquiry. The small works roster shall be 8 revised at least once each year by publishing notice of such 9 opportunity in at least one newspaper of general circulation in the 10 district. Responsible contractors shall be added to the list at any time they submit a written request. Whenever the estimated cost of a 11 public works project is fifty thousand dollars or more, the public 12 13 bidding process provided in subsection (1) of this section shall be 14 followed.

15 (4) The contract for the work or purchase shall be awarded to the 16 lowest responsible bidder as defined in ((RCW 43.19.1911)) subsection 17 (7) of this section but the board may by resolution reject any((and)) 18 or all bids and make further calls for bids in the same manner as the 19 original call. On any work or purchase the board shall provide bidding 19 information to any qualified bidder or the bidder's agent, requesting 19 it in person.

- (5) In the event of any emergency when the public interest or property of the district would suffer material injury or damage by delay, upon resolution of the board declaring the existence of such an emergency and reciting the facts constituting the same, the board may waive the requirements of this section with reference to any purchase or contract: PROVIDED, That an "emergency", for the purposes of this section, means a condition likely to result in immediate physical injury to persons or to property of the school district in the absence of prompt remedial action.
- 31 (6) This section does not apply to the direct purchase of school 32 buses by school districts and educational services in accordance with 33 RCW 28A.160.195.
- (7)(a) For purposes of this section, "lowest responsible bidder"
  means the bidder that submits the lowest bid or the bidder that is the
  closest bid to the average of the three lowest bids, at the discretion
  of the board. After the board has identified the apparent lowest
  responsible bidder the board may reject the apparent lowest responsible
  bidder based upon the following criteria:

- (ii) The experience, qualifications, and efficiency of the bidder;
- 4 <u>(iii) Whether the bidder can perform the contract within the time</u> 5 specified;
  - (iv) The quality of performance of previous contracts or services;
- 7 <u>(v) The previous and existing compliance by the bidder with laws</u> 8 relating to the contract or services; and
- 9 <u>(vi) Such other information as may be secured having a bearing on</u>
  10 the decision to award the contract.
- 11 (b) If the board rejects the apparent lowest responsible bidder
- 12 based on any of the criteria listed in (a) of this subsection, the
- 13 board may select the next lowest bidder or the next closest to the
- 14 average of the three lowest bids.
