- 8 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 9 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 10 represent and petition as follows:
- 11 WHEREAS, Due to federal legislative action by the Honorable William
- 12 J. Clinton, President of the United States, and the Senate and House of
- 13 Representatives of the United States, the nature of the federal public
- 14 assistance system is undergoing the most dramatic change in the past
- 15 sixty years; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Federal legislation requires that states be increasingly
- 17 diligent concerning how public assistance moneys are spent and compels
- 18 states to ensure that those who are receiving public assistance are
- 19 truly in need; and

1 WHEREAS, States now have the opportunity to design and administer 2 income assistance programs that may be substantially and materially 3 different than programs in bordering states; and

WHEREAS, There is a small percentage of the population that receive or seek or attempt to receive public assistance in a fraudulent manner and in effect take limited assistance resources away from the truly needy; and

WHEREAS, There is substantial concern that a significant amount of interstate public assistance fraud already exists and that recent changes in public assistance laws may greatly increase the potential for this type of criminal activity;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that a tristate committee dealing with interstate public assistance fraud be established between and among the states of Idaho, Oregon, and Washington for the purposes of developing cooperative relationships aimed at creating effective strategies to deal with the problems of interstate public assistance fraud.

BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to the Honorable Philip E. Batt, Governor of the State of Idaho; the Honorable John Kitzhaber, Governor of the State of Oregon; the President of the Idaho State Senate; the President of the Oregon State Senate; the Speaker of the Idaho State House of Representatives; the Speaker of the Oregon State House of Representatives; and to the Idaho State Senate and House of Representatives and the Oregon State Senate and House of Representatives.
