1 AN ACT Relating to alternate teacher certification; amending RCW
2 28A.410.025 and 28A.150.410; adding new sections to chapter 28A.410
3 RCW; and creating new sections.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** It is the intent of the legislature to
6 facilitate a conditional opportunity for community members, including
7 business and retired persons, to bring their expertise and work
8 experiences into the classrooms in Washington to enrich the learning
9 experience of students.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** (1) A school district on behalf of an
11 individual candidate may apply to the superintendent of public
12 instruction for the issuance of an alternate teacher certificate.

13 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall issue the
14 alternate teacher certificate if the following requirements are met and
15 documented:

16 (a) The individual holds a baccalaureate degree from a regionally
17 accredited institution of higher education;

1 (b) The individual has at least five years' work experience
2 relevant to the subject area or areas the school district desires the
3 individual to teach;

4 (c) The school district superintendent has determined that the
5 individual has sufficient knowledge or experience to teach a particular
6 subject or subjects and has recommended the individual to the school
7 board of directors for approval. The school district superintendent
8 shall recommend to the school board of directors for approval
9 individuals he or she determines has sufficient knowledge or experience
10 to teach a particular subject or subjects;

11 (d) The individual meets the age and character requirements
12 established by the state board of education for all certificated staff,
13 including compliance with the background check through the Washington
14 state patrol criminal investigation system and the federal bureau of
15 investigation as required under RCW 28A.410.010;

16 (e) The individual passes the state certification assessment of
17 basic skills in reading, writing, communications, and mathematics when
18 it becomes available;

19 (f) The individual possesses a contract specifying the terms and
20 conditions of employment in a school district of the state; and

21 (g) The individual takes the certification assessment of teaching
22 knowledge when it becomes available, and the results are used in the
23 development of the written plan of assistance required under subsection
24 (4) of this section.

25 (3) Until the state certification assessment of basic skills under
26 subsection (2)(e) of this section is available, the individual shall
27 complete a test of basic skills recommended by the state board of
28 education. The passing scores shall be determined by the local school
29 board until such time as the state board of education has by rule
30 adopted minimum passing scores.

31 (4)(a) Prior to beginning teaching under the alternate teacher
32 certificate, the individual shall develop with the employing school
33 district a written plan for training, supervision, guidance, and
34 support which shall be provided by the district to the individual while
35 he or she holds the alternate teacher certificate.

36 (b) During the first ten weeks of employment, the school district
37 shall provide direct supervision or observation of the teacher with an
38 alternate certificate to assure the teacher's instructional
39 effectiveness and identify any professional development needs.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** (1) The alternate teacher certificate allows
2 the holder full authority to serve as a part-time or full-time teacher.
3 The certificate shall be valid for not more than two years of full-time
4 or part-time teaching or its equivalent.

5 (2) The alternate teacher certificate shall allow the holder to
6 provide instructional services to students in any of the grades in
7 middle school, junior high, and high school and teach only the subject
8 or subjects approved by the local school board of directors and
9 designated on the alternate teacher certificate.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** (1) An individual desiring to teach beyond
11 the expiration date of the alternate teacher certificate may apply to
12 the superintendent of public instruction for an initial or residency
13 teaching certificate. The state superintendent shall issue the
14 individual an initial or residency certificate if the following
15 requirements are met and documented:

16 (a) The individual has completed at least two school years of
17 successful teaching experience based on the recommendations of the
18 supervising principal and district superintendent and approved by the
19 school board of directors;

20 (b) The individual has successfully passed the state certification
21 assessments of subject knowledge when they become available; and

22 (c) The individual has successfully passed the state certification
23 assessments of teaching knowledge when they become available.

24 (2) The state board of education may not require any other
25 conditions than those specified under subsection (1) of this section to
26 meet initial or residency certification requirements.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** Through its authority under RCW 28A.305.130
28 to approve professional preparation programs in institutions of higher
29 education, the state board of education shall ensure that prospective
30 candidates for the alternative certification process under sections 1
31 through 4 of this act are permitted to challenge required college
32 courses in the professional preparation program.

33 **Sec. 6.** RCW 28A.410.025 and 1969 ex.s. c 223 s 28A.67.010 are each
34 amended to read as follows:

35 No person shall be accounted as a qualified teacher within the
36 meaning of the school law who is not the holder of a valid teacher's

1 certificate, alternate certificate issued under section 2 of this act,
2 or permit or other limited certificate issued by ((lawful authority of
3 this state)) the superintendent of public instruction pursuant to state
4 law or the state board of education rules.

5 **Sec. 7.** RCW 28A.150.410 and 1997 c 141 s 1 are each amended to
6 read as follows:

7 (1) The legislature shall establish for each school year in the
8 appropriations act a state-wide salary allocation schedule, for
9 allocation purposes only, to be used to distribute funds for basic
10 education certificated instructional staff salaries under RCW
11 28A.150.260.

12 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall calculate salary
13 allocations for state funded basic education certificated instructional
14 staff by determining the district average salary for basic education
15 and special education instructional staff using the salary allocation
16 schedule established pursuant to this section.

17 (3) Beginning January 1, 1992, no more than ninety college quarter-
18 hour credits received by any employee after the baccalaureate degree
19 may be used to determine compensation allocations under the state
20 salary allocation schedule and LEAP documents referenced in the
21 biennial appropriations act, or any replacement schedules and
22 documents, unless:

23 (a) The employee has a masters degree; or

24 (b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations
25 before January 1, 1992.

26 (4) In determining state allocations and salaries for individuals
27 participating in the alternate certification program under section 2 of
28 this act, an individual's salary shall be based on the state-wide
29 salary allocation schedule for individuals with zero years of service
30 and the individual's degree. Calculation of certificated years of
31 service shall start from the date the individual is issued an initial
32 or residency certificate and begins accumulating full-time or part-time
33 professional educational employment.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** Sections 2 through 5 of this act are each
35 added to chapter 28A.410 RCW.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 9.** The alternative teacher certificate shall be
2 available beginning the 1998-99 school year.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 10.** If any provision of this act or its
4 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
5 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
6 persons or circumstances is not affected.

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
