1       AN ACT Relating to transportation improvement board reporting  
2 requirements; and adding a new section to chapter 47.26 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 47.26 RCW  
5 to read as follows:

6       Beginning February 1, 2000, and annually thereafter, the  
7 transportation improvement board shall submit to the transportation  
8 committees of the senate and the house of representatives, proposed  
9 lists of projects for which funds are being requested for appropriation  
10 from the following accounts: Transportation improvement account, urban  
11 arterial trust account, central Puget Sound public transportation  
12 account, public transportation systems account, small city account, and  
13 city hardship assistance account. The lists shall include, but not be  
14 limited to, lead agency, name of project, a brief description of the  
15 project, estimated expenditures by phase and biennium including prior  
16 biennium expenditures, funding requirements of other organizations,  
17 priority rating, anticipated start date by phase, applicable state  
18 route or road name, other impacted agencies, and legislative district.  
19 Recognizing there may be projects of an emergent nature outside of the

1 normal funding cycle and the need to coordinate project funding with  
2 federal program cycles, the board has the authority to provide funding  
3 for such projects and upon approval shall notify the legislative  
4 transportation committee.

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
