- 1 AN ACT Relating to the moneys derived from public lands managed by
- 2 the commissioner of public lands; amending RCW 76.12.030 and 79.01.744;
- 3 and reenacting and amending RCW 76.12.120.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 76.12.030 and 1991 c 363 s 151 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 If any land acquired by a county through foreclosure of tax liens,
- 8 or otherwise, comes within the classification of land described in RCW
- 9 76.12.020 and can be used as state forest land and if the department
- 10 deems such land necessary for the purposes of this chapter, the county
- 11 shall, upon demand by the department, deed such land to the department
- 12 and the land shall become a part of the state forest lands.
- 13 Such land shall be held in trust and administered and protected by
- 14 the department as other state forest lands. Any moneys derived from
- 15 the lease of such land or from the sale of forest products, oils,
- 16 gases, coal, minerals, or fossils therefrom, shall be distributed as
- 17 follows:
- 18 (1) The expense incurred by the state for administration,
- 19 reforestation, and protection, not to exceed ((twenty-five)) twenty-two

percent, which rate of percentage shall be determined by the board of 2 natural resources, shall be returned to the forest development account in the state general fund. By June 30th of each year, the board of 3 4 natural resources must establish the percentage and a budget for the following fiscal year in such a manner that the balance in the account 5 does not exceed the amount necessary for six months of operating 6 7 expenses for administration, reforestation, and protection. The board 8 of natural resources must set the level of the balance of the account 9 in cooperation with the counties that have forest board transfer lands. (2) Any balance remaining after the distribution under subsection 10 (1) of this section shall be paid to the county in which the land is 11 located to be paid, distributed, and prorated, except as hereinafter 12 provided, to the various funds in the same manner as general taxes are 13 paid and distributed during the year of payment((: PROVIDED, That)). 14 15 Within seven working days of receipt of these moneys, the department shall certify to the state treasurer the amounts to be distributed to 16 the counties. The state treasurer shall distribute funds to the 17 counties four times per month, with no more than ten days between each 18 19 payment date. Any such balance remaining paid to a county with a population of less than nine thousand shall first be applied to the 20 reduction of any indebtedness existing in the current expense fund of 21

23 **Sec. 2.** RCW 76.12.120 and 1988 c 128 s 32 and 1988 c 70 s 1 are 24 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

such county during the year of payment.

All land, acquired or designated by the department as state forest land, shall be forever reserved from sale, but the timber and other products thereon may be sold or the land may be leased in the same manner and for the same purposes as is authorized for state granted land if the department finds such sale or lease to be in the best financial interests of the ((state and approves the terms and conditions thereof)) respective county trust beneficiaries.

Except as provided in RCW 79.12.035, all money derived from the sale of timber or other products, or from lease, or from any other source from the land, except where the Constitution of this state or RCW 76.12.030 requires other disposition, shall be disposed of as follows:

37 (1) Fifty percent shall be placed in the forest development 38 account.

- (2) Fifty percent shall be prorated and distributed to the state 1 general fund, to be dedicated for the benefit of the public schools, 2 3 and the county in which the land is located according to the relative 4 proportions of tax levies of all taxing districts in the county. 5 portion to be distributed to the state general fund shall be based on the regular school levy rate under RCW 84.52.065 as now or hereafter 6 7 amended and the levy rate for any maintenance and operation special 8 school levies. With regard to the portion to be distributed to the 9 counties, the department shall certify to the state treasurer the amounts to be distributed within seven working days of receipt of the 10 money. The state treasurer shall distribute funds to the counties four 11 times per month, with no more than ten days between each payment date. 12 The money distributed to the county shall be paid, distributed, and 13 prorated to the various other funds in the same manner as general taxes 14 15 are paid and distributed during the year of payment.
- 16 **Sec. 3.** RCW 79.01.744 and 1987 c 505 s 76 are each amended to read 17 as follows:
- 18 (1) It shall be the duty of the commissioner of public lands to 19 report, and recommend, to each session of the legislature, any changes 20 in the law relating to the methods of handling the public lands of the 21 state that he may deem advisable.
- 22 (2) The commissioner of public lands shall provide a comprehensive 23 biennial report to reflect the previous fiscal period. 24 shall include, but not be limited to, descriptions of all department 25 activities including: Revenues generated, program costs, capital expenditures, personnel, special projects, new and ongoing research, 26 27 environmental controls, cooperative projects, intergovernmental agreements, the adopted sustainable harvest compared to the sales 28 program, and outlines of ongoing litigation, recent court decisions and 29 orders on major issues with the potential for state liability. 30 report shall describe the status of the resources managed and the 31 recreational and commercial utilization. The report shall be given to 32 33 the chairs of the house and senate committees on ways and means and the 34 house and senate committees on natural resources, including one copy to the staff of each of the committees, and shall be made available to the 35 36 public.
- 37 (3) The commissioner of public lands shall provide annual reports 38 to the respective trust beneficiaries, including each county. The

- 1 report shall include, but not be limited to, the following: Acres
- 2 sold, acres harvested, volume from those acres, acres planted, number
- 3 of stems per acre, acres precommercially thinned, acres commercially
- 4 thinned, acres partially cut, acres clear cut, age of final rotation
- 5 for acres clear cut, and the total number of acres off base for harvest
- 6 and an explanation of why those acres are off base for harvest.
