1 WHEREAS, A number of former members of the Senate and the House of
2 Representatives of the State of Washington have passed from this life,
3 leaving a record of service to the people; and

4 WHEREAS, It has been a custom at each session of the Legislature to
5 hold a memorial service in order to pay special and fitting tribute to
6 the lives and services of these valued public servants and to express
7 our sympathies to their bereaved families;

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of
9 the State of Washington, the Senate concurring, That in recognition of
10 the valued services rendered to the State by these eminent citizens,
11 the Senate and the House of Representatives shall meet in Joint Session
12 and that an appropriate service be held in the House Chamber on
13 Thursday, February 27, 1997, at 1:30 p.m., that their bereaved families
14 be invited to attend the memorial service, and that an opportunity be
15 given for tribute to their memories; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That four members of the House of
17 Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
18 Representatives, together with four members of the Senate, to be

1 appointed by the President of the Senate, act as a Joint Committee to
2 arrange for the memorial service.
