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## ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5098

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1997 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to general obligation bond debt service payments
- 2 from the community and technical college capital projects account;
- 3 amending RCW 28B.50.360; amending 1997 c 235 s 709 (uncodified); and
- 4 declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.50.360 and 1997 c 42 s 1 are each amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 Within thirty-five days from the date of start of each quarter all
- 9 collected building fees of each such community and technical college
- 10 shall be paid into the state treasury, and shall be credited as
- 11 follows:
- 12 (1) On or before June 30th of each year the college board if
- 13 issuing bonds payable out of building fees shall certify to the state
- 14 treasurer the amounts required in the ensuing twelve-month period to
- 15 pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest on such
- 16 bonds. The state treasurer shall thereupon deposit the amounts so
- 17 certified in the community and technical college capital projects
- 18 account. Such amounts of the funds deposited in the community and
- 19 technical college capital projects account as are necessary to pay and

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secure the payment of the principal of and interest on the building 1 bonds issued by the college board as authorized by this chapter shall 2 be exclusively devoted to that purpose. If in any twelve-month period 3 4 it shall appear that the amount certified by the college board is insufficient to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and 5 interest on the outstanding building bonds, the state treasurer shall 6 7 notify the college board and such board shall adjust its certificate so 8 that all requirements of moneys to pay and secure the payment of the 9 principal and interest on all such bonds then outstanding shall be 10 fully met at all times.

(2) The community and technical college capital projects account is hereby created in the state treasury. The sums deposited in the capital projects account shall be appropriated and expended exclusively to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest on bonds payable out of the building fees and for the construction, reconstruction, erection, equipping, maintenance, demolition and major alteration of buildings and other capital assets owned by the state board for community and technical colleges in the name of the state of Washington, and the acquisition of sites, rights-of-way, easements, improvements or appurtenances in relation thereto, and for the payment of principal of and interest on any bonds issued for such purposes.

(((3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (1) and (2) of this section, at such time as all outstanding building bonds of the college board payable from the community and technical college capital projects account have been paid, redeemed, and retired, or at such time as ample provision has been made by the state for full payment, from some source other than the community and technical college capital projects account, of the principal of and the interest on and call premium, if applicable, of such bonds as they mature and/or upon their call prior to their maturity, through refunding or otherwise, that portion of all building fees of the community and technical colleges equal to the amount required to pay yearly debt service on any general obligation bonds issued by the state in accordance with Article VIII, section 1, Washington state Constitution, for community and technical college purposes, shall be paid into the general fund of the state treasury. The state finance committee shall determine whether ample provision has been made for payment of such bonds payable from the community and technical college capital projects account and shall determine the amount required to pay yearly debt service on such

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- general obligation bonds of the state. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as obligating the legislature or the state to provide for payment of such college building bonds from some source other than the community and technical college capital projects account or as pledging the general credit of the state to the payment of such bonds.))
- 7 **Sec. 2.** 1997 c 235 s 709 (uncodified) is amended to read as 8 follows:
- 9 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, ((for the 1997-99 biennium,)) transfers of reimbursement by the state treasurer to the 10 general fund from the community college capital projects account for 11 debt service payments made under Title 28B RCW shall occur only after 12 such debt service payment has been made and only to the extent that 13 are actually available to 14 funds the account. Any ((unpaid 15 reimbursements shall be a continued obligation against the community 16 college capital projects account until paid)) reimbursements unpaid as of June 30, 1998, are hereby forgiven. The state board for community 17 18 and technical colleges need not accumulate any specific balance in the 19 community college capital projects account in anticipation of transfers to reimburse the general fund. 20
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.

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
