- 1 AN ACT Relating to vehicles that have been rebuilt from salvage;
- 2 amending RCW 46.32.005, 46.12.040, and 46.12.075; adding a new section
- 3 to chapter 46.32 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.32.005 and 1993 c 403 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 For the purpose of this chapter:
- 8 (1) "Commercial motor vehicle" means a self-propelled or towed
- 9 vehicle designed or used to transport passengers or property, if the
- 10 vehicle:
- 11 $((\frac{1}{1}))$ (a) Has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination
- 12 weight rating of ten thousand one or more pounds;
- 13 $((\frac{2}{2}))$ Is designed to transport sixteen or more passengers,
- 14 including the driver; or
- 15 $((\frac{3}{1}))$ (c) Is transporting hazardous materials and is required to
- 16 be identified by a placard in accordance with 49 C.F.R. Sec. 172.500-
- 17 .560 (1991)((-))

- 1 (2) A recreational vehicle used for noncommercial purposes is not 2 considered a commercial motor vehicle. "Recreational vehicle" includes 3 a vehicle towing a horse trailer for a noncommercial purpose; and
- 4 (3) "Structural integrity inspection" means an inspection of a
 5 salvage vehicle, as authorized by the Washington state patrol, to
 6 ensure that the frame and other components integral to the structure of
 7 the vehicle have been reconstructed or repaired in a manner that meets
 8 automotive industry standards.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.32 RCW 10 to read as follows:
- 11 (1) Structural integrity inspections may be conducted only by 12 privately owned autobody repair shops that are certified by the 13 Washington state patrol to perform the inspections.
- 14 (2) To receive certification to perform structural integrity 15 inspections, the autobody repair shop must:
 - (a) Be properly licensed, bonded, and insured; and

- 17 (b) Possess the ability, including facilities, equipment, and 18 personnel, to accomplish the inspections.
- 19 (3) Technicians conducting the inspections must have: (a) At least five years of practical experience; (b) automotive service excellence 20 (ASE) certification for structural measurement and correction, or 21 equivalent certification approved by the state patrol; and (c) 22 23 completed a series of collision repair classes sanctioned or provided 24 by the interindustry conference on auto collision repair (I-CAR). 25 Washington state patrol shall determine which classes are required and may accept equivalent training classes to meet this requirement. 26
 - (4) The Washington state patrol shall set a fee schedule to adequately cover the cost of the structural integrity inspections. The business performing the inspection shall charge the fee to the person or business requesting the inspection and shall retain the fee so collected.
- 32 (5) A person or business performing a structural integrity 33 inspection is not required to check components unrelated to the 34 structural integrity of the vehicle.
- 35 (6) A document describing the structural integrity inspection 36 program or certificate issued under this section must include a 37 statement conveying that such an inspection is limited to structural 38 components of the vehicle and does not ensure the overall safety of a

vehicle, and recommending that the consumer have the nonstructural components of the vehicle inspected to ensure the safety of the vehicle.

- 4 (7) The department or the Washington state patrol may adopt rules 5 requiring insurers and owners of vehicles who submit certificates of ownership under RCW 46.12.070 due to the vehicle's destruction or 6 7 declaration as a total loss to submit a form provided by the 8 department, showing the general areas of damage to the vehicle and 9 providing procedures to use the forms to facilitate structural 10 integrity inspections. If adopted, the rules must require that the form include a disclaimer indicating that all damage to the vehicle may 11 12 not be represented.
- 13 (8) The department or the Washington state patrol may adopt rules 14 requiring a person or business requesting a structural integrity 15 inspection to provide photos depicting the original damage to the 16 vehicle.
- 17 (9) A business certified to perform structural integrity 18 inspections may not perform an inspection under this section on a 19 vehicle owned or rebuilt by the business or any employee of the 20 business.
- 21 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.12.040 and 1990 c 238 s 2 are each amended to read 22 as follows:
- The application accompanied by a draft, money order, certified bank check, or cash for one dollar and twenty-five cents, together with the last preceding certificates or other satisfactory evidence of ownership, shall be forwarded to the director.
- The fee shall be in addition to any other fee for the license registration of the vehicle. The certificate of ownership shall not be required to be renewed annually, or at any other time, except as by law provided.
- In addition to the application fee and any other fee for the license registration of a vehicle, there shall be collected from the applicant an inspection fee whenever a physical examination of the vehicle is required as a part of the vehicle licensing or titling process.
- For vehicles previously registered in any other state or country, the inspection fee shall be fifteen dollars and shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund. For all other vehicles requiring a physical

- 1 examination, the inspection fee shall be twenty dollars and shall be
- 2 deposited in the motor vehicle fund. For vehicles that have received
- 3 <u>a structural integrity inspection</u>, an additional fee of five dollars
- 4 shall be collected and shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund to
- 5 cover the costs to administer the structural integrity inspection
- 6 program.
- 7 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.12.075 and 1996 c 26 s 3 are each amended to read 8 as follows:
- 9 (1) Effective January 1, 1997, the department shall issue a unique
- 10 certificate of ownership and certificate of license registration, as
- 11 required by chapter 46.16 RCW, for vehicles that are rebuilt after
- 12 becoming a salvage vehicle. Each certificate shall conspicuously
- 13 display across its front, a word indicating that the vehicle was
- 14 rebuilt.
- 15 (2) Beginning January 1, 1997, upon inspection of a salvage vehicle
- 16 that has been rebuilt under RCW 46.12.030, the state patrol shall
- 17 securely affix or inscribe a marking at the driver's door latch pillar
- 18 indicating that the vehicle has previously been destroyed or declared
- 19 a total loss.
- 20 (3) Effective July 1, 1998, the department may not issue a
- 21 <u>certificate of ownership or registration for a salvage vehicle unless</u>
- 22 the vehicle has passed a structural integrity inspection. The
- 23 inspection is not required for flood vehicles or for recovered stolen
- 24 vehicles for which the cost of parts and labor plus the salvage value
- 25 do not make it uneconomical to repair the vehicle. This subsection
- 26 does not affect the authority of the department of labor and industries
- 27 to require or perform inspections under chapter 43.22 RCW.
- 28 (4) It is a class C felony for a person to remove the marking
- 29 prescribed in subsection (2) of this section.
- (((+4))) (5) The department and the Washington state patrol may
- 31 adopt rules as necessary to implement this section.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** By January 1, 1998, the Washington state
- 33 patrol shall present to the legislative transportation committee and
- 34 the office of financial management a progress report on the
- 35 implementation of the structural integrity inspection program,
- 36 including, but not limited to, the proposed fee schedule, other

- 2 implement the program.
