SENATE BILL 5399

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1997 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to juvenile hunting, fishing, shellfish, and
- 2 seaweed licenses; and amending RCW 77.32.101, 75.25.091, and 75.25.092.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.32.101 and 1994 c 255 s 11 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) A combination hunting and fishing license allows a resident 7 holder to hunt, and to fish for game fish throughout the state. The 8 fee for this license is twenty-nine dollars.
- 9 (2) A hunting license allows the holder to hunt throughout the 10 state. The fee for this license is fifteen dollars for residents and 11 one hundred fifty dollars for nonresidents.
- (3) A fishing license allows the holder to fish for game fish throughout the state. The fee for this license is seventeen dollars for residents ((fifteen)) eighteen years of age or older and under seventy years of age, three dollars for residents seventy years of age or older, twenty dollars for nonresidents under ((fifteen)) eighteen years of age, and forty-eight dollars for nonresidents ((fifteen))
- 18 <u>eighteen</u> years of age or older.

- 1 (4) A steelhead fishing license allows the holder of a combination 2 hunting and fishing license or a fishing license issued under this 3 section to fish for steelhead throughout the state. The fee for this 4 license is eighteen dollars.
- (5) A juvenile steelhead license allows residents under ((fifteen)) 5 eighteen years of age and nonresidents under ((fifteen)) eighteen years 6 7 of age who hold a fishing license to fish for steelhead throughout the 8 state. The fee for this license is six dollars and entitles the holder to take up to five steelhead at which time another juvenile steelhead 9 10 license may be purchased. Any person who purchases a juvenile 11 steelhead license is prohibited from purchasing a steelhead license for 12 the same calendar year.
- 13 **Sec. 2.** RCW 75.25.091 and 1994 c 255 s 3 are each amended to read 14 as follows:
- (1) A personal use food fish license is required for all persons other than residents under ((fifteen)) eighteen years of age to fish for, take, or possess food fish for personal use from state waters or offshore waters. A personal use food fish license is not required under this section to fish for, take, or possess carp, smelt, or albacore.
- 21 (2) The fees for annual personal use food fish licenses include the 22 one dollar regional fisheries enhancement surcharge imposed in RCW 23 75.50.100 and are as follows:
- 24 (a) For a resident ((fifteen)) eighteen years of age or older and 25 under seventy years of age, eight dollars;
- 26 (b) For a resident seventy years of age or older, three dollars; 27 and
- 28 (c) For a nonresident, twenty dollars.
- 29 (3) The fee for a three-consecutive-day personal use food fish 30 license is five dollars, and includes the one-dollar regional fishery 31 enhancement group surcharge imposed in RCW 75.50.100.
- 32 (4) An annual personal use food fish license is valid for a maximum 33 catch of fifteen salmon, after which another annual personal use food 34 fish license may be purchased.
- 35 (5) An annual personal use food fish license is valid for an annual 36 maximum catch of fifteen sturgeon. No person may take more than 37 fifteen sturgeon in any calendar year.

- 1 **Sec. 3.** RCW 75.25.092 and 1994 c 255 s 4 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 (1) A personal use shellfish and seaweed license is required for 4 all persons other than residents under ((fifteen)) eighteen years of 5 age to fish for, take, dig for, or possess seaweed or shellfish except 6 crawfish (Pacifastacus sp.) for personal use from state waters or 7 offshore waters including national park beaches.
- 8 (2) The fees for annual personal use shellfish and seaweed licenses 9 are:
- 10 (a) For a resident ((fifteen)) eighteen years of age or older and 11 under seventy years of age, five dollars;
- 12 (b) For a resident seventy years of age or older, three dollars; 13 and
- 14 (c) For a nonresident, twenty dollars.
- 15 (3) The fee for a three-consecutive-day personal use shellfish and 16 seaweed license is five dollars.
