- 1 AN ACT Relating to using population projections in determining
- 2 adequacy of water supply; and amending RCW 43.62.035.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.62.035 and 1995 c 162 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 The office of financial management shall determine the population
- 7 of each county of the state annually as of April 1st of each year and
- 8 on or before July 1st of each year shall file a certificate with the
- 9 secretary of state showing its determination of the population for each
- 10 county. The office of financial management also shall determine the
- 11 percentage increase in population for each county over the preceding
- 12 ten-year period, as of April 1st, and shall file a certificate with the
- 13 secretary of state by July 1st showing its determination. At least
- 14 once every ten years the office of financial management shall prepare
- 15 twenty-year growth management planning population projections required
- 16 by RCW 36.70A.110 for each county that adopts a comprehensive plan
- 17 under RCW 36.70A.040 and shall review these projections with such
- 18 counties and the cities in those counties before final adoption. The
- 19 population projections shall be accompanied by a statement from the

director of the department of ecology stating that adequate water 1 supplies exist or will be available to serve the projected population. 2 The county and its cities may provide to the office such information as 3 4 they deem relevant to the office's projection, and the office shall consider and comment on such information before adoption. 5 projection shall be expressed as a reasonable range developed within 6 7 the standard state high and low projection. The middle range shall 8 represent the office's estimate of the most likely population 9 projection for the county. If any city or county believes that a 10 projection will not accurately reflect actual population growth in a county, it may petition the office to revise the projection 11 The office shall complete the first set of ranges for 12 accordingly. 13 every county by December 31, 1995. 14

A comprehensive plan adopted or amended before December 31, 1995, shall not be considered to be in noncompliance with the twenty-year growth management planning population projection if the projection used in the comprehensive plan is in compliance with the range later adopted under this section.
