- 1 AN ACT Relating to correctional personnel training; and adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 43.101 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 The board on correctional training standards and education is
- 7 created and established. The purpose of the board is to review and
- 8 recommend to the commission programs and standards for the training and
- 9 education of correctional personnel.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 The board on correctional training standards and education consists
- 13 of fourteen members, appointed by the executive director and subject to
- 14 approval by the commission. Line staff at the working level of
- 15 correctional institutions shall be among those appointed. Members must
- 16 be selected as follows: (1) Three must be employed in the state
- 17 correctional system; (2) three must be employed in county correctional
- 18 systems; (3) two must be employed in juvenile corrections or probation,

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- 1 one at the local level and the other at the state level; (4) two must
- 2 be employed in community corrections; (5) one must represent community
- 3 colleges; (6) one must represent four-year colleges and universities;
- 4 and (7) two must be additional persons with experience and interest in
- 5 correctional training standards and education.
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 All members of the board must be appointed for terms of six years,
- 9 commencing on July 1st, and expiring on June 30th. However, of the
- 10 members first appointed four will serve for terms of two years, five
- 11 will serve for terms of four years, and five will serve for terms of
- 12 six years. A member chosen to fill a vacancy that has been created
- 13 other than by expiration of a term must be appointed for the unexpired
- 14 term of the member to be succeeded. A member may be reappointed for
- 15 additional terms.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 A member appointed as an incumbent official or because of
- 19 employment status, ceases to be a member of the board immediately upon
- 20 the termination of the holding of the qualifying office or employment.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 The board shall elect a chair and vice-chair from among its
- 24 members. A simple majority of the members of the board is a quorum.
- 25 The commission shall summon the board to its first meeting.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 27 to read as follows:
- 28 Members of the board may be paid their travel expenses in
- 29 accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- 30 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 31 to read as follows:
- The board has the following powers:
- 33 (1) To meet at such times and places as it may deem proper;
- 34 (2) To adopt bylaws for the conduct of business;

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- 1 (3) To cooperate with and secure the cooperation of any department,
- 2 agency, or instrumentality in state, county, or city government, and
- 3 commissions affected by or concerned with the business of the
- 4 commission;
- 5 (4) To do any and all things necessary or convenient to enable it
- 6 fully and adequately to perform its duties and to exercise the powers
- 7 granted to it;
- 8 (5) To advise the commission of the training and education needs of
- 9 correctional personnel;
- 10 (6) To recommend to the commission standards for the training and
- 11 education of correctional personnel;
- 12 (7) To recommend to the commission minimum curriculum standards for
- 13 all training and education programs conducted for correctional
- 14 personnel;
- 15 (8) To recommend to the commission standards for instructors of
- 16 training and education programs for correctional personnel;
- 17 (9) To recommend to the commission alternative, innovative, and
- 18 interdisciplinary training and education techniques for correctional
- 19 personnel;
- 20 (10) To review and recommend to the commission the approval of
- 21 training and education programs for correctional personnel;
- 22 (11) To monitor and evaluate training and education programs for
- 23 correctional personnel.
- 24 The board shall report to the commission at the end of each fiscal
- 25 year on the effectiveness of training and education programs for
- 26 correctional personnel.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 28 to read as follows:
- 29 For the purpose of raising the level of competence of correctional
- 30 personnel, the commission shall review the recommendations of the board
- 31 made under section 7 of this act.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW
- 33 to read as follows:
- 34 By January 1st of every odd-numbered year, the commission shall
- 35 provide a written report to the legislature addressing the following
- 36 items: (1) Status and satisfaction of service to its clients; (2)
- 37 detailed analysis of how it will maintain and update adequate

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- 1 state-of-the-art training models and their delivery in the most
- 2 cost-effective and efficient manner; and (3) fiscal data projecting its
- 3 current and future funding requirements.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** If any provision of this act or its
- 5 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 6 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 7 persons or circumstances is not affected.

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
