- AN ACT Relating to financial aid; and amending RCW 28B.10.808.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.10.808 and 1991 c 164 s 4 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- 5 In awarding grants, the commission shall proceed substantially as
- 6 follows: ((PROVIDED, That nothing contained herein shall be construed
- 7 to prevent the commission, in the exercise of its sound discretion,
- 8 from following another procedure when the best interest of the program
- 9 so dictates:))
- 10 (1) The commission shall annually select the financial aid award
- 11 winners from among Washington residents applying for student financial
- 12 aid who have been ranked according to financial need as determined by
- 13 the amount of the family contribution and other considerations brought
- 14 to the commission's attention.
- 15 (2) The financial need of the highest ranked students shall be met
- 16 by grants depending upon the evaluation of financial need until the
- 17 total allocation has been disbursed. Funds from grants which are
- 18 declined, forfeited or otherwise unused shall be reawarded until
- 19 dispersed.

- (3) A grant may be renewed until the course of study is completed, 1 but not for more than an additional four academic years beyond the 2 first year of the award. These shall not be required to be consecutive 3 4 Qualifications for renewal will include maintaining satisfactory academic standing toward completion of the course of 5 study, and continued eligibility as determined by the commission. 6 7 Should the recipient terminate his or her enrollment for any reason 8 during the academic year, the unused portion of the grant shall be 9 returned to the state educational grant fund by the institution 10 according to the institution's own policy for issuing refunds, except as provided in RCW 28B.10.8081. 11
 - (4) In computing financial need the commission shall determine a maximum student expense budget allowance, not to exceed an amount equal to the total maximum student expense budget at the public institutions plus the current average state appropriation per student for operating expense in the public institutions.
- 17 (5) To the extent funds are available, the award shall be provided
 18 to persons with incomes that do not exceed sixty percent of the median
 19 family income. The amount of the need grant shall cover the cost of
 20 tuition at the institution of higher education the student attends, but
 21 shall not exceed the undergraduate resident tuition charged at the
 22 state research institutions.
