- 1 AN ACT Relating to the use of physical force against intruders;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 9A.16 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature recognizes that the citizens
- 5 of the state of Washington have a right to expect absolute safety
- 6 within their own homes.
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 9A.16 RCW
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (1) Notwithstanding RCW 9A.16.020 and 9A.16.050, an occupant of a
- 10 dwelling is justified in using any degree of physical force within the
- 11 dwelling, including deadly physical force, against another person when:
- 12 (a) That other person has made an unlawful entry into the dwelling;
- 13 (b) The occupant has reason to believe that the other person has
- 14 committed a crime in the dwelling in addition to the uninvited entry,
- 15 or is committing or intends to commit a crime against a person or
- 16 property in addition to the uninvited entry; and
- 17 (c) The occupant has reason to believe that the other person might
- 18 use physical force against any occupant.

(2) An occupant of a dwelling using physical force, including deadly physical force, in accordance with subsection (1) of this section is immune from criminal prosecution for the use of such force.
