SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6003

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1997 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to Sue Durrant-Seattle Reign license plates;
- 2 amending RCW 46.16.301 and 46.16.313; adding a new section to chapter
- 3 46.04 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 46.16 RCW; adding a new
- 4 section to chapter 28A.300 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature recognizes that the
- 7 opportunities, and hence the participation level, of school-age girls
- 8 in athletics is less than that of boys. Further, the legislature
- 9 recognizes that the Seattle Reign, Washington state's first women's
- 10 professional basketball team, has just completed an inspiring inaugural
- 11 season. To aid the cause of girls in sports, the Sue Durrant-Seattle
- 12 Reign license plate is established.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 "Sue Durrant-Seattle Reign license plates" means license plates
- 16 that display a symbol of the Seattle Reign, the state's first
- 17 professional women's basketball team.

- 1 Sec. 3. RCW 46.16.301 and 1995 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 102 are each 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (1) The department may create, design, and issue special license 4 plates that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized license 5 plates for motor vehicles required to display two motor vehicle license 6 plates, excluding vehicles registered under chapter 46.87 RCW, upon 7 terms and conditions established by the department. The special plates 8 may:
 - (a) Denote the age or type of vehicle; or

- (b) Denote special activities or interests; or
- 11 (c) Denote the status, or contribution or sacrifice for the United 12 States, the state of Washington, or the citizens of the state of 13 Washington, of a registered owner of that vehicle; ((or))
- (d) Display a depiction of the name and mascot or symbol of a state university, regional university, or state college as defined in RCW 28B.10.016; or
- 17 <u>(e) Display a symbol of the Seattle Reign, the state's first</u>
 18 professional women's basketball team.
- 19 (2) The department shall create, design, and issue a special baseball stadium license plate that may be used in lieu of regular or 20 personalized license plates for motor vehicles required to display two 21 motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under 22 chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions established by the 23 24 department. The special plates shall commemorate the construction of 25 a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485. The department shall 26 also issue to each recipient of a special baseball stadium license 27 plate a certificate of participation in the construction of the baseball stadium. 28
- 29 (3) The department has the sole discretion to determine whether or 30 not to create, design, or issue any series of special license plates, 31 other than the special baseball stadium license plate under subsection (2) of this section, and whether any interest or status merits the 32 issuance of a series of special license plates. 33 In making this determination, the department shall consider whether or not an interest 34 or status contributes or has contributed significantly to the public 35 health, safety, or welfare of the citizens of the United States or of 36 37 this state or to their significant benefit, or whether the interest or status is recognized by the United States, this state, or other states, 38 39 in other settings or contexts. The department may also consider the

- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW

- 8 Beginning January 1, 1998, the department shall issue license

- 10 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.16.313 and 1996 c 165 s 506 are each amended to 11 read as follows:
- 12 (1) The department may establish a fee for each type of special

- 26 and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus
- 20 and correction expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus
- 27 the cost of plate production, shall be remitted to the custody of the
- 28 state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state
- 29 treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license

the cost of plate production, shall be distributed to a county for the 1 2 purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 3 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while 4 the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, 5 the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund. 6 7 (4) Until June 30, 1997, in addition to all fees and taxes required 8 to be paid upon application, registration, and renewal registration of 9 a motor vehicle, the holder of a special baseball stadium license plate 10 shall pay a fee of forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this 11 subsection for license plate administration and collection expenses 12 13 incurred by it. - 34 (1) The sports participation grant program is created. The purpose
- 35 of the program is to provide grants to school districts for programs
- 36 designed to increase girls' participation in sports. The
- 37 superintendent of public instruction shall administer the program and
- 38 develop criteria for the program. The criteria must include but not be

limited to: (a) Requiring grant applicants to hold a public hearing 1 about the proposed program; (b) including in the grant application a 2 finding that there has been a historical discrepancy in participation 3 4 of girls in sports; and (c) involving parents in designing the program. If the superintendent of public instruction finds girls are no longer 5 underrepresented in sports, the superintendent may award the grants to 6 7 school districts to improve the participation rates in sports of other 8 underrepresented groups.

(2) The Sue Durrant-Seattle Reign license plate fund is established in the custody of the state treasurer for all receipts, except as provided in RCW 46.16.313(5), from Sue Durrant-Seattle Reign license plates. The proceeds shall be used to fund the grant program under subsection (1) of this section. The state treasurer shall remit the proceeds on a quarterly basis to the superintendent of public instruction.
