## SENATE BILL 6036

By Senators Schow, Deccio, Anderson, Rasmussen, Horn and Oke Read first time 03/03/97. Referred to Committee on Commerce & Labor.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to on-the-job training for undertrained,
- 2 underemployed, or unemployed persons; amending RCW 19.28.510,
- 3 19.28.520, 19.28.530, and 39.12.021; adding new sections to chapter
- 4 28C.04 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the standard of
- 7 living, the quality of life, and the future well-being of the people of
- 8 the state depend upon improving the productivity and competitive
- 9 position of Washington businesses. The legislature further finds that
- 10 graduates of the state's secondary schools are not prepared to compete
- 11 in the emerging world economy and that employers in the state have
- 12 openings for skilled workers that cannot be filled because of a lack of
- 13 skilled applicants.

State of Washington

- 14 It is the purpose of this chapter to strengthen the state's economy
- 15 by expanding on-the-job training opportunities for undertrained,
- 16 underemployed, or unemployed persons and by supporting efforts to
- 17 increase the supply of skilled workers. It is the intent of the
- 18 legislature to enhance the career options, qualifications for
- 19 employment, and earning potential of unskilled workers by building an

- 1 industry-driven, competency-based on-the-job training system that
- 2 integrates existing academic, vocational, and technical education
- 3 programs with worksite training.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The jobs for the future program is hereby established to provide undertrained, underemployed, and unemployed persons with on-the-job training opportunities.
- 7 (2) The state board for community and technical colleges shall 8 establish an on-the-job training council to operate the jobs for the 9 future partnership. The board shall provide such technical assistance 10 and staff support as is necessary to carry out the work of the council. 11 The board shall establish rules regarding the terms of office of 12 council members and the filling of vacancies on the council.
- 13 (3) The council shall consist of nine voting members selected by 14 the board as follows: Three representatives of business selected from six nominations provided by a state-wide business organization 15 16 representing a cross-section of industries, both large and small; three representatives of labor selected from nominations provided by a state-17 18 wide labor organization representing workers from a cross-section of 19 industries, both large and small; the director of a private vocational or trade school; the president of a community or technical college; and 20 the director of the state board for community and technical colleges. 21 Each voting member may appoint a designee to function in his or her 22 23 place with the right to vote. A member may vote by proxy for another 24 member who is not present if the present member has written 25 authorization from the absent member to cast such vote. The council 26 shall establish the procedures by which it will carry out its duties under chapter . . ., Laws of 1997 (this act). 27
  - (4) The council shall:

28

- 29 (a) Approve occupation-specific competency standards developed in 30 concert with industry, labor, and vocational and technical education 31 professionals;
- 32 (b) Approve on-the-job training projects for the jobs for the 33 future partnership consistent with the provisions of section 3 of this 34 act; and
- 35 (c) Approve the amount per trainee that is provided via the grant 36 allowed under section 4 of this act to offset the costs of training.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. On-the-job training projects selected by the on-the-job training council for the jobs for the future partnership must demonstrate:
- 4 (1) The collaboration of employers, employees, and educational 5 institutions in the design of the training;
- 6 (2) That the occupation for which training is being provided is a 7 labor demand occupation and that trainees will, upon completion of the 8 training, meet the council-approved competency standards for the 9 occupation for which they are being trained;
- 10 (3) That trainees will not displace currently employed workers or 11 replace laid-off workers;
- 12 (4) That the training may not be for employment with a skill level and complexity too low to merit training;
- 14 (5) That the duration of on-the-job training may not exceed the 15 duration indicated by the specific vocational preparation code 16 developed by the United States department of labor for the occupation 17 for which the training is provided and shall in no case exceed twenty-18 six weeks;
- 19 (6) That at least seventy-five percent of the trainees in the 20 project are undertrained, underemployed, or unemployed and that a 21 minimum of twenty-five percent of the trainees in the project are 22 receiving temporary assistance for needy families or have received such 23 assistance or similar public assistance from the state in the previous 24 twenty-four months;
- (7) That the on-the-job training is accompanied, concurrently or otherwise, by an appropriate amount of classroom-based vocational training, remedial education, or both; and
- 28 (8) Compliance with such other requirements as the council shall 29 establish.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. On-the-job training projects approved for operation by the on-the-job training council are eligible for a grant to offset the training costs associated with the project. The grant amount allowed is equal to either the amount per trainee approved by the council or one thousand five hundred dollars, whichever is less, times the number of trainees in the project.
- 36 **Sec. 5.** RCW 19.28.510 and 1996 c 241 s 6 are each amended to read 37 as follows:

p. 3 SB 6036

(1) No person may engage in the electrical construction trade without having a current journeyman electrician certificate of competency or a current specialty electrician certificate of competency issued by the department in accordance with this chapter. Electrician certificate of competency specialties include, but are not limited to: Residential, domestic appliances, pump and irrigation, limited energy system, signs, and nonresidential maintenance.

- 8 (2) A person who is indentured in an apprenticeship program 9 approved under chapter 49.04 RCW for the electrical construction trade 10 or who is learning the electrical construction trade may work in the electrical construction trade if supervised by a certified journeyman 11 12 electrician or a certified specialty electrician in that electrician's 13 specialty. All apprentices and individuals learning the electrical construction trade shall obtain an electrical training certificate from 14 15 the department. The certificate shall authorize the holder to learn 16 the electrical construction trade while under the direct supervision of 17 a journeyman electrician or a specialty electrician working in his or her specialty. The holder of the electrical training certificate shall 18 19 renew the certificate annually. At the time of renewal, the holder shall provide the department with an accurate list of the holder's 20 employers in the electrical construction industry for the previous year 21 and the number of hours worked for each employer. An annual fee shall 22 be charged for the issuance or renewal of the certificate. 23 24 department shall set the fee by rule. The fee shall cover but not 25 exceed the cost of administering and enforcing the trainee 26 certification and supervision requirements of this chapter. Apprentices and individuals learning the electrical construction trade 27 shall have their electrical training certificates in their possession 28 29 at all times that they are performing electrical work. They shall show 30 their certificates to an authorized representative of the department at 31 the representative's request.
  - (3) Any person who has been issued an electrical training certificate under this chapter may work if that person is under supervision. Supervision shall consist of a person being on the same job site and under the control of either a journeyman electrician or an appropriate specialty electrician who has an applicable certificate of competency issued under this chapter. Either a journeyman electrician or an appropriate specialty electrician shall be on the same job site as the noncertified individual for a minimum of seventy-five percent of

- each working day unless otherwise provided in this chapter. The ratio of noncertified individuals to certified journeymen or specialty electricians working on a job site shall be:
- 4 (a) From September 1, 1979, through December 31, 1982, not more 5 than three noncertified electricians working on any one job site for 6 every certified journeyman or specialty electrician;
- 7 (b) Effective January 1, 1983, not more than two noncertified 8 individuals working on any one job site for every specialty electrician 9 or journeyman electrician working as a specialty electrician;
- 10 (c) Effective January 1, 1983, not more than one noncertified 11 individual working on any one job site for every certified journeyman 12 electrician.
- The ratio requirements do not apply to ((a)) trade schools and their programs in the electrical construction trade ((established during 1946)) if the programs are approved by the licensing process of the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW or if the schools are approved under chapter 28B.85 RCW.
  - An individual who has a current training certificate and who has successfully completed or is currently enrolled in an approved apprenticeship program or in a technical or trade school program in the electrical construction trade in a school approved by the commission for vocational education, may work without direct on-site supervision during the last six months of meeting the practical experience requirements of this chapter.
- 25 (4) The electrical contractor shall accurately verify and attest to 26 the electrical trainee hours worked by electrical trainees on behalf of 27 the electrical contractor.
- 28 **Sec. 6.** RCW 19.28.520 and 1980 c 30 s 3 are each amended to read 29 as follows:
- Any person desiring to be issued a certificate of competency as provided in this chapter shall deliver evidence in a form prescribed by the department affirming that said person has met the qualifications required under RCW 19.28.530((, as now or hereafter amended)). An electrician from another jurisdiction applying for a certificate of competency must provide evidence in a form prescribed by the department affirming that the person has the equivalent qualifications to those

- 1 **Sec. 7.** RCW 19.28.530 and 1988 c 81 s 13 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 (1) Upon receipt of the application, the department shall review 4 the application and determine whether the applicant is eligible to take 5 an examination for the journeyman or specialty certificate of 6 competency.
- 7 <u>(a)</u> To be eligible to take the examination for a journeyman 8 certificate the applicant must have:
- 9 (i) Worked in the electrical construction trade for a minimum of four years employed full time, of which two years shall be in 10 industrial or commercial electrical installation under the supervision 11 of a journeyman electrician ((certified under this chapter)) and not 12 13 more than a total of two years in all specialties under the supervision of a journeyman electrician ((certified under this chapter)) or an 14 15 appropriate specialty electrician ((certified under this chapter or 16 have)); or
  - (ii) Successfully completed an apprenticeship program approved under chapter 49.04 RCW for the electrical construction trade or successfully completed a technical or trade school program in the electrical construction trade in a program that is licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW or in a school that is approved under chapter 28B.85 RCW.
- 23 <u>(b)</u> To be eligible to take the examination to become a specialty 24 electrician the applicant shall have:
- 25 <u>(i)</u> Worked in that specialty of the electrical construction trade, 26 under the supervision of a journeyman electrician ((certified under 27 this chapter)) or an appropriate specialty electrician ((certified 28 under this chapter)), for a minimum of two years employed full 29 time((-,)); or ((have))
- 30 (ii) Successfully completed an approved apprenticeship program 31 under chapter 49.04 RCW for the applicant's specialty in the electrical 32 construction trade(( $\div$ 
  - Before January 1, 1984, applicants for nonresidential maintenance specialty licenses are eligible to become nonresidential maintenance specialists upon certification to the department that they have the equivalent of two years full time experience in that specialty field. Persons applying before January 1, 1984, for a journeyman certificate are eligible to take the examination to become journeymen until July 1, 1984, upon certification to the department that they have the

- equivalent of five years full-time experience in nonresidential
  maintenance, of which two years shall be in industrial electrical
  installation)) or successfully completed a technical or trade school
  program in the applicant's specialty in the electrical construction
  trade in a program that is licensed by the work force training and
  education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW or in a school
  that is approved under chapter 28B.85 RCW.
- 8 (c) Any applicant who has successfully completed a two-year 9 technical or trade school program in the electrical construction trade, 10 in a program that is licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW, or in a school that is 11 approved ((by the commission for vocational education))under chapter 12 13 28B.85 RCW, may substitute up to two years of the technical or trade school program for two years of work experience under a journeyman 14 15 electrician. The applicant shall obtain the additional two years of 16 work experience required in industrial or commercial electrical installation prior to the beginning, or after the completion, of the 17 technical or trade school program. Any applicant who has received 18 19 training in the electrical construction trade in the armed service of 20 the United States may be eligible to take the examination for the certificate of competency. ((Any applicant who is a graduate of a 21 trade school program in the electrical construction trade that was 22 23 established during 1946 is eligible to take the examination for the 24 certificate of competency.))
- 25 <u>(d)</u> No other requirement for eligibility may be imposed.
- 26 (2) The department shall establish reasonable rules for the 27 examinations to be given applicants for certificates of competency. In 28 establishing the rules, the department shall consult with the board. 29 Upon determination that the applicant is eligible to take the 30 examination, the department shall so notify the applicant, indicating 31 the time and place for taking the examination.
- 32 **Sec. 8.** RCW 39.12.021 and 1989 c 12 s 8 are each amended to read 33 as follows:
- Apprentice workers employed upon public works projects for whom an apprenticeship or trainee agreement has been registered and approved with the state apprenticeship council pursuant to chapter 49.04 RCW or the federal bureau of apprenticeship and training, must be paid at least the prevailing hourly rate for an apprentice of that trade. Any

- 1 worker for whom an apprenticeship or trainee agreement has not been
- 2 registered and approved ((by the state apprenticeship council)) shall
- 3 be considered to be a fully qualified journey level worker, and,
- 4 therefore, shall be paid at the prevailing hourly rate for journey
- 5 level workers.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** Sections 2 through 4 of this act are each 7 added to chapter 28C.04 RCW.
