- 1 AN ACT Relating to drug offenses in background checks; and amending
- 2 RCW 43.43.830.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.43.830 and 1996 c 178 s 12 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout RCW 43.43.830 through 43.43.840.
- 8 (1) "Applicant" means:
- 9 (a) Any prospective employee who will or may have unsupervised 10 access to children under sixteen years of age or developmentally 11 disabled persons or vulnerable adults during the course of his or her 12 employment or involvement with the business or organization;
- (b) Any prospective volunteer who will have regularly scheduled unsupervised access to children under sixteen years of age, developmentally disabled persons, or vulnerable adults during the
- 16 course of his or her employment or involvement with the business or
- 17 organization under circumstances where such access will or may involve
- 18 groups of (i) five or fewer children under twelve years of age, (ii)

three or fewer children between twelve and sixteen years of age, (iii)
developmentally disabled persons, or (iv) vulnerable adults; or

- (c) Any prospective adoptive parent, as defined in RCW 26.33.020.
- 4 (2) "Business or organization" means a business or organization
  5 licensed in this state, any agency of the state, or other governmental
  6 entity, that educates, trains, treats, supervises, houses, or provides
  7 recreation to developmentally disabled persons, vulnerable adults, or
  8 children under sixteen years of age, including but not limited to
  9 public housing authorities, school districts, and educational service
  10 districts.
- (3) "Civil adjudication" means a specific court finding of sexual 11 abuse or exploitation or physical abuse in a dependency action under 12 RCW 13.34.040 or in a domestic relations action under Title 26 RCW. In 13 14 the case of vulnerable adults, civil adjudication means a specific 15 court finding of abuse or financial exploitation in a protection proceeding under chapter 74.34 RCW. It does not include administrative 16 proceedings. The term "civil adjudication" is further limited to court 17 findings that identify as the perpetrator of the abuse a named 18 19 individual, over the age of eighteen years, who was a party to the dependency or dissolution proceeding or was a respondent in a 20 protection proceeding in which the finding was made and who contested 21 the allegation of abuse or exploitation. 22
  - (4) "Conviction record" means "conviction record" information as defined in RCW 10.97.030(3) relating to a crime against children or other persons committed by either an adult or a juvenile. It does not include a conviction for an offense that has been the subject of an expungement, pardon, annulment, certificate of rehabilitation, or other equivalent procedure based on a finding of the rehabilitation of the person convicted, or a conviction that has been the subject of a pardon, annulment, or other equivalent procedure based on a finding of innocence. It does include convictions for offenses for which the defendant received a deferred or suspended sentence, unless the record has been expunged according to law.
- (5) "Crime against children or other persons" means a conviction of any of the following offenses: Aggravated murder; first or second degree murder; first or second degree kidnaping; first, second, or third degree assault; first, second, or third degree assault of a child; first, second, or third degree rape; first, second, or third degree rape of a child; first or second degree robbery; first degree

- arson; first degree burglary; first or second degree manslaughter; 1 first or second degree extortion; indecent liberties; incest; vehicular 2 homicide; first degree promoting prostitution; communication with a 3 4 minor; unlawful imprisonment; simple assault; sexual exploitation of minors; first or second degree criminal mistreatment; child abuse or 5 neglect as defined in RCW 26.44.020; first or second degree custodial 6 7 interference; malicious harassment; first, second, or third degree 8 child molestation; first or second degree sexual misconduct with a 9 minor; first or second degree rape of a child; patronizing a juvenile 10 prostitute; child abandonment; promoting pornography; selling or distributing erotic material to a minor; custodial assault; violation 11 child abuse restraining order; child buying 12 or selling; 13 prostitution; felony indecent exposure; criminal abandonment; manufacture, delivery, or possession with intent to manufacture or 14 15 deliver, of a controlled substance; or any of these crimes as they may 16 be renamed in the future.
- 17 (6) "Crimes relating to financial exploitation" means a conviction 18 for first, second, or third degree extortion; first, second, or third 19 degree theft; first or second degree robbery; forgery; or any of these 20 crimes as they may be renamed in the future.
- (7) "Disciplinary board final decision" means any final decision issued by a disciplining authority under chapter 18.130 RCW or the secretary of the department of health for the following businesses or professions:
- 25 (a) Chiropractic;
- 26 (b) Dentistry;
- 27 (c) Dental hygiene;
- 28 (d) Massage;
- 29 (e) Midwifery;
- 30 (f) Naturopathy;
- 31 (g) Osteopathic medicine and surgery;
- 32 (h) Physical therapy;
- 33 (i) Physicians;
- 34 (j) Practical nursing;
- 35 (k) Registered nursing; and
- 36 (1) Psychology.
- "Disciplinary board final decision," for real estate brokers and salespersons, means any final decision issued by the director of the department of licensing for real estate brokers and salespersons.

- 1 (8) "Unsupervised" means not in the presence of:
- 2 (a) Another employee or volunteer from the same business or 3 organization as the applicant; or
- 4 (b) Any relative or guardian of any of the children or 5 developmentally disabled persons or vulnerable adults to which the 6 applicant has access during the course of his or her employment or 7 involvement with the business or organization.
- 8 (9) "Vulnerable adult" means "vulnerable adult" as defined in 9 chapter 74.34 RCW, except that for the purposes of requesting and 10 receiving background checks pursuant to RCW 43.43.832, it shall also include adults of any age who lack the functional, mental, or physical ability to care for themselves.
- (10) "Financial exploitation" means the illegal or improper use of a vulnerable adult or that adult's resources for another person's profit or advantage.
- 16 (11) "Agency" means any person, firm, partnership, association, 17 corporation, or facility which receives, provides services to, houses 18 or otherwise cares for vulnerable adults.
