- AN ACT Relating to contempt of court; amending RCW 7.21.030; and
- 2 prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 7.21.030 and 1989 c 373 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The court may initiate a proceeding to impose a remedial 7 sanction on its own motion or on the motion of a person aggrieved by a
- 8 contempt of court in the proceeding to which the contempt is related.
- 9 Except as provided in RCW 7.21.050, the court, after notice and
- 10 hearing, may impose a remedial sanction authorized by this chapter.
- 11 (2) If the court finds that the person has failed or refused to
- 12 perform an act that is yet within the person's power to perform, the 13 court may find the person in contempt of court and impose one or more
- 14 of the following remedial sanctions:
- 15 (a) Imprisonment if the contempt of court is of a type defined in
- 16 RCW 7.21.010(1) (b) through (d). The imprisonment may extend only so
- 17 long as it serves a coercive purpose but in no event for more than a
- 18 total of one hundred eighty days for each violation. A person may not

- be imprisoned more than once for the same or a continuing violation of
 a court decree or order.
- 3 (b) A forfeiture not to exceed two thousand dollars for each day 4 the contempt of court continues.
- 5 (c) An order designed to ensure compliance with a prior order of 6 the court.
- 7 (d) Any other remedial sanction other than the sanctions specified 8 in (a) through (c) of this subsection if the court expressly finds that 9 those sanctions would be ineffectual to terminate a continuing contempt 10 of court.
- 11 (3) The court may, in addition to the remedial sanctions set forth 12 in subsection (2) of this section, order a person found in contempt of 13 court to pay a party for any losses suffered by the party as a result 14 of the contempt and any costs incurred in connection with the contempt 15 proceeding, including reasonable attorney's fees.
