16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** In creating the department of cultural resources, the legislature recognizes that responsibilities for heritage and arts-related concerns are fragmented among a variety of

- 1 agencies in state government with limited statutory opportunities for
- 2 coordination among those agencies. The department of cultural
- 3 resources will provide a comprehensive, coordinated state-wide
- 4 heritage and arts program for the citizens of this state. It will
- 5 implement the state's strategic plan as formulated by the cultural
- 6 resources commission; minimize or eliminate duplication of effort,
- 7 conflicts, and program gaps; create and enhance existing opportunities
- 8 for cooperation and collaboration; promote consistency of state
- 9 heritage and arts-related actions; establish an integrated focus for
- 10 the state-wide heritage and arts program to make it understandable and
- 11 visible to the general public; establish a system for development of
- 12 state-wide goals; and develop a method for setting priorities among
- 13 those goals.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The cultural resources commission is created.
- 16 (2) The commission has the following purposes:
- 17 (a) To nominate three candidates to the governor for director of 18 the department;
- 19 (b) To develop a strategic plan for guiding the state's management
- 20 of its cultural and arts-related resources;
- 21 (c) To evaluate the performance of the department and the
- 22 department's implementation of the strategic plan; and
- 23 (d) To make recommendations to the director concerning the budget
- 24 of the department.
- 25 (3) Staffing of the commission comes from the department.
- 26 (4) Except for initial terms, members shall serve for terms of four
- 27 years. Terms of initial members shall be staggered.
- 28 (5) Members shall be appointed as follows:
- 29 (a) The governor shall appoint eight citizen members to the
- 30 commission. Members of the commission shall select one of the citizen
- 31 members to be chair;
- 32 (b) There shall be four legislative members, one from each of the
- 33 two major caucuses in the senate and the house of representatives,
- 34 selected by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of
- 35 representatives, as appropriate;
- 36 (c) One member each from the board of the eastern Washington state
- 37 historical society and the Washington state historical society,
- 38 selected by the respective board;

- 1 (d) One member from the Washington state arts commission, selected 2 by the Washington state arts commission;
- 3 (e) One member of the advisory council on historic preservation 4 established in RCW 27.34.250 (as recodified by this act); and
 - (f) The director, who shall be an ex officio, nonvoting member.

- 6 (6) Citizen members shall receive per diem and travel expenses in 7 accordance with RCW 43.03.050, 43.03.060, and 43.03.240.
- 8 (7) The commission shall act collectively in harmony with recorded 9 resolutions or motions adopted by majority vote of the membership.
- 10 The commission shall develop a strategic NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. plan to be implemented by the director to achieve a comprehensive, 11 12 coordinated, state-wide heritage and arts program for the citizens of the state. The strategic plan shall include but not be limited to 13 14 proposals to enhance and make more effective state assistance to 15 heritage and arts organizations; strategies to integrate department's programs into other state agencies' programs; 16 the incorporation of heritage, arts, and historic preservation into 17 18 revitalization and economic development plans; and estimates of the 19 future growth of state-funded cultural, historic, arts, and scientific facilities to plan better for the functions these facilities serve. 20
- 21 **Sec. 4.** RCW 27.34.020 and 1995 c 399 s 13 are each amended to read 22 as follows:
- Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter:
- 25 (1) "Advisory council" means the advisory council on historic 26 preservation.
- (2) <u>"Amateur society" means any organization composed primarily of</u>
 persons who are not professional archaeologists, whose primary interest
 is in the archaeological resources of the state, and which has been
 certified in writing by two professional archaeologists.
- 31 (3) "Archaeological object" means an object that comprises the 32 physical evidence of an indigenous and subsequent culture including 33 material remains of past human life including monuments, symbols, 34 tools, facilities, and technological byproducts.
- 35 <u>(4) "Archaeological site" means a geographic locality in</u> 36 <u>Washington, including but not limited to, submerged and submersible</u>

 2 contains archaeological objects.
- 3 (5) "Commission" means the cultural resources commission.
- 4 <u>(6)</u> "Department" means the department of ((community, trade, and 5 economic development)) cultural resources.
- 6 ((\(\frac{(3)}{3}\))) (7) "Director" means the director of ((\(\frac{community, trade,}{3}\)) and economic development)) the department.
- 8 (((4))) (8) "Federal act" means the national historic preservation 9 act of 1966 (Public Law 89-655; 80 Stat. 915).
- 10 ((5) "Heritage council" means the Washington state heritage 11 council.
- 12 (6))) (9) "Historic" means peoples and cultures who are known
- 13 through written documents in their own or other languages. As applied
- 14 to underwater archaeological resources, the term historic includes only
- 15 those properties that are listed in or eligible for listing in the
- 16 Washington state register of historic places or the national register
- 17 of historic places as defined in the national historic preservation act

- 20 (10) "Historic archaeological resources" means those properties
- 21 that are listed in or eligible for listing in the Washington state

- 23 as defined in the national historic preservation act of 1966 (Title 1,
- 24 Sec. 101, P. L. 89-665; 80 Stat. 915; 16 U.S.C. Sec. 470).
- 25 (11) "Historic preservation" includes the protection,
- 26 rehabilitation, restoration, identification, scientific excavation, and
- 27 reconstruction of districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects
- 28 significant in American and Washington state history, architecture,
- 29 archaeology, or culture.
- 30 $((\frac{7}{}))$ (12) "Office" means the office of archaeology and historic
- 31 preservation within the department.
- 32 (((8))) <u>(13) "Prehistoric" means peoples and cultures who are</u>
- 33 unknown through contemporaneous written documents in any language.
- 34 (14) "Preservation officer" means the state historic preservation
- 35 officer as provided for in RCW 27.34.210 (as recodified by this act).
- (((9))) (15) "Professional archaeologist" means a person who has
- 37 met the educational, training, and experience requirements of the
- 38 society of professional archaeologists.

- (16) "Project" means programs leading to the preservation for 1 public benefit of historical properties, whether by state and local 2 governments or other public bodies, or private organizations or 3 4 individuals, including the acquisition of title or interests in, and the development of, any district, site, building, structure, or object 5 that is significant in American and Washington state history, 6 architecture, archaeology, or culture, and property used in connection 7 8 therewith, or for its development.
- 9 $((\frac{10}{10}))$ (17) "State historical agencies" means the state 10 historical societies and the office of archaeology and historic 11 preservation within the department.
- $((\frac{11}{11}))$ (18) "State historical societies" means the Washington state historical society and the eastern Washington state historical society.
- ((12) "Cultural resource management plan" means a comprehensive plan which identifies and organizes information on the state of Washington's historic, archaeological, and architectural resources into a set of management criteria, and which is to be used for producing reliable decisions, recommendations, and advice relative to the identification, evaluation, and protection of these resources.))
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** There is created a department of state government to be known as the department of cultural resources. The department is vested with all powers and duties transferred to it under this chapter and such other powers and duties as may be authorized by law.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The executive head and appointing authority of the department is the director. The director shall be appointed by 27 28 the governor, with the consent of the senate, and shall serve at the pleasure of the governor. The director shall be paid a salary to be 29 fixed by the governor in accordance with RCW 43.03.040. If a vacancy 30 31 occurs in the position while the senate is not in session, the governor 32 shall make a temporary appointment until the next meeting of the 33 senate.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** It is the intent of the legislature wherever possible to place the internal affairs of the department under the control of the director in order that the director may institute

- $1\,$ therein the flexible, alert, and intelligent management of its business
- 2 that changing contemporary circumstances require. Therefore, whenever
- 3 the director's authority is not specifically limited by law, the
- 4 director has complete charge and supervisory powers over the
- 5 department. The director may create such administrative structures as
- 6 the director considers appropriate, except as otherwise specified by
- 7 law. The director may employ such assistants and personnel as
- 8 necessary for the general administration of the department. This
- 9 employment shall be in accordance with the state civil service law,
- 10 chapter 41.06 RCW, except as otherwise provided.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** The department shall initially be subdivided
- 12 into three divisions, including a division of administration, a
- 13 division of museums, and a division of community services. Except as
- 14 otherwise specified or as federal requirements may differently require,
- 15 these divisions or their successors shall be established and organized
- 16 in accordance with plans to be prepared by the director. In preparing
- 17 such plans, the director shall endeavor to promote efficient public
- 18 management, to improve programs, and to take full advantage of the
- 19 economies, both fiscal and administrative, to be gained from the
- 20 consolidation of functions and agencies under this chapter.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** The director shall appoint a deputy director
- 22 and such assistant directors as may be needed to administer the
- 23 department. The deputy director shall have charge and general
- 24 supervision of the department in the absence or disability of the
- 25 director and, in case of a vacancy in the office of director, shall
- 26 continue in charge of the department until a successor is appointed and
- 27 qualified, or until the governor makes a temporary appointment.
- 28 The director shall execute and implement the biennial operating
- 29 budget for the operation of the department in accordance with chapter
- 30 43.88 RCW and with legislative appropriation and in such manner as
- 31 prescribed therein.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** Any power or duty vested in or transferred
- 33 to the director by law or executive order may be delegated by the
- 34 director to the deputy director or to any other assistant or
- 35 subordinate; but the director shall be responsible for the official
- 36 acts of the officers and employees of the department.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 11. The director may exercise the governor's authority to appoint such advisory committees or councils as may be required by any federal legislation as a condition to the receipt of federal funds by the department. The director may also exercise the governor's authority to appoint state-wide committees or councils on such subject matters as are or come within the department's responsibilities.

8 Members of such state advisory committees or councils may be paid 9 their travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 12. In furtherance of the policy of the state 10 11 to cooperate with the federal government in all of the programs under 12 the jurisdiction of the department, such rules as may become necessary to entitle the state to participate in federal funds may be adopted 13 14 under chapter 34.05 RCW, unless expressly prohibited by law. 15 internal reorganization carried out under the terms of this chapter 16 shall meet federal requirements that are a necessary condition to state receipt of federal funds. Any section or provision of law dealing with 17 18 the department that may be susceptible to more than one construction 19 shall be interpreted in favor of the construction most likely to comply with federal laws entitling this state to receive federal funds for the 20 various programs of the department. If any law dealing with the 21 department is ruled to be in conflict with federal requirements that 22 23 are a prescribed condition of the allocation of federal funds to the 24 state, or to any departments or agencies thereof, the conflicting part 25 is declared to be inoperative solely to the extent of the conflict.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 13.** A new section is added to chapter 41.06 RCW to read as follows:

In addition to the exemptions under RCW 41.06.070, the provisions of this chapter shall not apply in the department of cultural resources to the director, the director's personal secretary, the deputy director, all division directors and assistant directors, and one confidential secretary for each of these officers.

- (c) If any question arises as to the transfer of any personnel, funds, books, documents, records, papers, files, equipment, or other tangible property used or held in the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties and functions transferred, the director of financial management shall make a determination as to the proper allocation and certify the same to the state agencies concerned.
 - (2) All employees of the department of community, trade, and economic development, the Washington state historical society, the eastern Washington state historical society, the office of archeology and historic preservation, or the arts commission employed on matters relating to the functions transferred by this section are transferred to the jurisdiction of the department of cultural resources. All employees classified under chapter 41.06 RCW, the state civil service law, are assigned to the department of cultural resources to perform their usual duties upon the same terms as formerly, without any loss of
