1 AN ACT Relating to creation of a department of cultural resources;
2 amending RCW 27.34.020, 43.17.020, 27.34.070, 27.34.080, 27.34.230,
3 43.46.015, 43.46.040, 43.46.045, 43.46.050, 43.46.055, 43.46.060, and
4 43.46.070; reenacting and amending RCW 43.17.010; adding new sections
5 to chapter 43.46 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 41.06 RCW;
6 creating a new section; recodifying RCW 27.34.010, 27.34.020,
7 27.34.060, 27.34.070, 27.34.075, 27.34.080, 27.34.200, 27.34.210,
8 27.34.220, 27.34.230, 27.34.240, 27.34.250, 27.34.260, 27.34.270,
9 27.34.280, 27.34.310, 27.34.320, 27.34.330, 27.34.340, 27.34.350,

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** In creating the department of cultural
18 resources, the legislature recognizes that responsibilities for
19 heritage and arts-related concerns are fragmented among a variety of

1 agencies in state government with limited statutory opportunities for
2 coordination among those agencies. The department of cultural
3 resources will provide a comprehensive, coordinated state-wide
4 heritage and arts program for the citizens of this state. It will
5 implement the state's strategic plan as formulated by the cultural
6 resources commission; minimize or eliminate duplication of effort,
7 conflicts, and program gaps; create and enhance existing opportunities
8 for cooperation and collaboration; promote consistency of state
9 heritage and arts-related actions; establish an integrated focus for
10 the state-wide heritage and arts program to make it understandable and
11 visible to the general public; establish a system for development of
12 state-wide goals; and develop a method for setting priorities among
13 those goals.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** (1) The cultural resources commission is
15 created.

16 (2) The commission has the following purposes:

17 (a) To nominate three candidates to the governor for director of
18 the department;

19 (b) To develop a strategic plan for guiding the state's management
20 of its cultural and arts-related resources;

21 (c) To evaluate the performance of the department and the
22 department's implementation of the strategic plan; and

23 (d) To make recommendations to the director concerning the budget
24 of the department.

25 (3) Staffing of the commission comes from the department.

26 (4) Except for initial terms, members shall serve for terms of four
27 years. Terms of initial members shall be staggered.

28 (5) Members shall be appointed as follows:

29 (a) The governor shall appoint eight citizen members to the
30 commission. Members of the commission shall select one of the citizen
31 members to be chair;

32 (b) There shall be four legislative members, one from each of the
33 two major caucuses in the senate and the house of representatives,
34 selected by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of
35 representatives, as appropriate;

36 (c) One member each from the board of the eastern Washington state
37 historical society and the Washington state historical society,
38 selected by the respective board;

1 (d) One member from the Washington state arts commission, selected
2 by the Washington state arts commission;

3 (e) One member of the advisory council on historic preservation
4 established in RCW 27.34.250 (as recodified by this act); and

5 (f) The director, who shall be an ex officio, nonvoting member.

6 (6) Citizen members shall receive per diem and travel expenses in
7 accordance with RCW 43.03.050, 43.03.060, and 43.03.240.

8 (7) The commission shall act collectively in harmony with recorded
9 resolutions or motions adopted by majority vote of the membership.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The commission shall develop a strategic
11 plan to be implemented by the director to achieve a comprehensive,
12 coordinated, state-wide heritage and arts program for the citizens of
13 the state. The strategic plan shall include but not be limited to
14 proposals to enhance and make more effective state assistance to
15 heritage and arts organizations; strategies to integrate the
16 department's programs into other state agencies' programs; the
17 incorporation of heritage, arts, and historic preservation into
18 revitalization and economic development plans; and estimates of the
19 future growth of state-funded cultural, historic, arts, and scientific
20 facilities to plan better for the functions these facilities serve.

21 **Sec. 4.** RCW 27.34.020 and 1995 c 399 s 13 are each amended to read
22 as follows:

23 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
24 this section apply throughout this chapter:

25 (1) "Advisory council" means the advisory council on historic
26 preservation.

27 (2) "Amateur society" means any organization composed primarily of
28 persons who are not professional archaeologists, whose primary interest
29 is in the archaeological resources of the state, and which has been
30 certified in writing by two professional archaeologists.

31 (3) "Archaeological object" means an object that comprises the
32 physical evidence of an indigenous and subsequent culture including
33 material remains of past human life including monuments, symbols,
34 tools, facilities, and technological byproducts.

35 (4) "Archaeological site" means a geographic locality in
36 Washington, including but not limited to, submerged and submersible

1 lands and the bed of the sea within the state's jurisdiction, that
2 contains archaeological objects.

3 (5) "Commission" means the cultural resources commission.

4 (6) "Department" means the department of ((community, trade, and
5 economic development)) cultural resources.

6 ((+3)) (7) "Director" means the director of ((community, trade,
7 and economic development)) the department.

8 ((+4)) (8) "Federal act" means the national historic preservation
9 act of 1966 (Public Law 89-655; 80 Stat. 915).

10 ((+5) "Heritage council" means the Washington state heritage
11 council.

12 (+6)) (9) "Historic" means peoples and cultures who are known
13 through written documents in their own or other languages. As applied
14 to underwater archaeological resources, the term historic includes only
15 those properties that are listed in or eligible for listing in the
16 Washington state register of historic places or the national register
17 of historic places as defined in the national historic preservation act
18 of 1966 (Title 1, Sec. 101, P. L. 89-665; 80 Stat. 915; 16 U.S.C. Sec.
19 470).

20 (10) "Historic archaeological resources" means those properties
21 that are listed in or eligible for listing in the Washington state
22 register of historic places or the national register of historic places
23 as defined in the national historic preservation act of 1966 (Title 1,
24 Sec. 101, P. L. 89-665; 80 Stat. 915; 16 U.S.C. Sec. 470).

25 (11) "Historic preservation" includes the protection,
26 rehabilitation, restoration, identification, scientific excavation, and
27 reconstruction of districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects
28 significant in American and Washington state history, architecture,
29 archaeology, or culture.

30 ((+7)) (12) "Office" means the office of archaeology and historic
31 preservation within the department.

32 ((+8)) (13) "Prehistoric" means peoples and cultures who are
33 unknown through contemporaneous written documents in any language.

34 (14) "Preservation officer" means the state historic preservation
35 officer as provided for in RCW 27.34.210 (as recodified by this act).

36 ((+9)) (15) "Professional archaeologist" means a person who has
37 met the educational, training, and experience requirements of the
38 society of professional archaeologists.

1 (16) "Project" means programs leading to the preservation for
2 public benefit of historical properties, whether by state and local
3 governments or other public bodies, or private organizations or
4 individuals, including the acquisition of title or interests in, and
5 the development of, any district, site, building, structure, or object
6 that is significant in American and Washington state history,
7 architecture, archaeology, or culture, and property used in connection
8 therewith, or for its development.

9 (~~(10)~~) (17) "State historical agencies" means the state
10 historical societies and the office of archaeology and historic
11 preservation within the department.

12 (~~(11)~~) (18) "State historical societies" means the Washington
13 state historical society and the eastern Washington state historical
14 society.

15 (~~(12)~~ "Cultural resource management plan" means a comprehensive
16 plan which identifies and organizes information on the state of
17 Washington's historic, archaeological, and architectural resources into
18 a set of management criteria, and which is to be used for producing
19 reliable decisions, recommendations, and advice relative to the
20 identification, evaluation, and protection of these resources.)

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** There is created a department of state
22 government to be known as the department of cultural resources. The
23 department is vested with all powers and duties transferred to it under
24 this chapter and such other powers and duties as may be authorized by
25 law.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** The executive head and appointing authority
27 of the department is the director. The director shall be appointed by
28 the governor, with the consent of the senate, and shall serve at the
29 pleasure of the governor. The director shall be paid a salary to be
30 fixed by the governor in accordance with RCW 43.03.040. If a vacancy
31 occurs in the position while the senate is not in session, the governor
32 shall make a temporary appointment until the next meeting of the
33 senate.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** It is the intent of the legislature wherever
35 possible to place the internal affairs of the department under the
36 control of the director in order that the director may institute

1 therein the flexible, alert, and intelligent management of its business
2 that changing contemporary circumstances require. Therefore, whenever
3 the director's authority is not specifically limited by law, the
4 director has complete charge and supervisory powers over the
5 department. The director may create such administrative structures as
6 the director considers appropriate, except as otherwise specified by
7 law. The director may employ such assistants and personnel as
8 necessary for the general administration of the department. This
9 employment shall be in accordance with the state civil service law,
10 chapter 41.06 RCW, except as otherwise provided.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** The department shall initially be subdivided
12 into three divisions, including a division of administration, a
13 division of museums, and a division of community services. Except as
14 otherwise specified or as federal requirements may differently require,
15 these divisions or their successors shall be established and organized
16 in accordance with plans to be prepared by the director. In preparing
17 such plans, the director shall endeavor to promote efficient public
18 management, to improve programs, and to take full advantage of the
19 economies, both fiscal and administrative, to be gained from the
20 consolidation of functions and agencies under this chapter.

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 9.** The director shall appoint a deputy director
22 and such assistant directors as may be needed to administer the
23 department. The deputy director shall have charge and general
24 supervision of the department in the absence or disability of the
25 director and, in case of a vacancy in the office of director, shall
26 continue in charge of the department until a successor is appointed and
27 qualified, or until the governor makes a temporary appointment.

28 The director shall execute and implement the biennial operating
29 budget for the operation of the department in accordance with chapter
30 43.88 RCW and with legislative appropriation and in such manner as
31 prescribed therein.

32 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 10.** Any power or duty vested in or transferred
33 to the director by law or executive order may be delegated by the
34 director to the deputy director or to any other assistant or
35 subordinate; but the director shall be responsible for the official
36 acts of the officers and employees of the department.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 11.** The director may exercise the governor's
2 authority to appoint such advisory committees or councils as may be
3 required by any federal legislation as a condition to the receipt of
4 federal funds by the department. The director may also exercise the
5 governor's authority to appoint state-wide committees or councils on
6 such subject matters as are or come within the department's
7 responsibilities.

8 Members of such state advisory committees or councils may be paid
9 their travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 12.** In furtherance of the policy of the state
11 to cooperate with the federal government in all of the programs under
12 the jurisdiction of the department, such rules as may become necessary
13 to entitle the state to participate in federal funds may be adopted
14 under chapter 34.05 RCW, unless expressly prohibited by law. Any
15 internal reorganization carried out under the terms of this chapter
16 shall meet federal requirements that are a necessary condition to state
17 receipt of federal funds. Any section or provision of law dealing with
18 the department that may be susceptible to more than one construction
19 shall be interpreted in favor of the construction most likely to comply
20 with federal laws entitling this state to receive federal funds for the
21 various programs of the department. If any law dealing with the
22 department is ruled to be in conflict with federal requirements that
23 are a prescribed condition of the allocation of federal funds to the
24 state, or to any departments or agencies thereof, the conflicting part
25 is declared to be inoperative solely to the extent of the conflict.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 13.** A new section is added to chapter 41.06 RCW
27 to read as follows:

28 In addition to the exemptions under RCW 41.06.070, the provisions
29 of this chapter shall not apply in the department of cultural resources
30 to the director, the director's personal secretary, the deputy
31 director, all division directors and assistant directors, and one
32 confidential secretary for each of these officers.

33 **Sec. 14.** RCW 43.17.010 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 16, 1993 c 472 s 17,
34 and 1993 c 280 s 18 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

35 There shall be departments of the state government which shall be
36 known as (1) the department of social and health services, (2) the

1 department of ecology, (3) the department of labor and industries, (4)
2 the department of agriculture, (5) the department of fish and wildlife,
3 (6) the department of transportation, (7) the department of licensing,
4 (8) the department of general administration, (9) the department of
5 community, trade, and economic development, (10) the department of
6 veterans affairs, (11) the department of revenue, (12) the department
7 of retirement systems, (13) the department of corrections, ((and)) (14)
8 the department of health, ((and)) (15) the department of financial
9 institutions, and (16) the department of cultural resources, which
10 shall be charged with the execution, enforcement, and administration of
11 such laws, and invested with such powers and required to perform such
12 duties, as the legislature may provide.

13 **Sec. 15.** RCW 43.17.020 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 2 s 2 are each amended
14 to read as follows:

15 There shall be a chief executive officer of each department to be
16 known as: (1) The secretary of social and health services, (2) the
17 director of ecology, (3) the director of labor and industries, (4) the
18 director of agriculture, (5) the director of fish and wildlife, (6) the
19 secretary of transportation, (7) the director of licensing, (8) the
20 director of general administration, (9) the director of community,
21 trade, and economic development, (10) the director of veterans affairs,
22 (11) the director of revenue, (12) the director of retirement systems,
23 (13) the secretary of corrections, ((and)) (14) the secretary of
24 health, ((and)) (15) the director of financial institutions, and (16)
25 the director of cultural resources.

26 Such officers, except the secretary of transportation and the
27 director of fish and wildlife, shall be appointed by the governor, with
28 the consent of the senate, and hold office at the pleasure of the
29 governor. The secretary of transportation shall be appointed by the
30 transportation commission as prescribed by RCW 47.01.041. The director
31 of fish and wildlife shall be appointed by the fish and wildlife
32 commission as prescribed by RCW 77.04.055.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 16.** (1)(a) All reports, documents, surveys,
34 books, records, files, papers, or written material relating to state
35 historical societies, heritage organizations, archeology, and historic
36 preservation in the possession of the department of community, trade,
37 and economic development, the Washington state historical society, the

1 eastern Washington state historical society, the office of archeology
2 and historic preservation, or relating to the growth and development of
3 the arts and humanities in the state of Washington in the possession of
4 the arts commission shall be delivered to the custody of the department
5 of cultural resources. All cabinets, furniture, office equipment,
6 motor vehicles, and other tangible property employed by the department
7 of community, trade, and economic development, the Washington state
8 historical society, the eastern Washington state historical society,
9 the office of archeology and historic preservation, or the arts
10 commission relating to the functions transferred by this section shall
11 be made available to the department of cultural resources. All funds,
12 credits, or other assets held by the department of community, trade,
13 and economic development, the Washington state historical society, the
14 eastern Washington state historical society, the office of archeology
15 and historic preservation, or the arts commission relating to the
16 functions transferred by this section shall be assigned to the
17 department of cultural resources.

18 (b) Any appropriations made to the department of community, trade,
19 and economic development, the Washington state historical society, the
20 eastern Washington state historical society, the office of archeology
21 and historic preservation, or the arts commission relating to the
22 functions transferred by this section shall, on the effective date of
23 this section, be transferred and credited to the department of cultural
24 resources.

25 (c) If any question arises as to the transfer of any personnel,
26 funds, books, documents, records, papers, files, equipment, or other
27 tangible property used or held in the exercise of the powers and the
28 performance of the duties and functions transferred, the director of
29 financial management shall make a determination as to the proper
30 allocation and certify the same to the state agencies concerned.

31 (2) All employees of the department of community, trade, and
32 economic development, the Washington state historical society, the
33 eastern Washington state historical society, the office of archeology
34 and historic preservation, or the arts commission employed on matters
35 relating to the functions transferred by this section are transferred
36 to the jurisdiction of the department of cultural resources. All
37 employees classified under chapter 41.06 RCW, the state civil service
38 law, are assigned to the department of cultural resources to perform
39 their usual duties upon the same terms as formerly, without any loss of

1 rights, subject to any action that may be appropriate thereafter in
2 accordance with the laws and rules governing state civil service.

3 (3) All rules and all pending business before the department of
4 community, trade, and economic development, the Washington state
5 historical society, the eastern Washington state historical society,
6 the office of archeology and historic preservation, or the arts
7 commission relating to the functions transferred by this section shall
8 be continued and acted upon by the department of cultural resources.
9 All existing contracts and obligations relating to the functions
10 transferred by this section shall remain in full force and shall be
11 performed by the department of cultural resources.

12 (4) The transfer of the powers, duties, functions, and personnel of
13 the department of community, trade, and economic development, the
14 Washington state historical society, the eastern Washington state
15 historical society, the office of archeology and historic preservation,
16 or the arts commission relating to the functions transferred by this
17 section shall not affect the validity of any act performed before the
18 effective date of this section.

19 (5) If apportionments of budgeted funds are required because of the
20 transfers directed by this section, the director of financial
21 management shall certify the apportionments to the agencies affected,
22 the state auditor, and the state treasurer. Each of these shall make
23 the appropriate transfer and adjustments in funds and appropriation
24 accounts and equipment records in accordance with the certification.

25 (6) Nothing contained in this section may be construed to alter any
26 existing collective bargaining unit or the provisions of any existing
27 collective bargaining agreement until the agreement has expired or
28 until the bargaining unit has been modified by action of the personnel
29 board as provided by law.

30 **Sec. 17.** RCW 27.34.070 and 1983 c 91 s 7 are each amended to read
31 as follows:

32 (1) Each state historical society is designated a trustee for the
33 state whose powers and duties include but are not limited to the
34 following:

35 (a) To collect, catalog, preserve, and interpret objects,
36 manuscripts, sites, photographs, and other materials illustrative of
37 the cultural, artistic, and natural history of this state;

1 (b) To operate state museums and assist and encourage cultural and
2 historical studies and museum interpretive efforts throughout the
3 state, including those sponsored by local historical organizations, and
4 city, county, and state agencies;

5 (c) To engage in cultural, artistic, and educational activities,
6 including classes, exhibits, seminars, workshops, and conferences if
7 these activities are related to the basic purpose of the society;

8 (d) To plan for and conduct celebrations of significant events in
9 the history of the state of Washington and to give assistance to and
10 coordinate with state agencies, local governments, and local historical
11 organizations in planning and conducting celebrations;

12 (e) To create one or more classes of membership in the society;

13 (f) To engage in the sale of various articles which are related to
14 the basic purpose of the society;

15 (g) To engage in appropriate fund-raising activities for the
16 purpose of increasing the self-support of the society;

17 (h) To accept gifts, grants, conveyances, bequests, and devises, of
18 real or personal property, or both, in trust or otherwise, and sell,
19 lease, exchange, invest, or expend the same or the proceeds, rents,
20 profits, and income therefrom except as limited by the donor's terms.
21 The (~~governing boards of the state historical societies~~) department
22 shall adopt rules to govern and protect the receipt and expenditure of
23 the proceeds, rents, profits, and income of all such gifts, grants,
24 conveyances, bequests, and devises;

25 (i) To accept on loan or lend objects of historical interest, and
26 sell, exchange, divest itself of, or refuse to accept, items which do
27 not enhance the collection; and

28 (j) To charge general or special admission fees to its museums or
29 exhibits and to waive or decrease such fees as it finds appropriate(
30 ~~and~~

31 ~~(k) To work with the heritage council in developing the plan under~~
32 ~~RCW 27.34.050)).~~

33 (2) All objects, sites, manuscripts, photographs, and all property,
34 including real property, now held or hereafter acquired by the state
35 historical societies shall be held by the societies in trust for the
36 use and benefit of the people of Washington state.

37 **Sec. 18.** RCW 27.34.080 and 1983 c 91 s 8 are each amended to read
38 as follows:

1 The governing board of each state historical society shall appoint
2 its respective director with the consent of the ((governor)) director.
3 The ((governor)) director may remove ((a)) an historical society
4 director for cause or if a majority of the society's governing board
5 votes for removal.

6 **Sec. 19.** RCW 27.34.230 and 1986 c 266 s 12 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 The director or the director's designee shall:

9 (1) Submit the budget requests for the office to the heritage
10 council for review and comment; and

11 (2) Receive, administer, and disburse such gifts, grants, and
12 endowments from private sources as may be made in trust or otherwise
13 for the purposes of RCW 27.34.200 through ((27.34.290)) 27.34.280 (each
14 as recodified by this act) or the federal act((; and

15 ~~(3) Develop and implement a cultural resource management plan~~)).

16 **Sec. 20.** RCW 43.46.015 and 1985 c 317 s 2 are each amended to read
17 as follows:

18 There is established a Washington state arts commission. The arts
19 commission consists of nineteen members appointed by the ((governor))
20 director and two members of the legislature, one appointed by the
21 president of the senate and one appointed by the speaker of the house
22 of representatives. The legislative members shall be from opposite
23 major political parties. The ((governor)) director shall appoint
24 citizens representing the various disciplines within the visual,
25 performing and literary arts, and other citizens active in the arts
26 community. The ((governor)) director shall consider nominations for
27 membership from individuals actively involved in cultural, state or
28 community organizations. The ((governor)) director shall also consider
29 geographical distribution of the membership in the appointment of new
30 members.

31 **Sec. 21.** RCW 43.46.040 and 1985 c 317 s 4 are each amended to read
32 as follows:

33 Members of the arts commission shall serve without compensation.
34 However, nonlegislative members shall be reimbursed for travel expenses
35 as provided in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 and legislative members
36 shall be reimbursed as provided in RCW 44.04.120. The commission shall

1 organize(~~(7)~~) and elect a chairperson annually(~~(7-and)~~). The director
2 shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW. A majority of its
3 members constitute a quorum. Any action as defined in RCW 42.30.020(3)
4 shall be taken only at a meeting at which a quorum is present.

5 **Sec. 22.** RCW 43.46.045 and 1988 c 81 s 23 are each amended to read
6 as follows:

7 The (~~governor~~) director shall select a full time executive
8 director of the arts commission from a list of three names submitted by
9 the arts commission by September 1, 1988, and anytime thereafter that
10 a vacancy occurs. The executive director of the arts commission shall
11 receive no other salary and shall not be otherwise gainfully employed.
12 Subject to the provisions of chapter 41.06 RCW, the executive director
13 of the arts commission may also employ such clerical and other
14 assistants as may be reasonably required to carry out arts commission
15 functions. The executive director of the arts commission shall serve
16 at the pleasure of the (~~governor~~) director.

17 **Sec. 23.** RCW 43.46.050 and 1985 c 317 s 6 are each amended to read
18 as follows:

19 The arts commission shall meet, study, plan, and advise the
20 (~~governor, the various departments of the state and the state~~
21 ~~legislature~~) director and shall make such recommendations as it deems
22 proper for the cultural development of the state of Washington.

23 **Sec. 24.** RCW 43.46.055 and 1985 c 317 s 7 are each amended to read
24 as follows:

25 The arts commission may develop, sponsor, promote, and administer
26 any activity, project, or program within or without this state which is
27 related to the growth and development of the arts and humanities in the
28 state of Washington and may assist any person or public or private
29 agency to this end.

30 **Sec. 25.** RCW 43.46.060 and 1965 c 8 s 43.46.060 are each amended
31 to read as follows:

32 The arts commission may accept gifts and grants upon such terms as
33 the commission shall deem proper.

1 **Sec. 26.** RCW 43.46.070 and 1985 c 317 s 8 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 The arts commission shall make a biennial report of its proceedings
4 and recommendations to the (~~governor~~) director, which shall contain
5 a full description of program and project activity, including fund
