- 1 AN ACT Relating to community athletic facilities; adding a new
- 2 chapter to Title 43 RCW; and providing a contingent expiration date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 The legislature recognizes that NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1)5 coordinated funding efforts are needed to maintain, develop, and improve the state's community outdoor athletic fields. 6 population growth and increased urbanization have caused a decline in suitable outdoor fields for community athletic activities and has 8 resulted in overcrowding and deterioration of existing surfaces. Lack 9 10 of adequate community outdoor athletic fields directly affects the health and well-being of all citizens of the state, reduces the state's 11 12 economic viability, and prevents Washington from maintaining and 13 achieving the quality of life that it deserves. Therefore, it is the 14 policy of the state and its agencies to maintain, develop, fund, and 15 improve community outdoor athletic fields.
 - (2) In carrying out this policy, the legislature intends to promote the building of new community outdoor athletic fields and upgrade existing community outdoor athletic fields across Washington state. The purpose of this chapter is to create an advisory committee

- 1 to provide information and advice to the interagency committee for
- 2 outdoor recreation in the distribution of the funds established in the
- 3 voter-approved Seahawk stadium legislation, RCW 43.99N.060.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) A community outdoor athletic fields advisory committee is established within the interagency committee for
- 6 outdoor recreation. The committee consists of five members from the
- 7 public at large, appointed by the governor. The governor must use his
- 8 or her best efforts to achieve a balance among the appointed members of
- 9 the public at large based upon factors of geographic, racial, ethnic,
- 10 and gender diversity, and with a sense and awareness of community
- 11 outdoor athletic field needs.
- 12 (2) The terms of the members shall commence on the date of
- 13 appointment and shall be for three years, or until a successor is
- 14 appointed except in the case of appointments to fill vacancies which
- 15 shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term. However, the first
- 16 members shall be appointed for terms as follows: Two members for one
- 17 year and three members for two years. The governor shall appoint one of
- 18 the members to serve as chair of the council for the duration of the
- 19 member's term.
- 20 (3) Members shall be compensated in accordance with RCW 43.03.240
- 21 and shall be entitled to reimbursement individually for travel expenses
- 22 incurred in performance of their duties as members of the council in
- 23 accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- 24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The community outdoor athletic fields
- 25 advisory committee may have the following duties:
- 26 (1) To prepare and update a strategic plan for the development,
- 27 maintenance, and improvement of community outdoor athletic fields in
- 28 the state. The plan must be prepared in coordination with the office
- 29 of the governor and the office of financial management, with
- 30 participation of federal, state, and local agencies having community
- 31 outdoor athletic responsibilities, user groups, private sector
- 32 interests, and the general public. The advisory committee shall submit
- 33 the plan and its policy recommendations to the governor. The plan may
- 34 include, but is not limited to:
- 35 (a) An inventory of current community outdoor athletic fields;
- 36 (b) A forecast of demand for these fields;

- 1 (c) An identification and analysis of actual and potential funding 2 sources;
 - (d) A process for broad scale information gathering;

- 4 (e) An assessment of the capabilities and constraints, both 5 internal and external to state government, that affect the ability of 6 the state to achieve the goals of the plan;
- 7 (f) An analysis of strategic options and decisions available to the 8 state;
- 9 (g) An implementation strategy that is coordinated with executive 10 policy and budget priorities; and
- 11 (h) The elements necessary to qualify for participation in or the 12 receipt of aid from any federal program for community outdoor athletic 13 fields;
- 14 (2) The committee shall determine the eligibility requirements for 15 a qualified nonprofit organization;
- 16 (3) To encourage and provide opportunities for interagency and 17 regional coordination and cooperative efforts between public agencies 18 and between public and private entities involved in the maintenance, 19 development, and improvement of community outdoor athletic fields;
- 20 (4) To appoint technical and other committees as may be necessary 21 to carry out the purposes of this chapter; and
- 22 (5) To create and maintain a repository for data, studies, 23 research, and other information relating to community outdoor athletic 24 fields in the state, and to encourage the exchange of this information. 25 The community outdoor athletic fields advisory committee may
- 25 The community outdoor athletic fields advisory committee may 26 provide information to and advise the interagency committee for outdoor 27 recreation on the disbursement of funds governed by RCW 43.99N.060.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 1 through 3 of this act constitute a new chapter in Title 43 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
