- 1 AN ACT Relating to geoduck diver licenses; and amending RCW 2 75.28.750.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 75.28.750 and 1993 c 340 s 24 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) Every diver engaged in the commercial harvest of geoduck clams
  7 shall obtain a ((nontransferable)) geoduck diver license.
- 8 (2) After July 1, 1998, the director shall issue no new geoduck
- 9 diver licenses unless fewer than fifty persons are eligible for
- 10 renewal. A person may renew an existing license only if the person
- 11 held a geoduck diver license for four of the seven years 1991 through
- 12 1997 or acquired the license by transfer from someone who held it
- 13 during the previous year, and if the person has not subsequently
- 14 transferred the license to another person.
- 15 (3) If fewer than fifty persons are eliqible to renew a geoduck
- 16 diver license, the director may accept applications for new licenses.
- 17 The department shall adopt rules and procedures to determine whether

- 1 qualified applicants, the successful applicants for any additional 2 licenses. In no event shall there be more than fifty licenses issued 3 or renewed in any calendar year.
- 4 (4) When the person failed to obtain the license during the 5 previous year because of a license suspension, the person may qualify 6 for a license by establishing that the person held such a license 7 during the last year in which the license was not suspended.
- 8 (5) Geoduck diver licenses are not transferable except from parent
  9 to child, from spouse to spouse during marriage or as a result of
  10 marriage dissolution or property settlement, or upon death of the
  11 license holder.
