- 1 AN ACT Relating to alternate operator licenses; and amending RCW
- 2 75.28.010, 75.28.030, 75.28.046, 75.28.047, and 75.28.048.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 75.28.010 and 1997 c 58 s 883 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) Except as otherwise provided by this title, it is unlawful to 7 engage in any of the following activities without a license or permit 8 issued by the director:
 - (a) Commercially fish for or take food fish or shellfish;
- (b) Deliver food fish or shellfish taken in offshore waters;
- 11 (c) Operate a charter boat or commercial fishing vessel engaged in
- 12 a fishery. However, no license or permit is required for the operation
- 13 of a licensed charter boat by an alternate operator specified by the
- 14 <u>licensee</u>;

- 15 (d) Engage in processing or wholesaling food fish or shellfish; or
- 16 (e) Act as a guide for salmon for personal use in freshwater rivers
- 17 and streams, other than that part of the Columbia river below the
- 18 bridge at Longview.

- (2) No person may engage in the activities described in subsection 1 2 (1) of this section unless the licenses or permits required by this title are in the person's possession, and the person is the named 3 4 license holder or an alternate operator designated on the license and 5 the person's license is not suspended.
- (3) A valid Oregon license that is equivalent to a license under 6 7 this title is valid in the concurrent waters of the Columbia river if 8 the state of Oregon recognizes as valid the equivalent Washington 9 license. The director may identify by rule what Oregon licenses are equivalent.
- 11 (4) No license or permit is required for the production or harvesting of private sector cultured aquatic products as defined in 12 13 RCW 15.85.020 or for the delivery, processing, or wholesaling of such aquatic products. However, if a means of identifying such products is 14 15 required by rules adopted under RCW 15.85.060, the exemption from licensing or permit requirements established by this subsection applies 16 only if the aquatic products are identified in conformance with those 17 18 rules.
- 19 Sec. 2. RCW 75.28.030 and 1993 sp.s. c 17 s 44 are each amended to read as follows: 20
- (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the director shall 21 22 issue commercial licenses and permits to a qualified person upon receiving a completed application accompanied by the required fee. 23
- 24 (2) An application submitted to the department under this chapter 25 shall contain the name and address of the applicant and any other information required by the department or this title. An applicant for 26 a commercial fishery license((,)) or delivery license((, or charter 27 28 license)) may designate a vessel to be used with the license and up to 29 two alternate operators.
- (3) An application submitted to the department under this chapter 30 shall contain the applicant's declaration under penalty of perjury that 31 the information on the application is true and correct. 32
- 33 (4) Upon issuing a commercial license under this chapter, the 34 director shall assign the license a unique number that the license shall retain upon renewal. The department shall use the number to 35 36 record any commercial catch under the license. This does not preclude the department from using other, additional, catch record methods. 37

- 1 (5) The fee to replace a license that has been lost or destroyed is 2 twenty dollars.
- 3 **Sec. 3.** RCW 75.28.046 and 1994 c 260 s 12 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- This section applies to all commercial fishery licenses((-)) and delivery licenses((-)) and charter licenses)), except for whiting Puget Sound fishery licenses and emergency salmon delivery licenses.
- 8 (1) The license holder may engage in the activity authorized by a 9 license subject to this section. With the exception of Dungeness crab« 10 coastal fishery class B licensees licensed under RCW 75.30.350((\(\frac{4}{3}\))) 11 (\frac{4}{1}\), the holder of a license subject to this section may also designate 12 up to two alternate operators for the license. Dungeness crab« coastal 13 fishery class B licensees may not designate alternate operators. A
- 14 person designated as an alternate operator must possess an alternate 15 operator license issued under ((section 23 of this act and)) RCW
- 16 75.28.048.
- 17 (2) The fee to change the alternate operator designation is twenty-18 two dollars.
- 19 **Sec. 4.** RCW 75.28.047 and 1993 c 340 s 10 are each amended to read 20 as follows:
- 21 (1) Only the license holder and any alternate operators designated 22 on the license may sell or deliver food fish or shellfish under a
- 23 commercial fishery license or delivery license. A commercial fishery
- 24 license or delivery license authorizes no taking or delivery of food
- 25 fish or shellfish unless the license holder or an alternate operator
- 26 designated on the license is present or aboard the vessel.
- 27 (2) Only the license holder and any alternate operators designated
- 28 ((on)) by the ((license)) licensee may operate a vessel as a charter
- 29 boat.
- 30 **Sec. 5.** RCW 75.28.048 and 1997 c 233 s 2 are each amended to read 31 as follows:
- 32 (1) A person who holds a commercial fishery license($(\frac{1}{2})$) or a
- 33 delivery license((, or charter license)) may operate the vessel
- 34 designated on the license. A person who is not the license holder may
- 35 operate the vessel designated on the license only if:

- 1 (a) The person holds an alternate operator license issued by the 2 director; and
- 3 (b) The person is designated as an alternate operator on the 4 underlying commercial fishery license((,)) or delivery license((,-)) or
- 6 (2) Only an individual at least sixteen years of age may hold an 7 alternate operator license.
- 8 (3) No individual may hold more than one alternate operator 9 license. An individual who holds an alternate operator license may be 10 designated as an alternate operator on an unlimited number of 11 commercial fishery licenses((-,)) or delivery licenses((-, and charter licenses)) under RCW 75.28.046.
- (4) An individual who holds two <u>D</u>ungeness crab--Puget Sound fishery licenses may operate the licenses on one vessel if the vessel owner or alternate operator is on the vessel. The department shall allow a license holder to operate up to one hundred crab pots for each license.
- (5) As used in this section, to "operate" means to control the deployment or removal of fishing gear from state waters while aboard a vessel((, to operate a vessel as a charter boat,)) or to operate a vessel delivering food fish or shellfish taken in offshore waters to a port within the state.
