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## SENATE BILL 6409

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1998 Regular Session

By Senators Hargrove and Long; by request of Department of Social and Health Services

Read first time 01/19/98. Referred to Committee on Human Services & Corrections.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to care for children with developmental
- 2 disabilities provided by the department of social and health services
- 3 in the division of developmental disabilities; amending RCW 71A.10.020,
- 4 71A.12.040, and 74.20A.030; adding a new section to chapter 71A.10 RCW;
- 5 and creating a new section.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. It is the intent of the legislature that
- 8 parents are responsible for the care and support of children with
- 9 developmental disabilities. The legislature recognizes that, in some
- 10 instances, intense support is required to care for a child with
- 11 developmental disabilities, and the assistance of preventive home-based
- 12 or out-of-home care might be needed. The legislature intends to
- 13 consolidate all preventive home-based and out-of-home care provided to
- 14 children with developmental disabilities, where those services are
- 15 necessitated by issues dependent on the child's developmental
- 16 disability and not on issues related to either or both abuse and
- 17 neglect, and excluding those children whose permanency plan recommends
- 18 adoption, through the department of social and health services in the
- 19 division of developmental disabilities.

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- The legislature further intends that, through this transfer of administrative authority from the division of children and family services to the division of developmental disabilities within the department of social and health services, the currently authorized levels and types of services available to children with developmental disabilities and their families is unaffected.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 71A.10 RCW to read as follows:
- 9 The department shall consolidate all services currently provided through children's administration, not related to either or both abuse 10 and neglect, to children with developmental disabilities in the 11 division of developmental disabilities. The department shall provide 12 13 orderly transfer of staff, equipment, for an and 14 responsibilities from the division of children and family services to 15 division of developmental disabilities. The division of developmental disabilities shall assume responsibilities for children 16 with developmental disabilities under this section no later than July 17 18 1, 1998. Any disputes between the division of children and family 19 services and the division of developmental disabilities regarding the transfer of responsibilities under this section shall be resolved by 20 21 the secretary.
- 22 **Sec. 3.** RCW 71A.10.020 and 1988 c 176 s 102 are each amended to 23 read as follows:
- As used in this title, the following terms have the meanings indicated unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 26 (1) "Department" means the department of social and health 27 services.
- 28 (2) "Developmental disability" means a disability attributable to 29 mental retardation, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism, or another neurological or other condition of an individual found by the secretary 30 to be closely related to mental retardation or to require treatment 31 32 similar to that required for individuals with mental retardation, which disability originates before the individual attains age eighteen, which 33 has continued or can be expected to continue indefinitely, and which 34 35 constitutes a substantial handicap to the individual. By January 1, 1989, the department shall promulgate rules which define neurological 36 37 or other conditions in a way that is not limited to intelligence

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- 1 quotient scores as the sole ((determinate [determinant])) determinant 2 of these conditions, and notify the legislature of this action.
- 3 (3) "Eligible person" means a person who has been found by the 4 secretary under RCW 71A.16.040 to be eligible for services.
- 5 (4) "Habilitative services" means those services provided by 6 program personnel to assist persons in acquiring and maintaining life 7 skills and to raise their levels of physical, mental, social, and 8 vocational functioning. Habilitative services include education, 9 training for employment, and therapy.
- 10 (5) "Legal representative" means a parent of a person who is under 11 eighteen years of age, a person's legal guardian, a person's limited 12 guardian when the subject matter is within the scope of the limited 13 guardianship, a person's attorney at law, a person's attorney in fact, 14 or any other person who is authorized by law to act for another person.
- 15 (6) "Notice" or "notification" of an action of the secretary means 16 notice in compliance with RCW 71A.10.060.
- (7) "Out-of-home care" means placement in a foster family home or group care facility licensed under chapter 74.15 RCW or placement in a home, other than that of the child's parent, guardian, or legal custodian, not required to be licensed under chapter 74.15 RCW.
- 21 (8) "Preventive services" means preservation services, as defined 22 in chapter 74.14C RCW, and other reasonably available services capable 23 of preventing the need for out-of-home placement while protecting the 24 child.
- 25 <u>(9)</u> "Residential habilitation center" means a state-operated 26 facility for persons with developmental disabilities governed by 27 chapter 71A.20 RCW.
- 28  $((\frac{(8)}{)})$  (10) "Secretary" means the secretary of social and health 29 services or the secretary's designee.
- 30 (((+9))) (11) "Service" or "services" means services provided by 31 state or local government to carry out this title.
- 32 **Sec. 4.** RCW 71A.12.040 and 1988 c 176 s 204 are each amended to 33 read as follows:
- 34 Services that the secretary may provide or arrange with others to 35 provide under this title include, but are not limited to:
  - (1) Architectural services;
- 37 (2) Case management services;

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38 (3) Early childhood intervention;

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- 1 (4) Employment services;
- 2 (5) Family counseling;
- 3 (6) Family support;
- 4 (7) Information and referral;
- 5 (8) Health services and equipment;
- 6 (9) Home-based preventive and out-of-home care for children;
- 7 <u>(10)</u> Legal services;
- 8  $((\frac{10}{10}))$  (11) Residential services and support;
- 9  $\left(\left(\frac{11}{11}\right)\right)$  (12) Respite care;
- 10  $((\frac{12}{12}))$  (13) Therapy services and equipment;
- 11  $((\frac{13}{13}))$  (14) Transportation services; and
- 12  $((\frac{14}{14}))$  (15) Vocational services.
- 13 **Sec. 5.** RCW 74.20A.030 and 1997 c 58 s 934 are each amended to 14 read as follows:
- 15 (1) The department shall be subrogated to the right of any dependent child or children or person having the care, custody, and 16 control of said child or children, if public assistance money is paid 17 18 to or for the benefit of the child under a state program funded under Title IV-A of the federal social security act as amended by the 19 personal responsibility and work opportunity reconciliation act of 20 1996, to prosecute or maintain any support action or execute any 21 administrative remedy existing under the laws of the state of 22 23 Washington to obtain reimbursement of moneys expended, based on the 24 support obligation of the responsible parent established by a superior court order or RCW 74.20A.055. Distribution of any support moneys 25 shall be made in accordance with RCW 26.23.035. 26
- 27 (2) The department may initiate, continue, maintain, or execute an action to establish, enforce, and collect a support obligation, 28 29 including establishing paternity and performing related services, under 30 this chapter and chapter 74.20 RCW, or through the attorney general or prosecuting attorney under chapter 26.09, 26.18, 26.20, 26.21, 26.23, 31 or 26.26 RCW or other appropriate statutes or the common law of this 32 33 state, for so long as and under such conditions as the department may 34 establish by regulation.
- 35 (3) Public assistance moneys shall be exempt from collection action 36 under this chapter except as provided in RCW 74.20A.270.
- 37 ((<del>4)</del> No collection action shall be taken against parents of 38 children eligible for admission to, or children who have been

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discharged from a residential habilitation center as defined by RCW 1 2 71A.10.020(7). For the period July 1, 1993, through June 30, 1995, a collection action may be taken against parents of children with 3 4 developmental disabilities who are placed in community-based 5 residential care. The amount of support the department may collect from the parents shall not exceed one-half of the parents' support 6 obligation accrued while the child was in community-based residential 7 8 care. The child support obligation shall be calculated pursuant to 9 chapter 26.19 RCW.))

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
