- 1 AN ACT Relating to redeployment of personnel in the department of
- 2 fish and wildlife; creating new sections; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. The legislature finds that a good-faith NEW SECTION. 5 reorganization of the department of fish and wildlife is necessary in order to meet the challenges facing fish and wildlife resources in the 6 coming century. The imminent crisis involving threatened or endangered salmonid listings under the federal endangered species act requires 8 immediate legislative action to authorize redeployment of human 9 10 resources from noncritical administrative functions into useful field positions that are necessary to expedite species recovery efforts. 11 12 legislature recognizes that the merger of the department of fisheries 13 and the department of wildlife resulted in personnel inconsistencies 14 and redundancies. Authority to reorganize the department's work force 15 is justified to assure that the work of the department is carried out effectively and efficiently and that the state's natural resources are 16
- The department of fish and wildlife shall reorganize to become more efficient in the management and protection of the natural resources

maximally protected and competently managed.

- 1 under its authority. The reorganization is needed to achieve the
- 2 immediate goals of efficiency and efficacy that the merger of the
- 3 department of fisheries and the department of wildlife sought to
- 4 accomplish. As a vital component of the reorganization, redeployment
- 5 of administrative personnel from central office positions to field
- 6 office positions is needed. Redeployment will provide a more direct
- 7 link between an employee's job skills and the application of those
- 8 skills to the improvement of the natural resource being managed.
- 9 Redeployment shall serve to increase the field presence of the
- 10 department without increasing full-time equivalent employees in the
- 11 agency.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The director of the department of fish and
- 13 wildlife, in conjunction with the fish and wildlife commission, shall
- 14 begin a good-faith reorganization to achieve the objective of this act
- 15 on or before July 1, 1998. The good-faith reorganization shall meet an
- 16 immediate goal of providing more staff resources for protection and
- 17 enhancement of threatened or endangered fish and wildlife species, and
- 18 a long-term goal of improving the efficiency in management of all
- 19 species under the authority of the department.
- 20 The director shall confer with the governor's office and the
- 21 department of personnel to reasonably assure that the needs of fish and
- 22 wildlife resource management are met in a way that is compassionate and
- 23 fair to the professional needs of the redeployed employees.
- 24 The fish and wildlife commission shall report to the appropriate
- 25 committees of the legislature on or before December 31, 1998, to
- 26 describe the progress of the good-faith reorganization.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The director of the department of fish and
- 28 wildlife shall confer with the union organizations that represent
- 29 employees of the department for the purpose of expediting the
- 30 implementation of the good-faith reorganization and addressing issues
- 31 that concern redeployed employees.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 33 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

- 2 immediately.
