1 AN ACT Relating to driving under the influence of intoxicating
2 liquor or any drug; amending RCW 46.20.308, 46.20.3101, 46.61.502,
3 46.61.504, 46.61.506, 88.12.025, 46.20.355, 10.05.100, 10.05.010,
4 10.05.120, 10.05.160, 46.01.260, 46.20.285, 46.20.391, 46.55.113,
5 46.55.120, 46.61.5058, and 46.12.240; reenacting and amending RCW
6 46.61.5055; adding a new section to chapter 46.61 RCW; creating a new
7 section; and prescribing penalties.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

9 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.308 and 1995 c 332 s 1 are each amended to read
10 as follows:

11 (1) Any person who operates a motor vehicle within this state is
12 deemed to have given consent, subject to the provisions of RCW
13 46.61.506, to a test or tests of his or her breath or blood for the
14 purpose of determining the alcohol concentration or presence of any
15 drug in his or her breath or blood if arrested for any offense where,
16 at the time of the arrest, the arresting officer has reasonable grounds
17 to believe the person had been driving or was in actual physical
18 control of a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating
19 liquor or any drug or was in violation of RCW 46.61.503.

1 (2) The test or tests of breath shall be administered at the
2 direction of a law enforcement officer having reasonable grounds to
3 believe the person to have been driving or in actual physical control
4 of a motor vehicle within this state while under the influence of
5 intoxicating liquor or the person to have been driving or in actual
6 physical control of a motor vehicle while having alcohol in a
7 concentration of 0.02 or more in his or her system and being under the
8 age of twenty-one. However, in those instances where the person is
9 incapable due to physical injury, physical incapacity, or other
10 physical limitation, of providing a breath sample or where the person
11 is being treated in a hospital, clinic, doctor's office, emergency
12 medical vehicle, ambulance, or other similar facility in which a breath
13 testing instrument is not present or where the officer has reasonable
14 grounds to believe that the person is under the influence of a drug, a
15 blood test shall be administered by a qualified person as provided in
16 RCW 46.61.506(4). The officer shall inform the person of his or her
17 right to refuse the breath or blood test, and of his or her right to
18 have additional tests administered by any qualified person of his or
19 her choosing as provided in RCW 46.61.506. The officer shall warn the
20 driver that:

21 (a) His or her license, permit, or privilege to drive will be
22 revoked or denied if he or she refuses to submit to the test;

23 (b) His or her license, permit, or privilege to drive will be
24 suspended, revoked, or denied(~~(, or placed in probationary status)~~) if
25 the test is administered and the test indicates the alcohol
26 concentration of the person's breath or blood is (~~(0.10)~~) 0.08 or more,
27 in the case of a person age twenty-one or over, or 0.02 or more in the
28 case of a person under age twenty-one; and

29 (c) His or her refusal to take the test may be used in a criminal
30 trial.

31 (3) Except as provided in this section, the test administered shall
32 be of the breath only. If an individual is unconscious or is under
33 arrest for the crime of vehicular homicide as provided in RCW 46.61.520
34 or vehicular assault as provided in RCW 46.61.522, or if an individual
35 is under arrest for the crime of driving while under the influence of
36 intoxicating liquor or drugs as provided in RCW 46.61.502, which arrest
37 results from an accident in which there has been serious bodily injury
38 to another person, a breath or blood test may be administered without
39 the consent of the individual so arrested.

1 (4) Any person who is dead, unconscious, or who is otherwise in a
2 condition rendering him or her incapable of refusal, shall be deemed
3 not to have withdrawn the consent provided by subsection (1) of this
4 section and the test or tests may be administered, subject to the
5 provisions of RCW 46.61.506, and the person shall be deemed to have
6 received the warnings required under subsection (2) of this section.

7 (5) If, following his or her arrest and receipt of warnings under
8 subsection (2) of this section, the person arrested refuses upon the
9 request of a law enforcement officer to submit to a test or tests of
10 his or her breath or blood, no test shall be given except as authorized
11 under subsection (3) or (4) of this section.

12 (6) If, after arrest and after the other applicable conditions and
13 requirements of this section have been satisfied, a test or tests of
14 the person's blood or breath is administered and the test results
15 indicate that the alcohol concentration of the person's breath or blood
16 is ~~((0.10))~~ 0.08 or more if the person is age twenty-one or over, or is
17 0.02 or more if the person is under the age of twenty-one, or the
18 person refuses to submit to a test, the arresting officer or other law
19 enforcement officer at whose direction any test has been given, or the
20 department, where applicable, if the arrest results in a test of the
21 person's blood, shall:

22 (a) Serve notice in writing on the person on behalf of the
23 department of its intention to suspend, revoke, or deny~~((, or place in~~
24 ~~probationary status))~~ the person's license, permit, or privilege to
25 drive as required by subsection (7) of this section;

26 (b) Serve notice in writing on the person on behalf of the
27 department of his or her right to a hearing, specifying the steps he or
28 she must take to obtain a hearing as provided by subsection (8) of this
29 section;

30 (c) Mark the person's Washington state driver's license or permit
31 to drive, if any, in a manner authorized by the department;

32 (d) Serve notice in writing that the marked license or permit, if
33 any, is a temporary license that is valid for sixty days from the date
34 of arrest or from the date notice has been given in the event notice is
35 given by the department following a blood test, or until the
36 suspension, revocation, or denial of the person's license, permit, or
37 privilege to drive is sustained at a hearing pursuant to subsection (8)
38 of this section, whichever occurs first. No temporary license is valid
39 to any greater degree than the license or permit that it replaces; and

1 (e) Immediately notify the department of the arrest and transmit to
2 the department within seventy-two hours, except as delayed as the
3 result of a blood test, a sworn report or report under a declaration
4 authorized by RCW 9A.72.085 that states:

5 (i) That the officer had reasonable grounds to believe the arrested
6 person had been driving or was in actual physical control of a motor
7 vehicle within this state while under the influence of intoxicating
8 liquor or drugs, or both, or was under the age of twenty-one years and
9 had been driving or was in actual physical control of a motor vehicle
10 while having an alcohol concentration of 0.02 or more;

11 (ii) That after receipt of the warnings required by subsection (2)
12 of this section the person refused to submit to a test of his or her
13 blood or breath, or a test was administered and the results indicated
14 that the alcohol concentration of the person's breath or blood was
15 (~~0.10~~) 0.08 or more if the person is age twenty-one or over, or was
16 0.02 or more if the person is under the age of twenty-one; and

17 (iii) Any other information that the director may require by rule.

18 (7) The department of licensing, upon the receipt of a sworn report
19 or report under a declaration authorized by RCW 9A.72.085 under
20 subsection (6)(e) of this section, shall suspend, revoke, or deny(~~(, or~~
21 ~~place in probationary status))~~) the person's license, permit, or
22 privilege to drive or any nonresident operating privilege, as provided
23 in RCW 46.20.3101, such suspension, revocation, or denial(~~(, or~~
24 ~~placement in probationary status))~~) to be effective beginning sixty days
25 from the date of arrest or from the date notice has been given in the
26 event notice is given by the department following a blood test, or when
27 sustained at a hearing pursuant to subsection (8) of this section,
28 whichever occurs first.

29 (8) A person receiving notification under subsection (6)(b) of this
30 section may, within thirty days after the notice has been given,
31 request in writing a formal hearing before the department. The person
32 shall pay a fee of one hundred dollars as part of the request. If the
33 request is mailed, it must be postmarked within thirty days after
34 receipt of the notification. Upon timely receipt of such a request for
35 a formal hearing, including receipt of the required one hundred dollar
36 fee, the department shall afford the person an opportunity for a
37 hearing. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the hearing is
38 subject to and shall be scheduled and conducted in accordance with RCW
39 46.20.329 and 46.20.332. The hearing shall be conducted in the county

1 of the arrest, except that all or part of the hearing may, at the
2 discretion of the department, be conducted by telephone or other
3 electronic means. The hearing shall be held within sixty days
4 following the arrest or following the date notice has been given in the
5 event notice is given by the department following a blood test, unless
6 otherwise agreed to by the department and the person, in which case the
7 action by the department shall be stayed, and any valid temporary
8 license marked under subsection (6)(c) of this section extended, if the
9 person is otherwise eligible for licensing. For the purposes of this
10 section, the scope of the hearing shall cover the issues of whether a
11 law enforcement officer had reasonable grounds to believe the person
12 had been driving or was in actual physical control of a motor vehicle
13 within this state while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or
14 any drug or had been driving or was in actual physical control of a
15 motor vehicle within this state while having alcohol in his or her
16 system in a concentration of 0.02 or more and was under the age of
17 twenty-one, whether the person was placed under arrest, and (a) whether
18 the person refused to submit to the test or tests upon request of the
19 officer after having been informed that such refusal would result in
20 the revocation of the person's license, permit, or privilege to drive,
21 or (b) if a test or tests were administered, whether the applicable
22 requirements of this section were satisfied before the administration
23 of the test or tests, whether the person submitted to the test or
24 tests, or whether a test was administered without express consent as
25 permitted under this section, and whether the test or tests indicated
26 that the alcohol concentration of the person's breath or blood was
27 ((0.10)) 0.08 or more if the person was age twenty-one or over at the
28 time of the arrest, or was 0.02 or more if the person was under the age
29 of twenty-one at the time of the arrest. The sworn report or report
30 under a declaration authorized by RCW 9A.72.085 submitted by a law
31 enforcement officer is prima facie evidence that the officer had
32 reasonable grounds to believe the person had been driving or was in
33 actual physical control of a motor vehicle within this state while
34 under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, or both, or the
35 person had been driving or was in actual physical control of a motor
36 vehicle within this state while having alcohol in his or her system in
37 a concentration of 0.02 or more and was under the age of twenty-one and
38 that the officer complied with the requirements of this section.

1 A hearing officer shall conduct the hearing, may issue subpoenas
2 for the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents, and
3 shall administer oaths to witnesses. The hearing officer shall not
4 issue a subpoena for the attendance of a witness at the request of the
5 person unless the request is accompanied by the fee required by RCW
6 5.56.010 for a witness in district court. The sworn report or report
7 under a declaration authorized by RCW 9A.72.085 of the law enforcement
8 officer and any other evidence accompanying the report shall be
9 admissible without further evidentiary foundation and the
10 certifications authorized by the criminal rules for courts of limited
11 jurisdiction shall be admissible without further evidentiary
12 foundation. The person may be represented by counsel, may question
13 witnesses, may present evidence, and may testify. The department shall
14 order that the suspension, revocation, or denial(~~(, or placement in~~
15 ~~probationary status))~~) either be rescinded or sustained.

16 (9) If the suspension, revocation, or denial(~~(, or placement in~~
17 ~~probationary status))~~) is sustained after such a hearing, the person
18 whose license, privilege, or permit is suspended, revoked, or denied(~~(,~~
19 ~~or placed in probationary status))~~) has the right to file a petition in
20 the superior court of the county of arrest to review the final order of
21 revocation by the department in the same manner as an appeal from a
22 decision of a court of limited jurisdiction. The appellant must pay
23 the costs associated with obtaining the record of the hearing before
24 the hearing officer. The filing of the appeal does not stay the
25 effective date of the suspension, revocation, or denial(~~(, or placement~~
26 ~~in probationary status))~~). A petition filed under this subsection must
27 include the petitioner's grounds for requesting review. Upon granting
28 petitioner's request for review, the court shall review the
29 department's final order of suspension, revocation, or denial(~~(, or~~
30 ~~placement in probationary status))~~) as expeditiously as possible. If
31 judicial relief is sought for a stay or other temporary remedy from the
32 department's action, the court shall not grant such relief unless the
33 court finds that the appellant is likely to prevail in the appeal and
34 that without a stay the appellant will suffer irreparable injury. If
35 the court stays the suspension, revocation, or denial(~~(, or placement~~
36 ~~in probationary status))~~) it may impose conditions on such stay.

37 (10) If a person whose driver's license, permit, or privilege to
38 drive has been or will be suspended, revoked, or denied(~~(, or placed in~~
39 ~~probationary status))~~) under subsection (7) of this section, other than

1 as a result of a breath test refusal, and who has not committed an
2 offense (~~(within the last five years)~~) for which he or she was granted
3 a deferred prosecution under chapter 10.05 RCW, petitions a court for
4 a deferred prosecution on criminal charges arising out of the arrest
5 for which action has been or will be taken under subsection (7) of this
6 section, the court may direct the department to stay any actual or
7 proposed suspension, revocation, or denial(~~(, or placement in~~
8 ~~probationary status)~~) for at least forty-five days but not more than
9 ninety days. If the court stays the suspension, revocation, or
10 denial(~~(, or placement in probationary status)~~), it may impose
11 conditions on such stay. If the person is otherwise eligible for
12 licensing, the department shall issue a temporary license, or extend
13 any valid temporary license marked under subsection (6) of this
14 section, for the period of the stay. If a deferred prosecution
15 treatment plan is not recommended in the report made under RCW
16 10.05.050, or if treatment is rejected by the court, or if the person
17 declines to accept an offered treatment plan, or if the person violates
18 any condition imposed by the court, then the court shall immediately
19 direct the department to cancel the stay and any temporary marked
20 license or extension of a temporary license issued under this
21 subsection.

22 A suspension, revocation, or denial imposed under this section,
23 other than as a result of a breath test refusal, shall be stayed if the
24 person is accepted for deferred prosecution as provided in chapter
25 10.05 RCW for the incident upon which the suspension, revocation, or
26 denial is based. If the deferred prosecution is terminated, the stay
27 shall be lifted and the suspension, revocation, or denial reinstated.
28 If the deferred prosecution is completed, the stay shall be lifted and
29 the suspension, revocation, or denial canceled.

30 (11) When it has been finally determined under the procedures of
31 this section that a nonresident's privilege to operate a motor vehicle
32 in this state has been suspended, revoked, or denied, the department
33 shall give information in writing of the action taken to the motor
34 vehicle administrator of the state of the person's residence and of any
35 state in which he or she has a license.

36 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.20.3101 and 1995 c 332 s 3 are each amended to read
37 as follows:

1 Pursuant to RCW 46.20.308, the department shall suspend, revoke, or
2 deny the arrested person's license, permit, or privilege to drive as
3 follows:

4 (1) In the case of a person who has refused a test or tests:

5 (a) For a first refusal (~~((within five years))~~), where there has not
6 been a previous incident (~~((within five years))~~) that resulted in
7 administrative action under this section, revocation or denial for one
8 year;

9 (b) For a second or subsequent refusal (~~((within five years))~~), or
10 for a first refusal where there has been one or more previous incidents
11 (~~((within five years))~~) that have resulted in administrative action under
12 this section, revocation or denial for two years or until the person
13 reaches age twenty-one, whichever is longer. A revocation imposed
14 under this subsection (1)(b) shall run consecutively to the period of
15 any suspension, revocation, or denial imposed pursuant to a criminal
16 conviction arising out of the same incident.

17 (2) In the case of an incident where a person has submitted to or
18 been administered a test or tests indicating that the alcohol
19 concentration of the person's breath or blood was (~~((0.10))~~) 0.08 or
20 more:

21 (a) For a first incident (~~((within five years))~~), where there has not
22 been a previous incident (~~((within five years))~~) that resulted in
23 administrative action under this section, (~~((placement in probationary
24 status as provided in RCW 46.20.355))~~) suspension for ninety days;

25 (b) For a second or subsequent incident (~~((within five years))~~),
26 revocation or denial for two years.

27 (3) In the case of an incident where a person under age twenty-one
28 has submitted to or been administered a test or tests indicating that
29 the alcohol concentration of the person's breath or blood was 0.02 or
30 more:

31 (a) For a first incident (~~((within five years))~~), suspension or
32 denial for ninety days;

33 (b) For a second or subsequent incident (~~((within five years))~~),
34 revocation or denial for one year or until the person reaches age
35 twenty-one, whichever is longer.

36 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.61.502 and 1994 c 275 s 2 are each amended to read
37 as follows:

1 (1) A person is guilty of driving while under the influence of
2 intoxicating liquor or any drug if the person drives a vehicle within
3 this state:

4 (a) And the person has, within two hours after driving, an alcohol
5 concentration of ((0.10)) 0.08 or higher as shown by analysis of the
6 person's breath or blood made under RCW 46.61.506; or

7 (b) While the person is under the influence of or affected by
8 intoxicating liquor or any drug; or

9 (c) While the person is under the combined influence of or affected
10 by intoxicating liquor and any drug.

11 (2) The fact that a person charged with a violation of this section
12 is or has been entitled to use a drug under the laws of this state
13 shall not constitute a defense against a charge of violating this
14 section.

15 (3) It is an affirmative defense to a violation of subsection
16 (1)(a) of this section which the defendant must prove by a
17 preponderance of the evidence that the defendant consumed a sufficient
18 quantity of alcohol after the time of driving and before the
19 administration of an analysis of the person's breath or blood to cause
20 the defendant's alcohol concentration to be ((0.10)) 0.08 or more
21 within two hours after driving. The court shall not admit evidence of
22 this defense unless the defendant notifies the prosecution prior to the
23 omnibus or pretrial hearing in the case of the defendant's intent to
24 assert the affirmative defense.

25 (4) Analyses of blood or breath samples obtained more than two
26 hours after the alleged driving may be used as evidence that within two
27 hours of the alleged driving, a person had an alcohol concentration of
28 ((0.10)) 0.08 or more in violation of subsection (1)(a) of this
29 section, and in any case in which the analysis shows an alcohol
30 concentration above 0.00 may be used as evidence that a person was
31 under the influence of or affected by intoxicating liquor or any drug
32 in violation of subsection (1)(b) or (c) of this section.

33 (5) A violation of this section is a gross misdemeanor.

34 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.61.504 and 1994 c 275 s 3 are each amended to read
35 as follows:

36 (1) A person is guilty of being in actual physical control of a
37 motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any

1 drug if the person has actual physical control of a vehicle within this
2 state:

3 (a) And the person has, within two hours after being in actual
4 physical control of the vehicle, an alcohol concentration of ((0.10))
5 0.08 or higher as shown by analysis of the person's breath or blood
6 made under RCW 46.61.506; or

7 (b) While the person is under the influence of or affected by
8 intoxicating liquor or any drug; or

9 (c) While the person is under the combined influence of or affected
10 by intoxicating liquor and any drug.

11 (2) The fact that a person charged with a violation of this section
12 is or has been entitled to use a drug under the laws of this state does
13 not constitute a defense against any charge of violating this section.
14 No person may be convicted under this section if, prior to being
15 pursued by a law enforcement officer, the person has moved the vehicle
16 safely off the roadway.

17 (3) It is an affirmative defense to a violation of subsection
18 (1)(a) of this section which the defendant must prove by a
19 preponderance of the evidence that the defendant consumed a sufficient
20 quantity of alcohol after the time of being in actual physical control
21 of the vehicle and before the administration of an analysis of the
22 person's breath or blood to cause the defendant's alcohol concentration
23 to be ((0.10)) 0.08 or more within two hours after being in such
24 control. The court shall not admit evidence of this defense unless the
25 defendant notifies the prosecution prior to the omnibus or pretrial
26 hearing in the case of the defendant's intent to assert the affirmative
27 defense.

28 (4) Analyses of blood or breath samples obtained more than two
29 hours after the alleged being in actual physical control of a vehicle
30 may be used as evidence that within two hours of the alleged being in
31 such control, a person had an alcohol concentration of ((0.10)) 0.08 or
32 more in violation of subsection (1)(a) of this section, and in any case
33 in which the analysis shows an alcohol concentration above 0.00 may be
34 used as evidence that a person was under the influence of or affected
35 by intoxicating liquor or any drug in violation of subsection (1)(b) or
36 (c) of this section.

37 (5) A violation of this section is a gross misdemeanor.

1 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.61.506 and 1995 c 332 s 18 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 (1) Upon the trial of any civil or criminal action or proceeding
4 arising out of acts alleged to have been committed by any person while
5 driving or in actual physical control of a vehicle while under the
6 influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug, if the person's alcohol
7 concentration is less than (~~0.10~~) 0.08, it is evidence that may be
8 considered with other competent evidence in determining whether the
9 person was under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug.

10 (2) The breath analysis shall be based upon grams of alcohol per
11 two hundred ten liters of breath. The foregoing provisions of this
12 section shall not be construed as limiting the introduction of any
13 other competent evidence bearing upon the question whether the person
14 was under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug.

15 (3) Analysis of the person's blood or breath to be considered valid
16 under the provisions of this section or RCW 46.61.502 or 46.61.504
17 shall have been performed according to methods approved by the state
18 toxicologist and by an individual possessing a valid permit issued by
19 the state toxicologist for this purpose. The state toxicologist is
20 directed to approve satisfactory techniques or methods, to supervise
21 the examination of individuals to ascertain their qualifications and
22 competence to conduct such analyses, and to issue permits which shall
23 be subject to termination or revocation at the discretion of the state
24 toxicologist.

25 (4) When a blood test is administered under the provisions of RCW
26 46.20.308, the withdrawal of blood for the purpose of determining its
27 alcoholic or drug content may be performed only by a physician, a
28 registered nurse, or a qualified technician. This limitation shall not
29 apply to the taking of breath specimens.

30 (5) The person tested may have a physician, or a qualified
31 technician, chemist, registered nurse, or other qualified person of his
32 or her own choosing administer one or more tests in addition to any
33 administered at the direction of a law enforcement officer. The
34 failure or inability to obtain an additional test by a person shall not
35 preclude the admission of evidence relating to the test or tests taken
36 at the direction of a law enforcement officer.

37 (6) Upon the request of the person who shall submit to a test or
38 tests at the request of a law enforcement officer, full information

1 concerning the test or tests shall be made available to him or her or
2 his or her attorney.

3 **Sec. 6.** RCW 88.12.025 and 1993 c 244 s 8 are each amended to read
4 as follows:

5 (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a vessel in a
6 reckless manner.

7 (2) It shall be a violation for a person to operate a vessel while
8 under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug. A person is
9 considered to be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug
10 if:

11 (a) The person has ~~((0.10))~~ 0.08 grams or more of alcohol per two
12 hundred ten liters of breath, as shown by analysis of the person's
13 breath made under RCW 46.61.506; or

14 (b) The person has ~~((0.10))~~ 0.08 percent or more by weight of
15 alcohol in the person's blood, as shown by analysis of the person's
16 blood made under RCW 46.61.506; or

17 (c) The person is under the influence of or affected by
18 intoxicating liquor or any drug; or

19 (d) The person is under the combined influence of or affected by
20 intoxicating liquor and any drug.

21 The fact that any person charged with a violation of this section
22 is or has been entitled to use such drug under the laws of this state
23 shall not constitute a defense against any charge of violating this
24 section. A person cited under this subsection may upon request be
25 given a breath test for breath alcohol or may request to have a blood
26 sample taken for blood alcohol analysis. An arresting officer shall
27 administer field sobriety tests when circumstances permit.

28 (3) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor, punishable as
29 provided under RCW 9.92.030. In addition, the court may order the
30 defendant to pay restitution for any damages or injuries resulting from
31 the offense.

32 **Sec. 7.** RCW 46.20.355 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 17 s 1 are each amended
33 to read as follows:

34 (1) Upon ~~((placing a license, permit, or privilege to drive in
35 probationary status under RCW 46.20.310(2)(a), or upon))~~ receipt of an
36 abstract indicating a deferred prosecution has been granted under RCW
37 10.05.060, or upon receipt of a notice of conviction of RCW 46.61.502

1 or 46.61.504, the department of licensing shall order the person to
2 surrender any Washington state driver's license that may be in his or
3 her possession. The department shall revoke the license, permit, or
4 privilege to drive of any person who fails to surrender it as required
5 by this section for one year, unless the license has been previously
6 surrendered to the department, a law enforcement officer, or a court,

1 Substantial law enforcement resources are devoted to enforcing laws
2 against this conduct and apprehending violators. The legislature
3 intends to establish and strengthen remedial measures to prevent from
4 driving persons who have driven under the influence. The impoundment
5 or forfeiture of a vehicle operated in violation of RCW 46.61.502 or
6 46.61.504 is intended to be a civil, in rem action against the vehicle
7 in order to remove it from the public highways and reduce the risk
8 posed to traffic safety by a vehicle accessible to a driver who is
9 reasonably believed to have violated these laws.

16 subject to impoundment at the direction of a law enforcement officer.

8 Nothing in this section may derogate from the powers of police
9 officers under the common law. For the purposes of this section, a
10 place of safety may include the business location of a registered tow
11 truck operator.

15 titled with the department that are impounded by registered tow truck

19 in writing by the registered owner or the vehicle's insurer, a person
