- 1 AN ACT Relating to an advisory committee on matters relating to the
- 2 regulation of adult family homes; adding new sections to chapter 18.48
- 3 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 70.128 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 18.48 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Adult family homes have developed rapidly in response to the health
- 8 and social needs of the aging population in community settings,
- 9 especially as the aging population has increased in proportion to the
- 10 general population. The growing demand for elder care with a new focus
- 11 on issues affecting senior citizens, including persons with
- 12 developmental disabilities, mental illness, or dementia, has prompted
- 13 a growing professionalization of adult family home providers to address
- 14 quality care and quality of life issues consistent with standards of
- 15 accountability and regulatory safeguards for the health and safety of
- 16 the residents. The establishment of an advisory committee to the
- 17 department of health and the department of social and health services
- 18 under section 2 of this act formalizes a stable process for discussing
- 19 and considering these issues among residents and their advocates,

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- 1 regulatory officials, and adult family home providers. The dialogue
- 2 among all stakeholders interested in maintaining a healthy option for
- 3 the aging population in community settings assures the highest regard
- 4 for the well-being of these residents within a benign and functional
- 5 regulatory environment.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 18.48 RCW to read as follows:
- 8 (1) The secretary, in consultation with the secretary of social and
- 9 health services, shall appoint an advisory committee on matters
- 10 relating to the regulation of adult family homes. The advisory
- 11 committee shall be composed of six members, of which two members shall
- 12 be resident advocates, three members shall represent adult family home
- 13 providers, and one member shall represent the public and serve as
- 14 chair. The members shall generally represent the interests of aging
- 15 residents, residents with dementia, residents with mental illness, and
- 16 residents with developmental disabilities respectively. Members
- 17 representing adult family home providers must have at least two years'
- 18 experience as licensees. The membership must generally reflect urban
- 19 and rural areas and western and eastern parts of the state. A member
- 20 may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
- 21 (2) The secretary may remove a member of the advisory committee for
- 22 cause as specified by rule adopted by the department. If there is a
- 23 vacancy, the secretary shall appoint a member to serve for the
- 24 remainder of the unexpired term.
- 25 (3) The advisory committee shall meet at the times and places
- 26 designated by the secretary and shall hold meetings during the year as
- 27 necessary to provide advice to the secretary on matters relating to the
- 28 regulation of adult family homes. A majority of the members may
- 29 request a meeting of the committee for any express purpose directly
- 30 related to the regulation of adult family homes. A majority of members
- 31 currently serving shall constitute a quorum.
- 32 (4) Each member of the advisory committee shall serve without
- 33 compensation but may be reimbursed for travel expenses as authorized in
- 34 RCW 43.03.060.
- 35 (5) The secretary, members of the advisory committee, or
- 36 individuals acting on their behalf are immune from civil liability for
- 37 official acts performed in the course of their duties.

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 70.128 RCW to read as follows:

The secretary shall be advised by an advisory 20 committee on adult family homes established under section 2 of this 21 22 act.

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
