- 1 AN ACT Relating to the administration of controlled substances to
- 2 persons experiencing intractable pain; adding a new chapter to Title 69
- 3 RCW; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** This act shall be known and may be cited as
- 6 the intractable pain treatment act.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The legislature finds and declares that:
- 8 (1) Appropriate pain management for persons experiencing
- 9 intractable pain may involve the administration of controlled
- 10 substances;
- 11 (2) Nonetheless, state medical boards have used their disciplinary
- 12 authority to deter the prescribing of controlled substances for
- 13 intractable pain; and
- 14 (3) Additionally, physicians have been investigated and prosecuted
- 15 for prescribing controlled substances for intractable pain.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** In this chapter, "intractable pain" means a
- 17 pain state in which the cause of the pain cannot be removed or

- 1 otherwise treated and which in the generally accepted course of medical
- 2 practice no relief or cure of the cause of the pain is possible or none
- 3 has been found after reasonable efforts including, but not limited to,
- 4 evaluation by the attending physician and one or more physicians
- 5 specializing in the treatment of the area, system, or organ of the body
- 6 perceived as the source of pain.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) A physician may prescribe or administer
- 8 controlled substances to a person in the course of the physician's
- 9 treatment of that person for a diagnosed condition causing intractable
- 10 pain.
- 11 (2) A physician shall not be subject to disciplinary action by the
- 12 department of health or the medical quality assurance commission under
- 13 chapter 18.71 RCW for prescribing or administering controlled
- 14 substances in the course of treatment of a person for intractable pain.
- 15 (3) A physician shall not be subject to criminal prosecution for
- 16 prescribing or administering controlled substances in the course of
- 17 treatment of a person for intractable pain.
- 18 (4) This section does not authorize a physician to prescribe or
- 19 administer controlled substances to those persons being treated by the
- 20 physician for chemical dependency because of their use of drugs or
- 21 controlled substances.
- 22 (5) This section does not authorize a physician to prescribe or
- 23 administer controlled substances to a person the physician knows to be
- 24 using drugs or substances for nontherapeutic purposes.
- 25 (6) This section does not limit the authority to deny, revoke, or
- 26 suspend the license of any physician who fails to keep accurate records
- 27 of purchases and disposals of controlled substances, writes false or
- 28 fictitious prescriptions for controlled substances, or prescribes,
- 29 administers, or dispenses in violation of statute.
- 30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 31 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 32 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 33 immediately.
- 34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** If any provision of this act or its
- 35 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the

- 1 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 2 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Sections 1 through 6 of this act constitute
- 4 a new chapter in Title 69 RCW.
