## SENATE BILL 6633

- AN ACT Relating to managed public mental health care; adding new sections to chapter 71.24 RCW; creating new sections; making an
- 3 appropriation; providing expiration dates; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 71.24 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The legislature finds that it is important to ensure that the
- 8 design and implementation of managed care in the public mental health
- 9 care system preserves and strengthens the community-based delivery of
- 10 mental health services through the regional support networks created
- 11 under this chapter. The legislature further finds that public
- 12 involvement in the implementation of managed public mental health care
- 13 is essential for preserving the public interest that includes cost-
- 14 effectiveness, safety, security, access, equity, participation, and
- 15 accountability. The legislature further finds that successful managed
- 16 care efforts for public mental health services require collaboration
- 17 and coordination between the state mental health authority, the public,
- 18 regional support networks, and service providers. The legislature
- 19 intends to: (1) Create a managed public mental health care system that

- 1 meets national standards for effective managed mental health care
- 2 including best business practices for efficiency; (2) establish
- 3 performance and outcome standards; (3) clearly provide for consumer
- 4 protection, consumer rights and involvement, and community health and
- 5 security; (4) meet the needs of vulnerable populations, including the
- 6 requirement to promote early identification of, and services to,
- 7 mentally ill children, and ensure system accountability as required by
- 8 this chapter; and (5) reinvest public mental health funds for improved
- 9 outcomes for consumers and communities.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 71.24 RCW
- 11 to read as follows:
- Managed public mental health care provided in Washington shall
- 13 comply with the following:
- 14 (1) Development and implementation of managed public mental health
- 15 care shall include collaboration among consumers, providers, and
- 16 payers;
- 17 (2) Provision of services and support shall be directed by the
- 18 consumers' needs and desires, whenever possible;
- 19 (3) Public mental health care services shall be adequate to meet
- 20 the demonstrated and estimated needs of the covered population;
- 21 (4) The department shall specify reasonable operating margins for
- 22 organizations serving public mental health care consumers;
- 23 (5) The department shall adopt a consumer bill of rights addressing
- 24 consumer rights and responsibilities, and rules governing grievance and
- 25 appeals procedures;
- 26 (6) Emphasize community-based care in lieu of institutional care;
- 27 (7) Consistent, reliable, and valid outcome measures shall be used
- 28 for managed public mental health care;
- 29 (8) Entities responsible for the capitated risk in managed public
- 30 mental health care shall have the authority and flexibility to manage
- 31 the resources and the system of care relating to recovery and wellness;
- 32 and
- 33 (9) Public agencies shall clarify and distinguish their roles in
- 34 the service delivery system in order to avoid duplication and cost
- 35 shifting.
- 36 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) A task force to the legislature on
- 37 managed public mental health care is created. The task force shall

- 1 consist of six members representing service providers, regional support
- 2 networks, managed care agencies, and the public; two members of the
- 3 senate, one representing each of the two largest caucuses in the senate
- 4 and two members of the house of representatives, one representing each
- 5 of the two largest caucuses in the house of representatives; one member
- 6 representing the governor; and one member representing the department
- 7 of social and health services. The governor shall appoint the eight
- 8 members representing service providers, regional support networks,
- 9 managed care agencies, the public, and the two executive branch
- 10 members. The president of the senate and speaker of the house of
- 11 representatives shall appoint the legislative members. The appointed
- 12 members shall select a chair of the task force.
- 13 (2) This section expires June 30, 1999.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) The task force shall make
- 15 recommendations relating to the design and implementation of managed
- 16 public mental health care services. In developing recommendations the
- 17 task force shall:
- 18 (a) Review the experiences of other states in designing and
- 19 implementing managed public mental health care;
- 20 (b) Review available research into medical cost offsets achieved as
- 21 the result of effective mental health care;
- 22 (c) Review the pros and cons of various financing models, including
- 23 full and partial capitation; and
- 24 (d) Address the unique challenges of implementing managed public
- 25 mental health care in rural communities.
- 26 (2) The task force shall present its findings and recommendations
- 27 to the legislature and the governor no later than December 1, 1998.
- 28 (3) This section expires June 30, 1999.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The sum of fifty thousand dollars, or as
- 30 much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the general fund
- 31 to the house of representatives for the fiscal year ending June 30,
- 32 1999, to carry out the purposes of this act.
- 33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 34 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

- 1 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 2 immediately.
