- 1 AN ACT Relating to creating the fish and wildlife enforcement task
- 2 force; and creating new sections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that:
- 5 (a) Enforcement is a critical component to successful fish and 6 wildlife management;
- 7 (b) The ratio of fish and wildlife officers per citizen has 8 increased dramatically over the last decade; and
- 9 (c) Department of fish and wildlife field personnel could provide 10 a greater enforcement presence with the ability to issue citations for 11 fish and wildlife violations.
- 12 (2) It is the intent of the legislature to create a fish and 13 wildlife enforcement task force to make recommendations that would 14 enable certain fish and wildlife personnel to issue citations for fish 15 and wildlife violations.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The fish and wildlife enforcement task force is created. The task force is composed of the following nine members: Two members representing the house of representatives,

- 1 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, of which one
- 2 member shall be from the majority caucus and one member from the
- 3 minority caucus; two members representing the senate appointed by the
- 4 president of the senate, of which one member shall be from the majority
- 5 caucus and one member from the minority caucus; the director of the
- 6 department of fish and wildlife or the director's designee; the
- 7 director of the department of personnel or the director's designee; the
- 8 director of the department of labor and industries, or the director's
- 9 designee; the chief of the state patrol or the chief's designee; and
- 10 one member of a labor organization that represents department field
- 11 employees, appointed by the governor.
- 12 (2) The purpose of the task force is to make recommendations to the
- 13 legislature on steps necessary to allow department of fish and wildlife
- 14 personnel to issue citations for fish and wildlife violations.
- 15 (3) In making its recommendations the task force shall, at a
- 16 minimum, consider the following:
- 17 (a) The need, if any, for law enforcement training;
- 18 (b) The need for reclassification of employees under the Washington
- 19 state personnel system;
- 20 (c) The need for future changes in labor agreements or contracts;
- 21 (d) The possibility of filling personnel vacancies with employees
- 22 capable of undertaking enforcement responsibilities in conjunction with
- 23 their other duties;
- 24 (e) Those enforcement activities that nonenforcement personnel
- 25 would be authorized or prohibited from performing;
- 26 (f) The need for legislative action; and
- 27 (g) The need, if any, for an increase in agency funding to
- 28 implement the task force recommendations.
- 29 (4) The task force shall present its recommendations and findings
- 30 to the governor, the natural resources committee in the house of
- 31 representatives, and the senate natural resources and parks committee
- 32 by January 1, 1999.
- 33 (5) The task force expires June 30, 1999.
