- 1 AN ACT Relating to pregnant or parenting alcohol and drug addicts;
- 2 and amending RCW 70.83C.020 and 74.50.050.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.83C.020 and 1993 c 422 s 5 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 The secretary shall develop and promote state-wide secondary
- 7 prevention strategies designed to increase the use of alcohol and drug
- 8 treatment services by women of child-bearing age, before, during, and
- 9 immediately after pregnancy. These efforts are conducted through the
- 10 division of alcohol and substance abuse. The secretary shall:
- 11 (1) Promote development of three pilot demonstration projects in
- 12 the state to be called pretreatment projects for women of child bearing
- 13 age.
- 14 (2) Ensure that two of the projects are located in public health
- 15 department clinics that provide maternity services and one is located
- 16 with a domestic violence program.
- 17 (3) Hire three certified chemical dependency counselors to work as
- 18 substance abuse educators in each of the three demonstration projects.
- 19 The counselors may rotate between more than one clinic or domestic

- 1 violence program. The chemical dependency counselor for the domestic 2 violence program shall also be trained in domestic violence issues.
- 3 (4) Ensure that the duties and activities of the certified chemical 4 dependency counselors include, at a minimum, the following:
- 5 (a) Identifying substance-using pregnant women in ((the)) health 6 clinics, local correctional facilities, and domestic violence programs;
- 7 (b) Educating the women and agency staff on the effects of alcohol 8 or drugs on health, pregnancy, and unborn children;
  - (c) Determining the extent of the women's substance use;
- 10 (d) Evaluating the women's need for treatment;

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- 11 (e) Making referrals for chemical dependency treatment if 12 indicated;
- (f) Facilitating the women's entry into treatment; ((and))
- (g) Advocating on the client's behalf with other social service agencies or others to ensure and coordinate clients into treatment; and
- 16 (h) Ensuring the provision of family planning services.

treatment services may include but are not limited to:

- 17 (5) Ensure that administrative costs of the department are limited 18 to ten percent of the funds appropriated for the project.
- 19 **Sec. 2.** RCW 74.50.050 and 1989 1st ex.s. c 18 s 5 are each amended 20 to read as follows:
- (1) The department shall establish a treatment program to provide, within available funds, alcohol and drug treatment services for indigent persons eligible under this chapter. The treatment services shall include access to and provision of family planning services. The
- 26 (a) Intensive inpatient treatment services;
- 27 (b) Recovery house treatment;
- (c) Outpatient treatment and counseling, including assistance in obtaining employment, and including a living allowance while undergoing outpatient treatment. The living allowance may not be used to provide shelter to clients in a dormitory setting that does not require sobriety as a condition of residence. The living allowance shall be administered on the clients' behalf by the outpatient treatment facility or other social service agency designated by the department.
- 35 The department is authorized to pay the facility a fee for
- 36 administering this allowance.
- 37 (2) No individual may receive treatment services under this section 38 for more than six months in any two-year period: PROVIDED, That the

- 1 department may approve additional treatment and/or living allowance as 2 an exception.
- 3 (3) The department may require an applicant or recipient selecting 4 treatment to complete inpatient and recovery house treatment when, in 5 the judgment of a designated assessment center, such treatment is 6 necessary prior to providing the outpatient program.
