- AN ACT Relating to the powers and duties of commercial vehicle enforcement officers and commercial vehicle officers; and adding a new section to chapter 43.43 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.43 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The powers and duties of the commercial vehicle enforcement
- 8 officers and commercial vehicle officers are to enforce state and
- 9 federal laws and regulations relating to motor transport carriers and
- 10 other related statutes and regulations as directed by law. Commercial
- 11 vehicle enforcement officers and commercial vehicle officers may
- 12 provide medical assistance and to direct traffic in situations where
- 13 the officers can be of assistance. During the 1999 fiscal year,
- 14 existing commercial vehicle enforcement officers have the option of
- 15 making a transition from civil service employees to commissioned
- 16 Washington state patrol officers. The transition and commissioning of
- 17 the officers must be completed by June 30, 1999. Upon the date of
- 18 commissioning, a commercial vehicle enforcement officer is eligible to
- 19 participate in the Washington state patrol's retirement plan. The

- 1 commercial vehicle enforcement officers also have the option of
- 2 transferring their service credit and contributions from the public
- 3 employees' retirement system to the Washington state patrol retirement
- 4 system. The state patrol shall provide the training necessary to
- 5 ensure the safety and success of the officers in the above-assigned

6 duties.
