- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 51.16 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) An employee leasing company shall be considered the sole 7 employer under this title of the employees it leases to another
- 8 business customer if the employee leasing company:
- 9 (a) Retains the sole and exclusive right to:
- (i) Hire, terminate, and transfer leased employees;
- 11 (ii) Pay leased employees from the employee leasing company's own
- 12 payroll; and
- 13 (iii) Direct, control, and evaluate the manner and means of the
- 14 performance of services by leased employees, allowing the customer to
- 15 be responsible only for the direction of the operational duties of the
- 16 leased employees; and
- 17 (b) Is responsible for:

- 1 (i) Paying the leased employees, throughout the duration of their 2 employment, regardless of receiving reimbursed payroll or other fees 3 from the customer;
- 4 (ii) Paying all payroll and related taxes and benefit costs from 5 its own account and under its own name; and
- 6 (iii) Securing coverage under this title with respect to the leased 7 employees under its own account and its own name; and
- 8 (c) Receives fees or other compensation from the customer on a 9 total-fee basis, rather than on a direct cost pass-through basis.
- 10 (2) An employee leasing company that is considered a sole employer 11 under this section is an "employer" for immunity from liability as 12 provided in this title.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 51.08 RCW to read as follows:
- "Employee leasing company" means a business that provides workers to another business, under a written agreement, for job positions that are not short-term, temporary, or for a defined period of time.
