- 1 TO THE HONORABLE WILLIAM J. CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED
- 2 STATES, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE
- 3 OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
- 4 THE UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, International trade is vital to the economy of the state
- 9 of Washington; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The skills children learn in schools today contribute to
- 11 their ability to take their places in the world of tomorrow; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The appreciation and understanding of people from other
- 13 countries is crucial to creating a climate conducive to world trade;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, When Washington school children have the opportunity to
- 16 sit beside students from other nations in their classrooms, they are
- 17 provided with a rich educational opportunity to get to know and
- 18 understand people from other cultures; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Washington has had a successful, thriving program for
- 20 students from other countries; and

- 1 WHEREAS, In Washington, we respect the balance between state and 2 federal rights and fulfill our promise to our citizens that education
- 3 is a state responsibility; and
- WHEREAS, Governance of education is a state and local issue, not a federal issue; and
- 6 WHEREAS, School districts in Washington had the freedom to choose 7 whether or not to accept students from other countries; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Federal restrictions on the use of state and local
- 9 education dollars to educate children from other nations deny citizens
- 10 in Washington the opportunity to decide how to best enrich the
- 11 educational experiences of all of our children and deny Washington's
- 12 children the opportunity to learn from children from other nations; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Recent federal changes to immigration laws only permit
- 14 states to support the educational costs for certain international
- 15 students sponsored by organizations specifically approved by the
- 16 federal government; and
- 17 WHEREAS, These recent federal changes to immigration laws
- 18 specifically prohibit states from supporting the educational costs of
- 19 students sponsored by other programs such as sister city programs or by
- 20 individual citizens; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Recent changes completely prohibit elementary and middle
- 22 school students from participating in the international student
- 23 programs; and
- 24 WHEREAS, These changes in federal law reduce Washington state's
- 25 ability to have international students study in Washington and will
- 26 also reduce the opportunities for Washington's students to study in
- 27 other countries;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the
- 29 Congress permit states to choose whether or not to educate children
- 30 from other countries who are living within the state and to change the
- 31 immigration reform law immediately to permit states to make these
- 32 decisions.
- 33 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 34 transmitted to the Honorable William J. Clinton, President of the
- 35 United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker
- 36 of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the
- 37 State of Washington.
