Brief Title: Prohibiting surreptitious viewing or photographing of persons disrobing.

HB 1340 - DIGEST

Declares that a person commits the crime of invasion of privacy if, for the purpose of arousing or gratifying the sexual desire of any person, he or she knowingly views, photographs, or films another person, without that person's knowledge and consent, while the person being viewed, photographed, or filmed is in a state of full or partial nudity and is in a place where he or she would have a reasonable expectation of privacy.

Declares that invasion of privacy is a gross misdemeanor.
