<u>EFFECT:</u> Removes language that set the child safety seat requirements as (1) one to four years of age or up to forty pounds in

a car seat; (2) four to eight years of age or forty to eighty pounds in a booster seat; and (3) eight years of age and older or over eighty pounds in a seat belt.

Replaces this language with broad language that requires children be restrained in a child restraint system appropriate to their height, weight, and age. Specifications relate strictly to proper and safe fit of the child safety seat, booster seat, or seat belt to allow law enforcement to visually inspect the fit of the child restraint system, as opposed to weighing the child on sight and determining appropriate usage.
