3 No person may drive a motorcycle or a motor-driven cycle unless 4 such person has a valid driver's license specially endorsed by the director to enable the holder to drive such vehicles((, nor may a 5 person drive a motorcycle of a larger engine displacement than that 6 7 authorized by such special endorsement or by an instruction permit for 8 such category)). However, a person sixteen years of age or older, 9 holding a valid driver's license of any class issued by the state of 10 the person's residence, may operate a moped without taking any special examination for the operation of a moped. No driver's license is 11 required for operation of an electric-assisted bicycle if the operator 12 13 is at least sixteen years of age. Persons under sixteen years of age may not operate an electric-assisted bicycle. 14

The application of a person under the age of eighteen years for a driver's license or a motorcycle endorsement must be signed by a parent or guardian with custody of the minor. If the ((minor)) person under the age of eighteen has no father, mother, or guardian, then the application must be signed by the minor's employer.
- 21 (2) **Traffic safety education requirement**. For a person under the 22 age of eighteen years to obtain a driver's license he or she must meet 23 the traffic safety education requirements of this subsection.
- (a) To meet the traffic safety education requirement for a driver's license the applicant must satisfactorily complete a traffic safety education course as defined in RCW 28A.220.020. The course must meet the standards established by the office of the state superintendent of public instruction. The traffic safety education course may be provided by:

- 1 (c) The department may waive the traffic safety education 2 requirement for a driver's license if the applicant demonstrates to the 3 department's satisfaction that:
- 4 (i) He or she was unable to take or complete a traffic safety 5 education course;
- 6 (ii) A need exists for the applicant to operate a motor vehicle; 7 and
- 8 (iii) He or she has the ability to operate a motor vehicle in such 9 a manner as not to jeopardize the safety of persons or property((τ) 10 under rules adopted by)).
