- 5 On page 1, line 6, strike all of section 1, renumber the remaining 6 sections consecutively, and correct internal references accordingly.
- 7 On page 23, after line 21, insert the following:
- 8 "Sec. 9. RCW 46.20.041 and 1999 c 6 s 9 are each amended to read 9 as follows:
- 10 (1) If the department has reason to believe that a person is suffering from a physical or mental disability or disease that may 12 affect that person's ability to drive a motor vehicle, the department 13 must evaluate whether the person is able to safely drive a motor vehicle. As part of the evaluation:
- 15 (a) The department shall permit the person to demonstrate 16 personally that notwithstanding the disability or disease he or she is 17 able to safely drive a motor vehicle.
- 18 (b) The department may require the person to obtain a statement 19 signed by a licensed physician or other proper authority designated by 20 the department certifying the person's condition.
- (i) The ((certificate)) statement is for the confidential use of the director and the chief of the Washington state patrol and for other public officials designated by law. It is exempt from public inspection and copying notwithstanding chapter 42.17 RCW.
- (ii) The ((certificate)) statement may not be offered as evidence 25 26 in any court except when appeal is taken from the order of the director 27 canceling or withholding a person's driving privilege. However, the department may make the ((certificate)) statement available to the 28 29 director of the department of retirement systems for use in determining eligibility for or continuance of disability benefits and it may be 30 offered and admitted as evidence in any administrative proceeding or 31 court action concerning the disability benefits. 32
  - (2) On the basis of the evaluation the department may:
- 34 (a) Issue or renew a driver's license to the person without 35 restrictions;

- 1 (b) Cancel or withhold the driving privilege from the person; or
- 2 (c) Issue a restricted driver's license to the person. The 3 restrictions must be suitable to the licensee's driving ability. The 4 restrictions may include:
- 5 (i) Special mechanical control devices on the motor vehicle 6 operated by the licensee;
- 7 (ii) Limitations on the type of motor vehicle that the licensee may 8 operate; or
- 9 (iii) Other restrictions determined by the department to be 10 appropriate to assure the licensee's safe operation of a motor vehicle.
- 11 (3) The department may either issue a special restricted license or 12 may set forth the restrictions upon the usual license form.
- 13 (4) The department may suspend or revoke a restricted license upon 14 receiving satisfactory evidence of any violation of the restrictions.
- 15 In that event the licensee is entitled to a driver improvement
- 16 interview and a hearing as provided by RCW 46.20.322 or 46.20.328.
- 17 (5) Operating a motor vehicle in violation of the restrictions 18 imposed in a restricted license is a traffic infraction.
- 19 **Sec. 10.** RCW 46.20.055 and 1999 c 6 s 11 are each amended to read 20 as follows:
- 21 (1) Driver's instruction permit. (((a) A person who is at least
- 22 fifteen and one-half years of age may apply to the department for a
- 23 driver's instruction permit.)) The department may issue a driver's
- 24 instruction permit (( $after\ the$ )) with a photograph to an applicant who
- $25\,$  has successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the
- 26 driving test, provided the information required by RCW 46.20.091,
- 27 ((and)) paid a five-dollar fee((-)), and meets the following
- 28 <u>requirements:</u>
- 29 <u>(a) Is at least fifteen and one-half years of age; or</u>
- 30 (b) ((The department may issue a driver's instruction permit to an applicant who)) Is at least fifteen years of age ((if he or she)) and:
- 32 (i) Has submitted a proper application; and
- (ii) Is enrolled in a traffic safety education program approved and accredited by the superintendent of public instruction that includes practice driving.
- 36 (2) Nonphoto permit fee. An applicant who meets the requirements 37 of subsection (1) of this section other than payment of the five-dollar

- 1 fee may obtain a driver's instruction permit without a photograph by
  2 paying a fee of four dollars.
- 3 <u>(3)</u> Waiver of written examination for instruction permit. The 4 department may waive the written examination, if, at the time of 5 application, an applicant is enrolled in:
- 6 (a) A traffic safety education course as defined by RCW 7 28A.220.020(2); or
- 8 (b) A course of instruction offered by a licensed driver training 9 school as defined by RCW 46.82.280(1).
- The department may require proof of registration in such a course as it deems necessary.
- $((\frac{3}{3}))$  (4) **Effect of instruction permit.** A person holding a driver's instruction permit may drive a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, upon the public highways if:
- 15 (a) The person has immediate possession of the permit; and
- (b) ((The seat beside the driver is occupied by)) An approved instructor, or a licensed driver with at least five years of driving experience, occupies the seat beside the driver.
- 19  $((\frac{4}{}))$  (5) **Term of instruction permit**. A driver's instruction 20 permit is valid for one year from the date of issue.
- 21 (a) The department may issue one additional one-year permit.
- (b) The department may issue a third driver's permit if it finds after an investigation that the permittee is diligently seeking to improve driving proficiency.
- 25 **Sec. 11.** RCW 46.20.100 and 1999 c 6 s 16 are each amended to read 26 as follows:
- 27 (1) **Application**. The application of a person under the age of eighteen years for a driver's license or a motorcycle endorsement must 29 be signed by a parent or guardian with custody of the minor. If the 30 ((minor)) person under the age of eighteen has no father, mother, or guardian, then the application must be signed by the minor's employer.
- 32 (2) **Traffic safety education requirement**. For a person under the 33 age of eighteen years to obtain a driver's license he or she must meet 34 the traffic safety education requirements of this subsection.
- 35 (a) To meet the traffic safety education requirement for a driver's 36 license the applicant must satisfactorily complete a traffic safety 37 education course as defined in RCW 28A.220.020. The course must meet 38 the standards established by the office of the state superintendent of

- 1 public instruction. The traffic safety education course may be 2 provided by:
- 3 (i) A recognized secondary school; or
- 4 (ii) A commercial driving enterprise that is annually approved by 5 the office of the superintendent of public instruction.
- 6 (b) To meet the traffic safety education requirement for a 7 motorcycle endorsement, the applicant must successfully complete a 8 motorcycle safety education course that meets the standards established 9 by the department of licensing.
- 10 (c) The department may waive the traffic safety education 11 requirement for a driver's license if the applicant demonstrates to the 12 department's satisfaction that:
- 13 (i) He or she was unable to take or complete a traffic safety 14 education course;
- 15 (ii) A need exists for the applicant to operate a motor vehicle; 16 and
- (iii) He or she has the ability to operate a motor vehicle in such a manner as not to jeopardize the safety of persons or property(( $\tau$ ) under rules adopted by)).
- 20 The department <u>may adopt rules to implement this subsection (2)(c)</u> in 21 concert with the supervisor of the traffic safety education section of 22 the office of the superintendent of public instruction.
- 23 (d) The department may waive the traffic safety education 24 requirement if the applicant was licensed to drive a motor vehicle or 25 motorcycle outside this state and provides proof that he or she has had 26 education equivalent to that required under this subsection.
- 27 **Sec. 12.** RCW 46.20.117 and 1999 c 6 s 18 are each amended to read 28 as follows:
- 29 (1) **Issuance**. The department shall issue ((a resident of the state 30 of Washington)) an identicard, containing a picture, if ((he or she)) 31 the applicant:
- 32 (a) Does not hold a valid Washington driver's license;
- 33 (b) Proves his or her identity as required by RCW 46.20.035; and
- 34 (c) Pays the required fee. The fee is four dollars unless an 35 applicant is a recipient of continuing public assistance grants under
- 36 Title 74 RCW, who is referred in writing by the secretary of social and
- 37 health services. For those persons the fee must be the actual cost of
- 38 production of the identicard.

- 1 (2) **Design and term**. The identicard must:
- 2 (a) Be distinctly designed so that it will not be confused with the official driver's license; and
- 4 (b) Expire on the fifth anniversary of the applicant's birthdate 5 after issuance.
- 6 (3) **Cancellation**. The department may cancel an identicard if the 7 holder of the identicard used the card or allowed others to use the 8 card in violation of RCW 46.20.336 (as recodified by chapter 6, Laws of 9 1999)."
- 10 Correct the title.

<u>EFFECT:</u> Ensures that changes made in SHB 1294, which was signed into law March 30, are nonsubstantive.
