- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:
- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the 8 environmental, recreational, and aesthetic values of many of the 9 state's lakes are threatened by the invasion of noxious aquatic weeds. 10 Once established, these noxious aquatic weeds can colonize the shallow shorelines of lakes with dense surface vegetation mats that degrade 11 water quality, pose a threat to swimmers, and restrict use of lakes. 12 Many commercially available herbicides have been demonstrated to be 13 effective in controlling noxious aquatic weeds and do not pose a risk 14 15 to the environment or public health. The purpose of this act is to 16 allow the use of commercially available herbicides that have been approved by the environmental protection agency and the department of 17 agriculture and subject to rigorous evaluation by the department of 18 19 ecology through an environmental impact statement for the aquatic plant 20 management program.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 90.48 RCW to read as follows:
- 23 The department of ecology shall update the final supplemental 24 environmental impact statement completed in 1992 for the aquatic plant 25 management program to reflect new information on herbicides evaluated 26 in 1992 and new, commercially available herbicides. The department 27 shall maintain the currency of the information on herbicides and 28 evaluate new herbicides as they become commercially available.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 90.48 RCW to read as follows:
- 31 (1) Subject to restrictions in this section, a government entity 32 seeking to control a limited infestation of Eurasian water milfoil may 33 use the pesticide 2,4-D to treat the milfoil infestation, without 34 obtaining a permit under RCW 90.48.445, if the milfoil infestation is

- 1 either recently documented or remaining after the application of other
- 2 control measures, and is limited to twenty percent or less of the
- 3 littoral zone of the lake. Any pesticide application made under this
- 4 section must be made according to all label requirements for the
- 5 product and must meet the public notice requirements of subsection (2)
- 6 of this section.
- 7 (2) Before applying 2,4-D, the government entity shall: (a)
- 8 Provide at least twenty-one days' notice to the department of ecology,
- 9 the department of fish and wildlife, the department of agriculture, the
- 10 department of health, and all lake residents; (b) post notices of the
- 11 intent to apply 2,4-D at all public access points; and (c) place
- 12 informational buoys around the treatment area.
- 13 (3) The department of fish and wildlife may impose timing
- 14 restrictions on the use of 2,4-D to protect salmon and other fish and
- 15 wildlife.
- 16 (4) The department may prohibit the use of 2,4-D if the department
- 17 finds the product contains dioxin.
- 18 (5) Government entities using this section to apply 2,4-D may apply
- 19 for funds from the freshwater aquatic weeds account consistent with the
- 20 freshwater aquatic weeds management program as provided in RCW
- 21 43.21A.660.
- 22 (6) Government entities using this section shall consider
- 23 development of long-term control strategies for eradication and control
- 24 of the Eurasian water milfoil.
- 25 (7) For the purpose of this section, "government entities" includes
- 26 cities, counties, state agencies, tribes, special purpose districts,
- 27 and county weed boards.
- 28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** If specific funding for the purposes of this
- 29 act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by
- 30 June 30, 1999, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and
- 31 void."
