- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that a number of
- 8 issues have arisen in regard to the dairy nutrient management program
- 9 that have not been settled without direct legislative involvement. The
- 10 legislature finds that continued cooperation is needed to resolve
- 11 issues relating to the dairy nutrient management program.
- 12 The legislature intends to further the goal of establishing a
- 13 reasonable and effective program that provides clear and consistent
- 14 expectations. The legislature finds that retention of productive dairy
- 15 farms and maintaining the quality of state waters are of utmost
- 16 importance to the state.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** By January 30, 2000, the department of
- 18 ecology shall publish and send an informational guide to all registered
- 19 dairy farms in the state that explains the expectations of the
- 20 department when conducting an inspection. The guide shall be titled
- 21 "How to Survive a Dairy Nutrient Inspection."
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) A dairy nutrient management task force
- 23 is created. The task force shall be comprised of eleven members, who
- 24 are appointed as follows:
- 25 (a) Two members of the house of representatives, one from each
- 26 major caucus, appointed by the co-speakers of the house of
- 27 representatives;
- 28 (b) Two members of the senate, one from each major caucus,
- 29 appointed by the president of the senate;
- 30 (c) A representative of the department of ecology, appointed by the
- 31 director of ecology;
- 32 (d) A representative of the state conservation commission,
- 33 appointed by its executive secretary;

- 1 (e) A representative of local conservation districts, appointed by 2 the president of a state-wide association of conservation districts;
- 3 (f) Three active dairy farmers, appointed by a state-wide 4 organization representing dairy farmers in the state, who shall be from 5 different regions and different sizes of dairy operations; and
- (g) A representative of an environmental interest organization with familiarity and expertise in water quality issues, appointed by agreement of the co-speakers of the house of representatives and the president of the senate.
- 10 (2) The task force shall conduct a review of the dairy nutrient
 11 management program administered by the department of ecology, the
 12 conservation commission, and local conservation districts. The task
 13 force shall include but not be limited to examination of the following
 14 topics:
- 15 (a) Compliance with the deadlines established in chapter 262, Laws
 16 of 1998, for the development, implementation, and approval of dairy
 17 nutrient management plans, or deadlines established under other state
 18 water quality laws;
- 19 (b) Better assurance of consistency in interpretations between 20 staff that conduct inspections, and between inspectors and staff that 21 design and approve dairy nutrient management plans;

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- (c) What constitutes waters of the state for purposes of the dairy nutrient management program;
- (d) Clarification of what constitutes a violation, including a review of the federal environmental protection agency guidance manual, and whether there must be an actual discharge and/or exceedance of state water quality standards;
- (e) Clarification as to the circumstances under which dairy operations are responsible to control flood waters arising from outside of the dairy operation to prevent mixing with dairy nutrients including flood waters that arise during major flood events;
- (f) Clarification of the criteria applicable to dairy operations as to what constitutes a potential to pollute under RCW 90.48.120;
- 34 (g) A review of materials provided by state agencies to dairy 35 farmers regarding dairy nutrient management inspections;
- 36 (h) Review changes in any standards utilized in the development and 37 approval of dairy nutrient management plans; and
- 38 (i) The adequacy of funding to implement the dairy nutrient 39 management program.

- 1 (3) By December 10, 1999, the task force shall:
- 2 (a) Provide recommendations to the department of ecology, to the 3 conservation commission, and to local conservation districts for 4 improvements in the implementation of the dairy nutrient management 5 program; and
 - (b) Provide recommendations to the legislature on statutory changes to clarify and improve the operation of various facets of the program.
 - (4) The task force shall convene as soon as possible upon appointment of its members. The task force shall elect a chair and adopt rules for conducting the business of the task force. Staff support for the task force shall be provided by the department of ecology.
